OUR PARISH HERITAGE CAMPAIGN

“YOUR INSTRUCTIONS ARE MY ETERNAL HERITAGE”

Dear friends in Christ,

Your faithfulness and your commitment to our parish community continually inspires all those who visit our parish community and those who look to Our Lady of the Holy Angels Parish as a place of hope, refuge, and welcome. Every century of faith is challenging in its own right. Countless parishioners who have come before us have made great sacrifices in order for our faith to be celebrated in this sacred place where we rejoice year after year in the mysteries of our salvation. This is a sacred place where God's grace is celebrated and where the heart is lifted toward God's life.

The challenge of our era in terms of maintaining the vibrancy of our parish community can be traced to the fact that a smaller and smaller number of people bear that weight of maintaining the staff and facilities that our community requires. The costs of parish staff salaries have remained, for the most part, stagnant over ten years. The cost of benefits, however, has increased exponentially. These yearly numbers are eye popping for a community of our size and financial means:

Wages: \$378,195.00
Medical Benefits: \$60,250.00
Pension and Catastrophic Health Coverage: \$58,857.60
Retirement Savings Plan: \$5,572.00
Workmen's Compensation: \$10,946.71
Social Security: \$22,444.72
Dental Insurance: \$2,294.00
Unemployment Insurance: \$2,982.00
Disability: \$938.76
Life Insurance: \$639.29

Total Wages and Benefits: \$542,544.08

Before anything else happens, \$542,544.08 must be provided. In order to meet all of our responsibilities we need to raise, \$10,500.00 in the collection each week; seldom do we accomplish that goal. To date, we are over \$54,000 short in meeting our weekly collection goal. I am not providing this information to complain; it is my job to keep the parish afloat and meet our responsibilities but that becomes increasingly more difficult with fewer weekly donors. You do more than your part but there simply are not enough consistent givers to meet the goal each week. Additionally, this year the Diocese of Paterson has begun withdrawing about \$9,000 monthly directly from our checking account to meet the cost of medical benefits and so that is another challenge to face when payroll is over \$15,000 every two weeks. With God's grace and your generosity we always manage to meet our responsibilities. The collection for maintenance helps to meet routine maintenance costs and also the cost of our maintenance staff which is of great help to our community. With you I am resolved to remain proactive in not only to maintain the status quo but in taking on projects that speak of the bright future that belongs to this parish community.

Every parish knows challenges and we need to continue looking forward and manage this plant and reinforce our confident and courageous attitude that speak of our hopes for the future and which manifest outwardly that we are a parish with a bright future because we have a living faith. I have complete confidence in your commitment to your parish and that is why I never hesitate to ask you to continue investing in the structures that speak of our belief in our long term goals for the future. I am always confident about our future. Therefore, I am asking you to become part of another exciting project for our parish.

The psalmist sings: "Your instructions are my eternal heritage, they are the joy of my heart" (Psalm 119:111). The Lord ever guides our community with his word and the Lord always encourages us to trust in his providential love. The Lord has never failed to bless a project that we have begun as a sign of our love for him and his Church. We look always to the future with confidence knowing that our heritage, above all, is our faith in the risen Lord who stands in our midst and says: "Peace be with you." Our parish community is vibrant and alive and we are custodians of the heritage of faith that we have received from previous generations. We stand in the long line of those who profess their faith in the Lord Jesus, crucified and victorious Savior.

As you arrive at Mass each Sunday and walk through the parking lot, I hope that you all take great pride in your great accomplishment: a completely renovated and renewed parking lot. So many have said that the restored parking lot makes them feel so much pride in their parish church and grounds; it is truly a remarkable accomplishment! Our parish plant is a testament to our living faith and of our confidence in the future based upon a heritage of faith.

Over ten years, the parish buildings and grounds have been steadily improved because of your outstanding stewardship of our parish. Every building has been attended to on some level. Of course, the renovation of the church, installation of the elevator and pipe organ, installation of a pumping system in Saint Francis Hall, remediation of the pointing on the school, and the new parking lot have been the major projects that you have accomplished but there have been many small projects as well and . . . you guessed it . . . there are more ahead. We preserve and renew our parish heritage year by year.

