

# WE DID IT...PRAISE JESUS!

Sincere thanks to those who have contributed to the Lenten Appeal for our sister parish in Haiti. Our goal was to raise \$30,000 to place a water filtration system there so that for the first time in their history they will have access to water that is fit for human consumption. To date \$57,010 has been raised—\$55,755 from 95 individuals/families and \$1,255 in cash donations placed in the water containers in the vestibule of the church.

The water filtration system has been ordered. They are assembled as ordered and so within a few weeks it should be ready to be shipped to Haiti and then on to Nanpol for installation and use. This is an awesome, life changing and wonderful gift to our sisters and brothers.

# So? Who really is the fool?

Constantine the Great was the first Christian Roman emperor. His father Constantius I, who succeeded Diocletian as emperor in AD 305, was a pagan with a soft heart for Christians. When he ascended the throne, he discovered that many Christians held important jobs in the government and in the court. So, he issued an executive order to all those Christians: "Either give up Christ or give up your jobs." The great majority of Christians gave up their jobs rather than disowning Christ. Only a few cowards gave up their religion rather than lose their jobs. The emperor was pleased with the majority who showed the courage of their convictions and gave their jobs back to them saying: "If you will not be true to your God you will not be true to me either." What is the "job" of a Christian? It is to proclaim Jesus raised and present in our lives and in the world. The intimacy we have in Jesus reminds us that unlike other spiritual mentors Jesus does not just teach or talk about what this entails, He has shown us by His life, passion, death and resurrection. How many though would give up, or have in essence already given up Christ and their baptismal vocation, for the things of this world.

Many have commented to me about the irony that Easter Sunday falls on April 1st, April Fools day, this year. There are many theories about the origin of April Fools day. One of the more widely known theory is that when the western world employed the Julian calendar, years began on March 25. Festivals marking the start of the New Year were celebrated on the first day of April because March 25 fell during Holy Week. The adoption of the Gregorian calendar during the 1500s moved the New Year to January 1. According to the most widely-believed origin postulated for April Fools' Day, those who could be tricked into believing April 1 was still the proper day to celebrate the New Year earned the sobriquet of April fools. To this end, French peasants would unexpectedly drop in on neighbors on that day in a effort to confuse them into thinking they were receiving a New Year's call. Out of that supposedly grew the tradition of testing the patience of family and friends. But that's only one theory. Others are: The timing of this day of pranks seems to be related to the arrival of spring, when nature "fools" mankind with fickle weather, according to the Encyclopedia of Religion and the Encyclopedia Britannica. The Country Diary of Garden Lore, which chronicles the goings-on in an English garden, says that April Fools' Day "is thought to commemorate the fruitless mission of the rook (the European crow), who was sent out in search of land from Noah's flood-encircled ark." Others theorize it may have something to do with the Vernal Equinox. Some think to tie in with the Romans' end-of-winter celebration, Hilaria, and the end of the Celtic new year festival.

The last time Easter fell on April Fools' Day was in 1956. Due to the quirks involved in dating Easter against the Gregorian calendar, the two coincide only intermittently. After 2018, the next one is 2029, and then again in 2040—but after that, not again in this century. April Fools' Day is not significant in Christianity, but the celebration of Easter is of the greatest significance. So great that in her liturgy, we the Church, celebrate Easter Day with an Octave, that is Easter Day is celebrated for 8 days and then the season is celebrated for 50 days from Easter Sunday to Pentecost Sunday. That alone should help us understand how significant the celebration of Easter is for us. Each of us will have renewed the promises of our Baptism today and will have been blessed with Holy Water the reminder of how and when we entered into Christ and benefit from the covenant which has been made by Him on our behalf. The "job" so to speak, from the renewal is that we have deeper conviction and desire to live out our Christian life each day. Our job is to glorify God. This must be our purpose in life, whatever we do, do all to the glory of God. How are we to accomplish this? By placing our faith, hope and trust in Jesus Christ, by drawing from the grace of the Sacraments, by being faithful to all that the Lord commands of us especially the command to love as He loves, by surrendering our will to His in all things.

It is in the doing that we become more like the One who gave His life for us, the One who causes our life to have deep purpose, value and intent, the One who raises an Alleluia! within us irrespective of what we might be encountering or enduring. And that is no joke!

Happy Easter, Beatus Paschae, Buona Pasqua, Joyeuses Pâques, Wesołych Świąt, Feliz Páscoa, ¡Felices Pascuas!, Frohe Ostern, and my thanks to each and every one who in desiring to live their vocation in Christ help make this community a beacon of light, love and goodness.



# READINGS FOR DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY First Reading: Acts 4:32-35

This passage describes the actions of the first community of Christians. They were of "one heart and one mind." They had no rich or poor among them, for they shared all necessary items with one another.

## Second Reading: I John 5:1-6

John explains that we become God's children by believing in Jesus. When we love God and concern ourselves only with pleasing God, our faith is strong enough to conquer the evil in our world.

Gospel: John 20:19-31

Jesus appeared to the disciples despite locked doors, breathed on them so that they could receive the Holy Spirit, and gave them the power to forgive sins in his name. Thomas, who was not present, refused to believe without seeing Jesus for himself. Jesus appeared again when Thomas was present, and told him, "Blest are they who have not seen and have believed."


Confirmation pours into our souls the power of the Holy Spirit and his seven gifts – just like the Apostles received at Pentecost.
