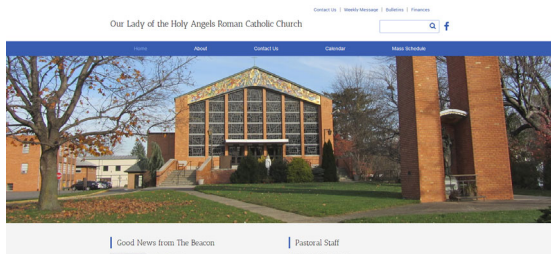

FOURTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME
“YOUR PEACE WILL REST ON THAT PERSON”

Our gospel reading from Saint Luke for this Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time gives us the account of the Lord sending his disciples out on mission: “At that time the Lord appointed seventy-two others whom he sent ahead of him in pairs to every town and place he intended to visit” (Luke 10:1). The Lord is clear in telling his disciples to be focused on their mission and tells them not to be distracted by those who might seem unwilling to receive their message. As disciples of the Lord, we have the gift and the responsibility to confirm one another in the faith. As our Holy Father, Pope Francis, said on the Feast of Saint Peter and Saint Paul:

To confirm in faith. The Gospel speaks of the confession of Peter: ‘You are Christ, the Son of the living God’ (Mt 16:16), a confession which does not come from him but from our Father in heaven. Because of this confession, Jesus replies: ‘You are Peter, and on this rock I will build my Church’ (v. 18). The role, the ecclesial service of Peter, is founded upon his confession of faith in Jesus, the Son of the living God, made possible by a grace granted from on high. In the second part of today’s Gospel we see the peril of thinking in worldly terms. When Jesus speaks of his death and resurrection, of the path of God which does not correspond to the human path of power, flesh and blood re-emerge in Peter: ‘He took Jesus aside and began to rebuke him ... This must never happen to you’ (16:22). Jesus’ response is harsh: ‘Get behind me, Satan! You are a hindrance to me’ (v. 23). Whenever we let our thoughts, our feelings or the logic of human power prevail, and we do not let ourselves be taught and guided by faith, by God, we become stumbling blocks. Faith in Christ is the light of our life as Christians and as ministers in the Church!

It is interesting to note that the Lord sent the disciples out “in pairs.” The call to service by the Lord is never a designation to work as a “lone ranger.” We always carry out our vocations in relationship with others. As we serve as the presence of Christ in the world we are to work with one another in a spirit of cooperation and be respectful of others in order to be best effective in the way that the Lord Jesus wants us to be. The call to be a disciple of the Lord is not an easy one; it involves many challenges and difficulties. Even though we often set out on our mission with only good intentions we can be very easily disappointed. As Pope Francis notes, the communion of the Church helps us to remain faithful to the gospel’s imperative to love:

To confirm in love. In the second reading we heard the moving words of Saint Paul: ‘I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith’ (2 Tm 4:7). But what is this fight? It is not one of those fights fought with human weapons which sadly continue to cause bloodshed throughout the world; rather, it is the fight of martyrdom. Saint Paul has but one weapon: the message of Christ and the gift of his entire life for Christ and for others. It is precisely this readiness to lay himself open, personally, to be consumed for the sake of the Gospel, to make himself all things to all people, unstintingly, that gives him credibility and builds up the Church. The Bishop of Rome is called himself to live and to confirm his brothers and sisters in this love for Christ and for all others, without distinction, limits or barriers. And

not only the Bishop of Rome: each of you, new archbishops and bishops, have the same task: to let yourselves be consumed by the Gospel, to become all things to everyone. It is your task to hold nothing back, to go outside of yourselves in the service of the faithful and holy people of God.

The Lord, as always, does not hide any of the difficulties involved of being his disciple: "He said to them, 'The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few; so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest. Go on your way; behold, I am sending you like lambs among wolves. Carry no money bag, no sack, no sandals; and greet no one along the way'" (10:3-4). As we work to serve the Lord and build his kingdom on earth we are to travel light; in other words we are not to be distracted by things that are unimportant as we do our work.

As we go about the Lord's work we offer the gift of peace: "In whatever house you enter, first say, 'Peace to this household'" (10:5). Even when we offer the gift of the Lord's peace to others, it is not always accepted; sometimes it is not only not accepted it can even be actively rejected: "If a peaceful person lives in thee, your peace will rest on him; but if not, it will return to you" (10:6). Perhaps this is one of the reasons that the Lord sent the disciples out in pairs – when discouragement and very heavy challenges arose they would not have to bear them alone – they would have the strength of another to assist them. Even when our efforts to be instruments of peace are rejected or our efforts to try to help God's kingdom seem to be rejected or others seem to interfere with what God is calling us to, it is important to remain focused upon our mission and not to be discouraged: "Do not move from one house to another. Whatever town you enter and they welcome you, eat what is set before you, cure the sick in it and say to them, 'The kingdom of God is at hand for you'" (10:7-9). We are sent out by the Lord to fulfill our vocation in his name and we work with others as we do that. Sometimes it may feel like our efforts are unrewarded or thankless but our mission must always be to focus on what the Lord calls us to and to remember that the gift of serving him, even when the results or the plan that he has for us are not clear, are a gift. Pope Francis said the unity of the Church is served by the diversity of its members:

