# THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT "HE TOLD ME EVERYTHING I HAVE DONE"

The dialogue between Jesus and the Samaritan woman at the well is among the most engaging and captivating in all of the scriptures. In this encounter we see how perfectly Jesus understands human hearts and how he gently but firmly, and with absolute authority, leads one from a life of sin and unhappiness to the divine life that he offers. At the beginning of this reading from John's gospel we hear that the woman of Samaria came to draw water and that "It was about noon" (John 4:6). The woman made this arduous journey to the well at the hottest time in the day not because it was convenient but because she knew that there would be few, if any, other people around in the noonday heat to look upon her shame; she hoped to be free from the judgmental stares of others. Hot though it may have been to make the trip to the well at least she could be left alone to draw her water and return to her home. But Jesus is there at the well.

Not only is Jesus at the well, he does not only the unexpected but the unthinkable: he speaks to a Samaritan – and a Samaritan woman at that; unheard of. To begin the conversation Jesus asks for something simple in order to engage the woman in a dialogue that will tell her what true life-giving water is: "Give me a drink" (4:7). The woman is shocked by Jesus speaking to her but she is intrigued nonetheless when Jesus speaks to her of this life-giving water: "Sir, give me this water, so that I may not be thirsty or have to keep coming here to draw water" (4:15). It seems like a reasonable request from the woman.

Jesus will not allow the woman to be satisfied with water that only quenches human thirst. Jesus will not leave the woman without giving her the opportunity to have a complete change of heart; he reveals himself to her as the source of living water, as the Messiah: "I am he, the one speaking with you" (4:26). Now the woman's amazement truly knows no bounds, she has an experience of immediate insight into who Jesus is and what he means for her life: "The woman left her water jar and went into the town and said to the people, 'Come see a man who told me everything I have done. Could he possibly be the Christ?'" (4:29); the woman's question is almost rhetorical. Her life was obviously changed by her encounter with Jesus because on the basis of her own faith many others were drawn to the Lord as well: "Many of the Samaritans of that town began to believe in him because of the word of the woman who testified, 'He told me everything that I have done'" (4:39). Jesus looked into the woman's heart and he made her do the same; he made her look at her life not to judge and condemn but so that she would embrace the possibility of changing in order to be open to the divine life that he promises.

It is not accidental that this gospel is read in Lent. This gospel is really indicative of the way that the Lord deals with each of us. Christ knows the hearts of each one of us; he looks into them, not to judge but to invite us to accept the life that he offers, a life that is eternal. We too can feel like the Samaritan woman drawn to wells that do not really satisfy our thirst and looking for as few encounters with others at those wells so that we will not need to be bothered by their need for our presence, our kindness, our love, nor be troubled by their judgment.

The intention of Jesus is never to condemn, it is always to heal, to redeem the sinner. At the same time, his call to us is the same one that he gives to the Samaritan woman: look at your life and change what needs to be changed. When the Samaritan woman says of Jesus, "He told me everything I have done" it is not said in fear but more in awe and wonder. In other words, she is saying that Jesus told her the way to put her life on the right course. We will never be perfect, we will never always get things right but as often we accept the Lord's call to conversion and accept his call to examine our lives honestly, we can always count on being satisfied by the life-giving water that is friendship with the Lord. One of the best ways to accept the Lord's call to conversion and new life is to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation during Lent. There is no such thing as having been away from confession too long. The Lord always waits at the well for us, just as he did for the Samaritan woman, with his healing mercy and love.

#### **COVID-19 LITURGICAL GUIDELINES**

These guidelines help us follow some commonsense ways to minimize exposure to the virus. They are effective immediately.

- The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches that the Sunday Eucharist is required of all the faithful "unless excused for a serious reason, for example, illness" (CCC, 2181). Thus, persons who are sick or show symptoms of sickness are not obliged to attend Mass and in fact are excused from participation. Out of charity towards others, those who are ill or who feel unwell should not attend Mass to limit contagion to others.
- Until further notice, holy water fonts should be emptied. The baptismal font should be filled at the time of the celebration of baptism or the Easter Vigil and emptied following the celebration.

- All priests, deacons, and other liturgical ministers must wash their hands before Mass begins. They should use an alcohol-based anti-bacterial solution before and after distributing the Eucharist. These solutions should be available in both the sanctuary and the sacristy.
- Refrain from holding hands during the Lord's Prayer.
- The Sign of Peace is best exchanged through a bow rather than through a handshake.
- Drinking the Precious Blood from the chalice is discontinued for the present time.
- Given the frequency of direct contact with saliva in the distribution of the Eucharist, every consideration should be given by each person to receive the Eucharist reverently by hand for the time being. Ordained ministers should distribute as the faithful wish to receive the Eucharist. If an extraordinary minister is uncomfortable distributing on the tongue, they should ask the communicant to go to the priest or deacon.

All liturgical vessels, once purified, should be thoroughly washed with soap and hot water after each use.

Jesus Christ, you traveled through towns and villages "curing every disease and illness." At your command, the sick were made well. Come to our aid now, in the midst of the global spread of the coronavirus, that we may experience your healing love.

Heal those who are sick with the virus. May they regain their strength and health through quality medical care.

Heal us from our fear, which prevents nations from working together and neighbors from helping one another.

Heal us from our pride, which can make us claim invulnerability to a disease that knows no borders.

Jesus Christ, you traveled through towns and villages "curing every disease and illness." Come to our aid now, that we may experience your healing love.

Jesus Christ, healer of all, stay by our side in this time of uncertainty and sorrow.

Be with those who have died from the virus. May they be at rest with you in your eternal peace.

Be with the families of those who are sick or have died. As they worry and grieve, defend them from illness and despair. May they know your peace.

Be with the doctors, nurses, researchers and all medical professionals who seek to heal and help those affected and who put themselves at risk in the process. May they know your protection and peace.

Be with the leaders of all nations. Give them the foresight to act with charity and true concern for the well-being of the people they are meant to serve. Give them the wisdom to invest in long-term solutions that will help prepare for or prevent future outbreaks. May they know your peace, as they work together to achieve it on earth.

Whether we are home or abroad, surrounded by many people suffering from this illness or only a few, Jesus Christ, stay with us as we endure and mourn, persist and prepare. In place of our anxiety, give us your peace.

Jesus Christ, heal us.



# Lenten Regulations on Fast and Abstinence

The Lenten regulations concerning fast and abstinence are as follows:

The days of both Fast and Abstinence during Lent are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. The other Fridays of Lent are days of Abstinence.

On a day of fast, only one (1) full meal is permitted. Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast. On a day of abstinence, no meat may be eaten. Those who have reached the age of 14 are obliged by the law of abstinence. The obligation to observe the laws of fast and abstinence "substantially," or as a whole, is a serious obligation. The Fridays of the year, outside of Lent, are designated as days of penance, but each individual may substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat some other practice of voluntary self-denial as penance. The time for fulfilling the Paschal Precept (Easter Duty - All the faithful, after they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year) extends from the First Sunday of Lent to the Solemnity of the Holy Trinity.
