



2018 BISHOP'S ANNUAL APPEAL HERE I AM LORD!



While there are many ways to give to the Bishop's Annual Appeal, there is a particularly beneficial opportunity if you are 70 1/2 or over and have an IRA. If you are in this category, the IRS requires you to take a required minimum distribution from your IRA each year. As a result, this distribution is added to your taxable income and

increases the amount of taxes owed to the government. However, instead of taking your required minimum distribution, you can instruct your IRA investment manager to donate this distribution to a charity such as the Bishop's Annual Appeal and this automatically omits this amount from your adjusted gross income. This tax benefit can be realized by all qualifying individuals, whether you take the standard deduction or itemize your deductions. This can be a significant benefit to you and a great way to support the work of the Bishop's Annual Appeal.

If you are considering making a charitable donation using your IRA required minimum distribution, please be sure to first discuss this with your financial or tax advisor to make sure it is right for you.

There is always light in the darkness

The Feast Day of a parish is a day of particular joy as we praise God for the intercession of our patron, St. Vincent de Paul. Our Feast Day on Thursday of this week will be celebrated with Mass at 8:30AM. If you are able, please go to Mass that day to offer thanks for the graces and benefits St. Vincent has obtained for us from the Throne of God's grace. This year is the first time in my 7 years as pastor that I will not be here for the Feast Day. The reason, as I have mentioned before, is one of great joy. God willing, I will be praying at and witnessing the ordination to the Order of Deacon of one of our two parish seminarians studying at the Pontifical North American College in Rome. John Calabro, son of Judy and John, will be ordained with 39 of his classmates representing many dioceses around the United States. I find it to be a double joy that the ordination is going to take place on the Feast Day of St. Vincent de Paul. A priest known to me, who has gone a number of years now to be with the Lord whom he loved and served so beautifully, would often say "Blessed are they who see the signs of God's activity for they are all around us." I see this as one of those signs in a time when we need, or at least I know that I need, to be reminded of God's providence. It is such a gift that we have two men from the parish studying for the Priesthood—in addition to John we are blessed to have Stephen Delia also studying at the North American College in Rome. The Mass and Rite of Ordination will take place at the Altar of the Chair, in the Basilica of St. Peter's, Rome with Cardinal DiNardo, Archbishop of Galveston-Houston presiding. A number of John's family and friends will be there for the ordination and our parish will be well represented. Please keep John in your prayers. By the time you come to Mass on Thursday he will have been ordained a Deacon. Thanks be to God.

Within Holy Orders there is a distinction between the Order of Deacon, transitional and permanent. A transitional Deacon is, as the word suggests, in a process of transition. John is to be ordained a Deacon in the process of preparing to be ordained a priest. Every priest was first ordained a Deacon. I was ordained a Deacon 25 years ago—6 months before I was ordained a priest. John will be ordained a Deacon on Thursday and then, God willing, a priest at the Cathedral of St. John the Baptist, Paterson on Saturday, May 11th at 10:30AM. This parish is blessed with the ministry of Deacon Peter O' Neill. Deacon Peter was ordained a permanent Deacon 15 years ago. He is known as a permanent Deacon as he remains in the place of Holy Orders without the intention of seeking ordination to the Priesthood. As Deacons, both Peter and John assist at Mass, can be given the faculty to preach, preside at Baptisms, Weddings and Funeral Rites outside of Mass, and assist in a variety of non liturgical roles. I share all this with you for your edification so that you will pray for John and also just to share good news in the hope I find in men, like John, who seek Christ and His will. I pray for those men like John, Stephen and others in our midst who are considering a vocation to the Priesthood and hope that the present scandals will not prevent them from seeking Christ and following His will for their lives.

The life of faith we are called to, invited to, that which is proposed to us comes from Jesus and so we must be firmly rooted in our relationship with Him. A I mentioned in my homily last Sunday, you and I have only one life to live. Jesus proposes Eternal Life to us and faith is the doorway by which we accept that proposal. Upon entering, however, we live in God's presence by love. Love seeks the good of the other and never seeks to harm in word or deed. Those who harm in word and deed deny themselves the opportunity of abiding in God's love. If we are true, and if we are seeking to be faith filled, the words and deeds of our living must reflect love for all. It is imperative that when we violate the command to love we must turn back to Jesus for forgiveness, grace and mercy through the confession of our sins. We must continue to pray and act for renewal and reform within the Church. It is a truth that such conversion and renewal must begin first within ourselves. The challenge for each of us is to give ourselves completely to Jesus. This is the consistent desire of a true disciple—to die to self and live in and for Jesus. In our patron, St. Vincent de Paul, we see such an example. Known for his zeal and love for Jesus, he ministered with great love to the poor and needy. He also knew the trials of a life of faith in a world focused on self and a Church in need of reform. Among many other words he wrote, "While we dilly-dally with our plans, God raises up others to do what he had first asked of us" and "All ships are exposed to storms but are not thereby doomed to perish." His intercession for this parish is a tremendous gift and as a community we see the influence of this Apostle of Charity in the many ways we seek to serve Christ in others, especially those in need. May he pray for each of us in God's presence. Let us continue to pray for one another as we journey.


Second Reading: James 5:1-6
