THE THIRTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME "HE RESOLUTELY DETERMINED TO JOURNEY TO JERUSALEM"

In the gospel reading from Saint Luke for this Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time, we meet Jesus as he begins his journey toward Jerusalem; the holy city where he will pour out his life through his passion and death, his resurrection, and ascension to the right hand of the Father. Luke highlights the supreme significance of the work that Jesus is about to accomplish. Jesus is not under any illusions about what awaits him; the gospel tells us that "he resolutely determined to journey to Jerusalem" (Luke 9:51). The whole mission and life of Jesus would culminate at the end of this journey and he knew that it would not be an easy passage and that the work of redemption that he would accomplish would be costly and difficult.

As Jesus makes his journey with his disciples he teaches them about the nature of his mission and about their place in his work as his followers. The journey to the holy city of Jerusalem will require a great deal of effort and steadfastness. This journey is not simply a matter of moving toward one physical place to another – Jesus knew that this work would call him to suffer for the sake of those he was sent to redeem – and that he would be bringing back into alignment creation and most of all, the human heart, with the will of his Father. Jesus is travelling through Samaria. Samaritans were not known to welcome the Jewish people; in travelling through this region Jesus is providing an example for his disciples of the difficulties that being his followers involve. Jesus is obedient to the will of his Father and will continue his mission of redemption no matter what the obstacles he faces will be or how the difficult the road he must walk is for him.

As we make our journey through this life, while trying to remain faithful followers of the Lord Jesus, we can be overwhelmed by obstacles or tempted to turn away from the mission that God gives us. Our Holy Father, Pope Francis notes that the power of the Holy Spirit always helps us to make our lives a gift to the Lord so that even when the path is difficult we are able to cooperate with God's purposes through the power of grace:

The important thing is to 'move forward' on this path that is 'simple' but that also calls for 'strength' — a gift of the Holy Spirit — in order to "bear sufferings". Indeed, they will still happen in life: 'be it an illness, the death of a loved one, a problem with one's children or siblings, or a big problem with business or at work.' The reference is always Jesus, who 'went forward and suffered.' For us too 'there are those small pieces of the cross", but there is also "the joy of this journey,' during which we find Jesus in "every moment.'

As the Holy Father, Pope Francis notes, the power of the Holy Spirit strengthens us as we walk with the Lord Jesus on our journey and helps us to remain steadfast in the virtues of faith, hope, and love. The Lord always challenges us to not give up on the path of discipleship even when the path is difficult, but he never abandons us on that road.

The Lord did not shy away from the mission that he was sent by the Father to accomplish in the power of the Holy Spirit. He met this mission head on and called others to walk with him as he went about his Father's work. The Lord Jesus calls us to be co-workers with him in establishing his Father's kingdom of justice, love and peace and he seeks out those others considered to be lost. We are to do the same. As he moves toward Jerusalem, he sends messengers ahead of him who "entered a Samaritan village to prepare a reception there, but they would not welcome him because the destination of his journey was Jerusalem" (9:52). The Samaritans, however, were not open to the person or the message of Jesus; they miss an opportunity to experience the power of God's grace at work in the person of Jesus.

Jesus is not deterred by the coldness of the Samaritans and he continues to reach out to a group of people that would have been considered beyond the realm of God's grace by the people of Israel. He seeks them out and they refuse his gracious invitation to accept the kingdom of God moving among them but his own certainty of his mission does not fail. The disciples, however, draw the wrong conclusions from their experience of the Samaritans. The disciples James and John, not to be outdone by this lack of charity on the part of the Samaritans ask: "Lord, do you want us to call down fire from heaven to consume them?" (9:54) But Jesus will have no part of this thinking and he "turned and rebuked them, and they journeyed to another village" (9:55-56). Jesus refuses to retaliate toward the

Samaritans because of their slight and will not become part of the cycle of hatred and rejection. Jesus reveals perfectly the power and divine love.