In October I will have completed eleven years as your pastor. On April 18, 2019, Bishop Serratelli completed his seventy-fifth birthday and, in keeping with the provisions of Canon Law for all bishops, submitted his resignation to the Holy Father and it is likely within the course of this year the Holy Father will accept his resignation and appoint a new bishop. When I think of Bishop Serratelli's retirement I think of the words of Exodus: "Then there came to power in Egypt a new king who had never heard of Joseph" (1:8). For "Joseph" you can substitute "Mark." Twelve years is usually the limit for pastors and the next bishop may say, "Enough Mark, move on." Therefore, I feel a certain urgency in completing projects so that you are able to hand on a parish plant completely restored to the next pastor. This is not about me. It is about what you have accomplished. But along with you, I want to hand on to those who come after us a firm foundation to build upon along with a deep appreciation for our parish heritage.

Last year, the bell that has sat atop the church had to be taken down because the structure that encases it has been doing damage to the slate roof. The whole campanile structure was literally moving and destroying the casing around the bell hatch, loosening tiles and mortar. It did not cost too much to take the

bell down from the roof, about \$8,000, or so. Last year, I was told it would cost about \$65,000 or so to create a new structure to put the bell back. The parking lot had to come first. You met that challenge with your characteristic generosity. At first I thought to let it go and leave the bell at ground level permanently. But . . . the church bell belongs to the original church that was across Newark-Pompton Turnpike and was cast for Our Lady of the Holy Angels Church in Baltimore in 1884. That bell is a part of the heritage of our parish and should be placed back in the highest place of honor as it represents all of the generations that have come before us. I want us to make that commitment to restoring the church as it was built in 1955 with the bell that has sounded for well over one hundred years back where it was meant to be.

Now that the parking lot has been completed, and bollards installed to protect the newly restored elevator building, repairs have also been made to the main church stairs that have been coming apart. It is also now time to install a sealant and coating on the church terrace outside the main entrance that will be skid proof, salt proof, generally approve the appearance of the church terrace, and alleviate some of the great puddles that form there.

The awning over the main doors is attached to the church by great steel girders and a drainage system that actually empties back into pillars inside the church foyer that then drains below and out to Route 23; it is a complex system. The awning is irreplaceable but, built in 1955, it is coming apart after years of winter ice, freezing and re-freezing. You will have noticed that the doors at the far right have been closed for many months because great streams of water empty from the damaged awning at the spot which needs to be repaired.

The cost of repair of the porch (terrace) of the church that includes the installation of a non-skid surface is \$31,562; replacing the canopy over the front doors of the church is \$17,000; and to restore and reinstall the bell atop the church is \$65,000 (\$5,000 of that is for the architect fee) all in all we are looking to spend \$113,562 on upgrading the church building exterior and restoring and preserving the bell that is so much a part of our heritage. As always, we will not press ahead with the project until we have the funds.

With all of that said, we need to raise another \$100,000 for these projects. Next week I will ask each household to pledge \$450 over six months in order to fund these projects – that is \$75 a month to preserve the heritage of our parish and to carry out projects that cannot be ignored and look to make our parish a joyful, welcoming, forward looking place where faith is celebrated and lived.

I thank you for your never failing generosity and thank you for your never failing patience in listening to these many requests to fund much needed projects in our parish. Please look to the pledge card in this bulletin and making our heritage remain a living treasure for future generations.

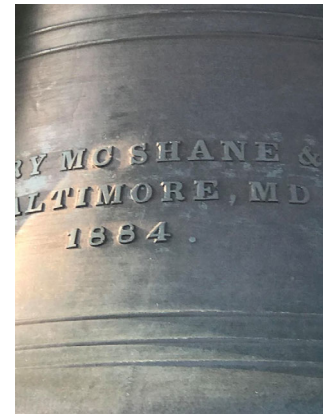

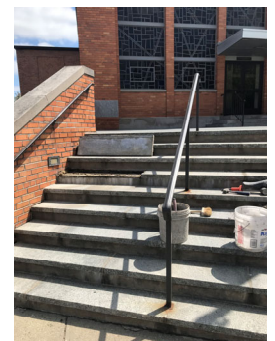
The bell, which sat atop the original church directly across Route 23, was manufactured in 1884.
