THE FEAST OF THE HOLY FAMILY OF JESUS, MARY, AND JOSEPH

"FOR THIS DAY IN THE CITY OF DAVID A SAVIOR HAS BEEN BORN FOR YOU"

On this feast of the Holy Family we continue to celebrate the great mystery of Christmas, the great power of God's love with us in the person of his only Son, Jesus Christ. This is the great feast of the Incarnation. The Son of God, born from the royal line of David, comes to save his people not as a king at the head of an army but as an infant in search of love. God raised up powerful kings for Israel but in this ultimate display of divine power and majesty, God chooses to become vulnerable. Saint John's Gospel brings us to the heart of the mystery of the Incarnation: "And the Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us, and we saw his glory, the glory as the Father's only Son, full of grace and truth" (John 1:14). The Word of God, God's own Son, becomes one of us, he knows our human experience firsthand, and in so doing he shows us the love that the Father has for all of us. Christmas is not just the commemoration of a historical event; it is a central part of our faith and our life that is renewed every day. We are all a part of the mystery of Christmas. God becomes human and so we can become divine. We become truly human through following the gospel of Christ who came to save us. We are able to live in the same selfless way as Christ and we are destined to share eternal life with him. But first he must come to us and make his home in our hearts.

God continues to create and recreate and draw us to himself through the life, death, and resurrection of his Son Jesus Christ. We daily celebrate the mystery and good news of our salvation in Christ. The gospel reading that we heard for the Mass at Midnight is from Saint Luke and it reveals to us God's will to seek out the poor and the lost, to heal them, and to draw them to himself. God reveals the birth of the Prince of Peace to poor, insignificant shepherds tending their flocks in the fields: "For today in the city of David a savior has been born for you who is Christ and Lord. And this will be a sign for you: you will find an infant wrapped in swaddling clothes and lying in a manger" (Luke 2:11-12). How extraordinary. God becomes a small, helpless, powerless infant. The Almighty God, who created the heavens and the universe, comes to us as an infant. God is all powerful but he will not compel us to love him in return. The infant Savior teaches us the first truth of love; that is why he was born and why his mission will eventually take him to the cross: to really love is to seek nothing in return but to give and to love more.

The gift of love is given to us in the infant whose face illumines the first Christmas night. God loves us first and so we are able to respond to him in love and in so doing find the fullness of life and peace that God wants for us. Our Holy Father, Pope Francis, in commenting on Isaiah's words: "The people in darkness have seen a great light" (9:1) said that:

This prophecy of Isaiah never ceases to touch us, especially when we hear it proclaimed in the liturgy of Christmas Night. This is not simply an emotional or sentimental matter. It moves us because it states the deep reality of what we are: a people who walk, and all around us – and within us as well – there is darkness and light. In this night, as the spirit of darkness enfolds the world, there takes place anew the event which always amazes and surprises us: the people who walk see a great light. A light which makes us reflect on this mystery: the mystery of *walking* and *seeing*.

Walking. This verb makes us reflect on the course of history, that long journey which is the history of salvation, starting with Abraham, our father in faith, whom the Lord called one day to set out, to go forth from his country towards the land which he would show him. From that time on, our identity as believers has been that of a people making its pilgrim way towards the promised land. This history has always been accompanied by the Lord! He is ever faithful to his covenant and to his promises. Because he is faithful, 'God is light, and in him there is no darkness at all' (1 Jn 1:5). Yet on the part of the people there are times of both light and darkness, fidelity and infidelity, obedience, and rebellion; times of being a pilgrim people and times of being a people adrift.

In our personal history too, there are both bright and dark moments, lights and shadows. If we love God and

our brothers and sisters, we walk in the light; but if our heart is closed, if we are dominated by pride, deceit, self-seeking, then darkness falls within us and around us. 'Whoever hates his brother – writes the Apostle John – is in the darkness; he walks in the darkness, and does not know the way to go, because the darkness has blinded his eyes' (1 Jn 2:11). A people who walk, but as a pilgrim people who do not want to go astray.

As we rejoice at the birth of our Savior, the Prince of Peace, we remember the importance of doing all we can to make our families and our community places of hope and peace. God is with us, he sustains us in the power of the Holy Spirit, and makes us his own so that we are able to see the great light revealed in Jesus Christ who remains always our way, truth, and life.

MERRY CHRISTMAS!

On behalf of Father Giovanni Rodriguez, and the parish staff, I take this opportunity to wish all of the members of our parish a blessed Christmas. You will be remembered at all of the Masses celebrated on this Solemnity of Christmas. I also want to take this opportunity to thank you for your generosity and goodness this past year. The greatest gift that we possess is our faith in Jesus Christ; as Saint Paul's Letter to Titus puts it: "Beloved: When the kindness and generous love of God our savior appeared, not because of any righteous deeds we had done but because of his mercy, he saved us through the bath of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit, whom he richly poured out on us through Jesus Christ our savior, so that we might be justified by his grace and become heirs in the hope of eternal life" (Titus 3:4-7). We thank God for all that he has done to strengthen our community this past year and we pray for the grace to continue to serve him well strengthened by the Body and Blood of Christ that we receive in the Eucharist and are directed by the power of the Holy Spirit.

January 1, 2018 is not a holy day of obligation. On January 1, 2018 we celebrate the Solemnity of Mary, the Mother of God. Beginning with the New Year asking for God's blessings and asking for the intercession of the Mother of God is a good way to begin the new year. 