Despite the obstacles and rejection as Jesus moves forward his progress toward Jerusalem remains hopeful and filled with the possibilities that are found in friendship with God and obedience to God's will: "someone said to him, I will follow you wherever you go" (9:57). Jesus does not accept the person's offer to follow after him without first setting forth the costs of discipleship: "Foxes have dens and birds of the air have nests, but the Son of Man has nowhere to rest his head" (9:58). The message of Jesus counsels us from placing our trust in things that only appear to give us a sense of security. We all want freedom from fear and a sense of security and permanence and so sometimes we attach ourselves to things, even relationships, that seem to hold the possibility of filling up a feeling of void in our lives. But anything we own or any relationship that we have that does not leave our certainty of freedom to do God's will, leaves us as tied to a way of living that diminishes the power of God's life within us.

To another person among those curious along the way on his journey, Jesus says: "Follow me" (9:59). The man has some very important things to attend to before he takes up following Jesus as a full time way of life: "Lord, let me go first and bury my father" (9:59). Jesus then proclaims the urgency of the need to follow him at the expense of all other concerns: "Let the dead bury their dead. But you, go and proclaim the kingdom of God" (9:60). But it is easy to get lost in the apparent harshness of this saying of Jesus. Jesus is not at all speaking about familial obligations or the respect that should be evidenced toward the dead or the reverence due our parents. No, Jesus is telling all that are in his hearing not to let this moment filled with the promise of salvation pass by. As we follow the Lord, we too can at first set out with great enthusiasm with the joy that comes from knowing and serving the Lord, only to become worn down as the days pass by, the burdens grow heavier, and the newness seems to wear off. Jesus was under no illusion that the cost of loving those who are his own would be lived out without a heavy price. The same is true for us. It costs a great deal to be a disciple – we must love in no less a dramatic, selfless, and life-giving way than did Jesus himself. Once we accept the invitation to follow Jesus, we must see it through to the end: "No one who sets a hand to the plow and looks to what was left behind is fit for the kingdom of God" (9:62). Discipleship involves a confidence in the power of God's love so that we are always encouraged to continue his work.

The Lord has made us his own and made us partners with him in becoming the means of grace by which others know the love of God. Like Jesus we too are on a journey, not the literal earthly Jerusalem, but to the holy city, the heavenly city where all of those who have been faithful to the call of the Lord live in eternal life. We pray that we will not grow weary of the cost of discipleship and that we will never turn away from following the Lord even when we grow tired.

1776 – July 4TH – 2019 HAPPY 243TH BIRTHDAY TO THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA!

This July 4th we commemorate the two hundred and forty-third year of our Independence as a nation. We thank God for the gift of liberty and freedom that are his gifts to all people. We are especially grateful for the gift of the United States of America that is always a beacon of freedom to the world. We thank all of those veterans who have fought or served in the Armed Forces of the United States and we ask that Almighty God would give eternal rest to all of those who have given their lives in the service of this great nation. On July 3, 1776, John Adams, one of the chief contributors to the Declaration of Independence, along with Thomas Jefferson, wrote to his wife Abigail amidst the heat of an oppressive boarding house in Philadelphia:

The second day of July, 1776, will be the most memorable epoch in the history of America. I am apt to believe it will be celebrated by succeeding generations as the great anniversary festival. It ought to be commemorated as the day of deliverance, by solemn acts of devotion to God Almighty. It ought to be solemnized with pomp and parade, with shows, games, sports, guns, bells, bonfires, and illuminations, from one end of this continent to the other, from this time forward forevermore.

Well, the future President Adams got the date wrong, thinking that the great observances would take place on the day that the Continental Congress approved the resolution of independence, July 2, 1776, rather than the date the words of the declaration were approved, July 4, 1776. At any rate Adams' vision to see into the future was remarkable – remember there were only thirteen colonies at the time – to think that this newborn nation would span the whole of what we now know as the continental United States gives proof of his faith in the goodness, strength, and determination of people who would be governed only in freedom and with nothing less. Thank God for our founders, what they began with countless sacrifices, and what succeeding generations of citizens accomplished. May we always be worthy of our heritage of freedom by contributing to the common good.

Independence Day is observed as a Federal Holiday on Thursday, July 4th. One Mass will be celebrated at 9:00 in the morning and the parish office will be closed on both July 4th and July 5th.


