Opening Prayer

Gladden us with holy joys, almighty God,
and make us rejoice with devout thanksgiving,
for the Ascension of Christ your Son
is our exaltation,
and, where the Head has gone before in glory,
the Body is called to follow in hope.
Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son,
who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit,
God, for ever and ever. **Amen.**

Reflecting on Living the Gospel

For forty days the apostles were in the company of the risen Jesus, ate with him, and waited for the Holy Spirit, the promise of the Father who would be given to them. They did this in Jerusalem, the city of prophets and the end point of Jesus's earthly journey in Luke's gospel. The earthly ministry of Jesus having been completed, in these forty days Jesus instructed his apostles about the beginning and continuing mission of the church. It was to be in the power of the Holy Spirit, its members believing in his risen presence, eating at table, witnessing beyond Jerusalem to the ends of the earth, and gathering and waiting together in joyful expectation.

As children (and perhaps still as adults, if we take the time), we may have often been fascinated to watch the clouds and see how quickly they formed new shapes, new "pictures," especially on windy days. Above us there seemed to be a "becoming world" of surprises, where nothing was fixed or static. The cloud that is described as enveloping Jesus at his ascension wraps him in the glory of God and reveals, even as it hides, another aspect of the beloved Son: that there is no place for his disciples to just look "intently at the sky" (as the first reading puts it). The words of the two messengers who spoke to the apostles after Jesus ascended, men whose dress and words remind us of the two angels at the resurrection tomb, suggest that this is the wrong kind of waiting, a dawdling that will never harvest the fruits of Jesus's resurrection. The time for eye-witnessing is past; now is the time for proclamation. The ascension points to the need for Pentecost and the driving, Spirit-filled passion that will make the disciples the witnesses of Jesus throughout the world until he comes again.

Closing Prayer

Loving God, thank you for the gift of this day and the opportunity to grow in relationship with you. You ascend on high, yet are still close to us, inviting us to glorify you through our lives. May our witness be constant as we remain faithful to your Gospel and the way of life to which we are called. **Amen.**

For Reflection:

· What does the kingdom of God look like to you? How do you continue to bring about God's kingdom in your own life?

Suggestions for group and individual use:

1. Pray aloud the "Opening Prayer" (in *The Roman Missal* called the "collect").
2. One person read aloud the gospel.
3. Each read prayerfully "Reflecting on Living the Gospel" and spend some time in personal prayer.
4. Share together responses to "For Reflection."
5. Pray the "Closing Prayer."
