Fr. Matthew Johnston's Easter Message

He Is Risen!

It is always a great gift when every year at Eastertime I can finally state those three beautiful words. It is not simply a phrase that states that our Lenten fast is finally over and we can go back to eating candy, or phone usage, or whatever else we gave up for the Lenten season. It is phrase that defines who we are as Christians. Without those three words, we would not be here worshipping on this greatest of feasts. Without those three words, there would not even be a Christian Church.

Those three words truly define who we are as believers of Jesus. They are the source of every hope that we have. Without them, death would be a source of despair. But with them, even death, while still sad, is actually a time of great hope. It is a time in which the promise of the Resurrection comes to fulfillment in the soul of the faithful departed.

My brothers and sisters in Christ, I cannot tell you how filled with joy we should be today. Nothing and I mean nothing should be able to take away that joy. There is no suffering that we are called to ensure in this life that is greater than the promise of the Resurrection. Pope Saint John Paul II was so assured of this truth that the first words of his pontificate were "Do not be afraid." He knew what the promise of the Resurrection means for us as Christians and wanted his first statement as Pope to reflect that beautiful hope.

The words of JPII did not end there. His sentence continues with, "that why He said 'I'll come." He wanted to remind us that we should not be afraid because Christ is with us in all that we do, in all that we are. We simply have to invite Him into those challenges and joys of our lives. There is a beautiful story that speaks to the fidelity of God involving JPII. In 1982 he desired to have a Eucharistic procession from the Lateran Basilica in Rome to Saint Mary Majors in Rome. He was discouraged by many advisors. They told him that this hadn't been done in a hundred years. They told him it would be too hard to plan with the traffic in Rome. They also told him no one would come. Still, the pontiff persevered and while the turnout may have initially been small in 1982, by 1992, despite rain, over 150,000 people joined for the procession.

I think this is a beautiful story for us to reflect upon as the United States prepares to have Eucharistic processions from the four corners of the country all converge in Indianapolis this summer for the National Eucharistic Congress. Christ is with us most profoundly in the Eucharist. He is truly present and through the priest being "in persona Christi (in the person of Christ)" Jesus transubstantiates the bread and wine into His own body and blood at Mass.

If you are struggling with faith, with sufferings, or even with the daily challenges of life, know that Jesus wants to be invited in. If we allow Him in, He will come and be with us in all of these trials. Take some time to be with Him in the most holy sacrament of the Eucharist. Take advantage of the gift we have of an adoration chapel for prayer time with Jesus. Let the hope of the three words, "He is Risen," that resound through the Easter season be enshrined in your heart.