To confirm in unity. Here I would like to reflect for a moment on the rite which we have carried out. The pallium is a symbol of communion with the Successor of Peter, 'the lasting and visible source and foundation of the unity both of faith and of communion' (*Lumen Gentium*, 18). And your presence today, dear brothers, is the sign that the Church's communion does not mean uniformity. The Second Vatican Council, in speaking of the hierarchical structure of the Church, states that the Lord 'established the apostles as college or permanent assembly, at the head of which he placed Peter, chosen from their number' (*ibid.*, 19). To confirm in unity: the Synod of Bishops, in harmony with the primate. Let us go forward on the path of synodality, and grow in harmony with the service of the primacy. And the Council continues, 'this college, in so far as it is composed of many members, is the expression of the variety and universality of the people of God' (*ibid.*, 22). In the Church, variety, which is itself a great treasure, is always grounded in the harmony of unity, like a great mosaic in which every small piece joins with others as part of God's one great plan. This should inspire us to work always to overcome every conflict which wounds the body of the Church. United in our differences: there is no other Catholic way to be united. This is the Catholic spirit, the Christian spirit: to be united in our differences. This is the way of Jesus! The pallium, while being a sign

of communion with the Bishop of Rome and with the universal church, with the Synod of Bishops, also commits each of you to being a servant of communion.

We pray for the grace to be faithful disciples of the Lord and serve the communion of the Church by encouraging one another in faith and love and so contribute to the unity of the Church.

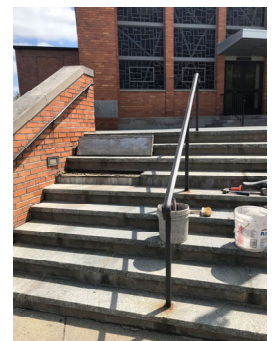
The bell, which sat atop the original church directly across Route 23, was manufactured in 1884.

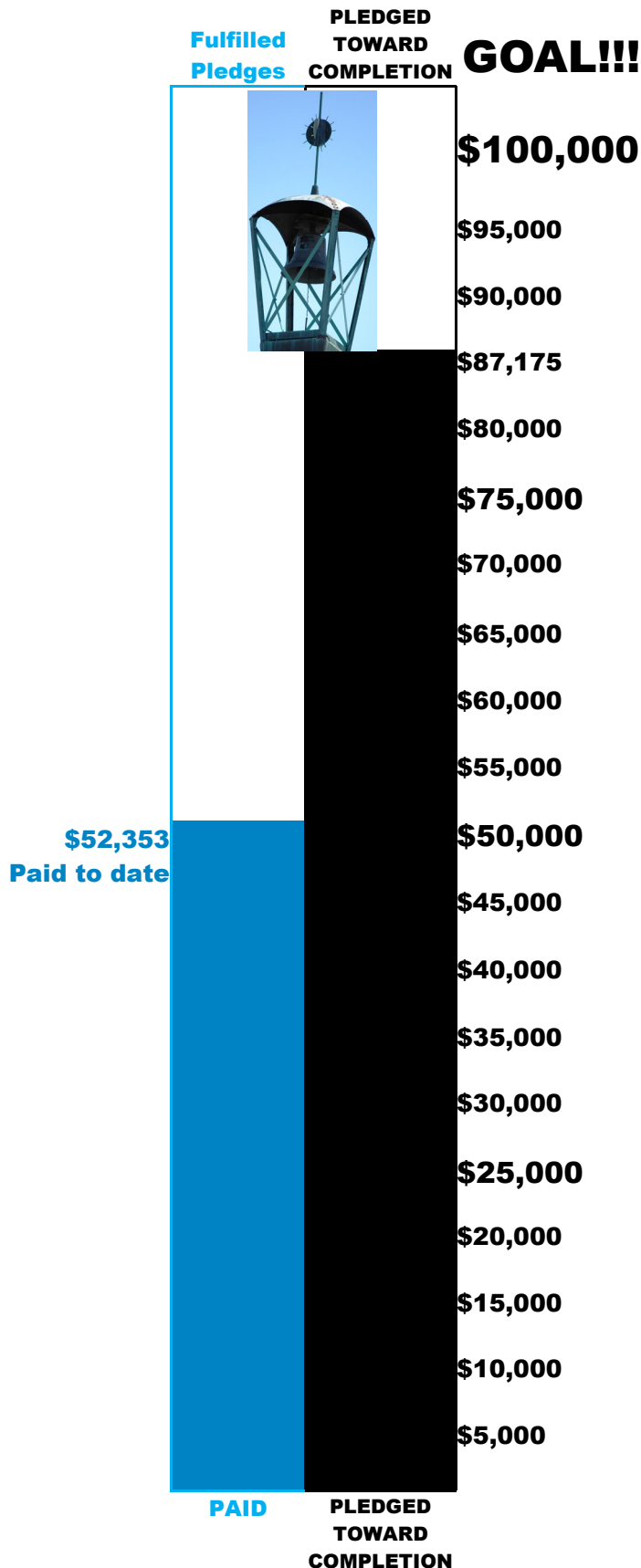
