THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER “STAY WITH US LORD”

In the gospel reading from Saint Luke for the Third Sunday of Easter, we hear one of the most beautiful accounts of an encounter of the Risen Lord with his disciples. Two disciples are on the road to Emmaus feeling dejected and confused; these two disciples had thought that Jesus would be the answer to all of their hopes. We know the experience of those first disciples when we experience great losses, grieves, and disappointments in our lives. In those dark hours it is difficult to be confident and sometimes we can even doubt whether or not God is really close to us or listening to our prayers. The experience of the disciples on the road to Emmaus helps to assure us that God is always with us. The disciples had thought with the crucifixion of Jesus all was lost; he was dead, crucified. That was the end. Or so they thought. The early followers of Jesus could not have been more heartbroken or anxious. Now a stranger appears on the road, or so they thought. But he was no stranger: “And it happened that while they were conversing and debating, Jesus drew himself near and walked with them, but their eyes were prevented from recognizing him” (Luke 24:15-16). The disciples were prevented from seeing Jesus by their own sadness, anxiety, and worry. They had not understood that the mission of the Messiah would include suffering and death. Jesus walks with them and opens their eyes through explaining all of the scriptures to them. It is in the context of a meal, at table, that their eyes are opened and they implore the one whom they thought just a wayfarer also on a journey to nowhere in particular to “stay with us” (24:29). The presence of the risen Lord among us gives us never failing hope and confidence. At the Canonization Mass for Saint John XXIII and Saint John Paul II, our Holy Father, Pope Francis noted:

Saint John XXIII and Saint John Paul II *were not afraid to look upon the wounds of Jesus, to touch his torn hands and his pierced side*. They were not ashamed of the flesh of Christ, they were not scandalized by him, by his cross; they did not despise the flesh of their brother (cf. *Is* 58:7), because they saw Jesus in every person who suffers and struggles. These were two men of courage, filled with the *parrhesia* (bold speech) of the Holy Spirit, and they bore witness before the Church and the world to God’s goodness and mercy.

They were priests, and bishops and popes of the twentieth century. They lived through the tragic events of that century, but they were not overwhelmed by them. For them, God was more powerful; faith was more powerful – faith in Jesus Christ the Redeemer of man and the Lord of history; the mercy of God,

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shown by those five wounds, was more powerful; and more powerful too was the closeness of Mary our Mother.

In these two men, who looked upon the wounds of Christ and bore witness to his mercy, there dwelt *a living hope* and an *indescribable and glorious joy* (1 Pet 1:3, 8). The hope and the joy which the risen Christ bestows on his disciples, the hope and the joy which nothing and no one can take from them. The *hope and joy of Easter*, forged in the crucible of self-denial, self-emptying, utter identification with sinners, even to the point of disgust at the bitterness of that chalice. Such were the hope and the joy which these two holy popes had received as a gift from the risen Lord and which they in turn bestowed in abundance upon the People of God, meriting our eternal gratitude.

This hope and this joy were palpable in the *earliest community of believers*, in Jerusalem, as we have heard in the Acts of the Apostles (cf. 2:42-47). It was a community which *lived the heart of the Gospel*, love and mercy, in simplicity and fraternity.

The witness of Saint John XXIII and Saint John Paul II speaks of the power of God's grace, mercy, and love. Our faith, like theirs, is always nourished by the Eucharist. The prayer of those first disciples is our prayer as well: "stay with us." In this 2004 Apostolic Letter, *Mane Nobiscum Domine* (*Stay with us Lord*) now Saint John Paul II wrote:

The Eucharist is light above all because at every Mass the liturgy of the Word of God precedes the liturgy of the Eucharist in the unity of the two 'tables,' the table of the Word and the table of the Bread. This continuity is expressed in the Eucharistic discourse of Saint John's Gospel, where Jesus begins his teaching by speaking of the mystery of his person and then goes on to draw out its Eucharistic dimension: 'My flesh is food indeed, and my blood is drink indeed' (Jn 6:55). We know that this was troubling for most of his listeners, which led Peter to express the faith of the other Apostles and of the Church throughout history: 'Lord, to whom can we go? You have the words of eternal life' (Jn 6:68). In the account of the disciples on the road to Emmaus, Christ himself intervenes to show, 'beginning with Moses and all the prophets,' how 'all the Scriptures' point to the mystery of his person (cf. Lk 24:27). His words make the hearts of the disciples 'burn' within them, drawing them out of the darkness of sorrow and despair, and awakening in them a desire to remain with him: 'Stay with us, Lord' (cf. v. 29).

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The Eucharist is at the heart of our faith. The Eucharist nourishes and sustains our faith. In the Eucharist, the Risen Christ stands in our midst and offers us this precious gift: "Peace be with you." We pray for the grace to more and more live the mission that the Eucharist empowers us for: to be the presence of Christ in the world. As we continue to celebrate the Easter season we reflect and celebrate the risen Christ who is with us in the gift of the Blessed Eucharist.

CATECHISTS WANTED

Our preparation for First Holy Communion and Confirmation requires the dedicated service of many catechists. Without our faithful catechists it would not be possible for us to have a faith formation program and prepare young people for the sacraments. Please consider serving as a catechist. Attention 2nd Grade Parents
