FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER "I AM THE WAY AND THE TRUTH AND THE LIFE" LOOKING TO THE GOOD SHEPHERD FOR THE RENEWAL OF PARISH LIFE

In last week's gospel, we heard Jesus describe himself: "I am the gate for the sheep" (John 10:7) and he tells us that his is the voice that the sheep must follow for safety: "the shepherd calls his own sheep by name and leads them out" (John 10:4). Jesus is the one who provides a safe path for his flock and he also maintains that safety through guarding the sheep with his own presence. The saving power of his passion, death, and resurrection is what saves and protects us from harm.

Jesus is the only one who can absolutely and surely promise us that if we listen to the sound of his voice, we will be led to a safety and a peace that we can never be separated from in this life or in the next. During these difficult days that seem to have no end in sight, we can wonder how we will find our way out of darkness through a path that seems covered with deep shadows. Confident in the never failing guidance of the Good Shepherd we can be sure that the Lord never abandons us in time of need and that he shows us how to live in fidelity to the will of the Father. Our trust in the Lord will never leave us disappointed. We look for the bright spots of love and compassion that we have seen carried out by so many. In our work of care and encouragement, we share in the mission of the Good Shepherd.

As we celebrate the Fifth Sunday of Easter, we hear Jesus describe himself and his mission. The Lord's mission is our mission. In our reading from John's Gospel we hear a further explanation of what it means for Jesus to be our way. In this week's gospel, Jesus says: "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me" (John 14:5). Our faith primarily concerns a relationship with Jesus Christ. In following him we are not only accepting a series of beliefs and doctrines, although we are, but more than that we are disciples who acknowledge that there is nothing more important in life than our relationship with the Lord Jesus. Everything in our life finds its meaning, purpose, and ultimate end in our dependence upon the love that we find in the Sacred Heart of the Good Shepherd.

Through our relationship with Jesus we are drawn into his relationship with his Father and we are strengthened in the power of the Holy Spirit. The Apostle Philip does not quite grasp the meaning of what Jesus is saying despite having followed Jesus and heard his preaching personally: "Master, show us the Father, and that will be enough for us" (14:9). Jesus uses the occasion to explain the meaning of his relationship with his Father and its implications for his followers: "Do you not believe that I am in the Father and the Father is in me? The words that I speak to you I do not speak on my own. The Father who dwells in me is doing his works" (14:11). Jesus reveals his Father's will to save us through his own death and resurrection. Philip speaks for all of us who seem to want at least a little bit more certainty. As we move through these days, we want to know: "What is next?" "Where do we go after this?" In depending upon Jesus and looking to his gospel, we can find our way certainly if not easily. In doing the will of the Father and that is, living selfless for others, we will deliberately, but not always easily, come to the recognition that God's grace is sufficient to see us through any difficulty.

We are incorporated into divine life through the power of the Holy Spirit. Soon we will celebrate the Feast of Pentecost when we commemorate the outpouring of the Holy Spirit upon the apostles and the birthday of the Church. We look for a new outpouring of the Holy Spirit to renew the face of the earth and to rekindle in his the fire of divine love in the family of the Church.

We look to the Good Shepherd to guide us in the days ahead as we slowly move forward toward reopening and reinvigorating the life of our parish. Life will be different in our parish communities very likely but our faith will be the same. We have not been together in church for Mass since March 15th. That's a long

time. And more time will pass yet before we are together again. But we are more aware of the bonds of communion and faith that unite us in our love for the Lord and his Church. Hopefully we will be back together around the Lord's altar soon to celebrate the Eucharist and receive his Body and Blood in Holy Communion.

It will likely be close to three months before we are united together in person. Surely, our parish life will be different and changes will be required as a result of what we have been through together and what will be necessary for the safety of all concerned. We have learned that our faith is the most important gift that we have and we have also learned how much we depend upon each other to live out our faith and how much others help us to understand the power of God's grace.

There will be many decisions to be made in the days ahead. We will need to reschedule First Holy Communion and Confirmation. Bishop-Elect Sweeney will be Ordained and Installed Eighth Bishop of Paterson on July 1, 2020. The new Bishop's schedule will be impossible in the early days as he seeks to be present to the many people who will want to meet him and as he begins to understand his new diocese. I have asked Bishop Serratelli to consider coming to confirm our young people in the autumn, perhaps September or October. Even that celebration, months from now, will likely require a limit on the number of people who can participate.

Bishop Serratelli has given the pastors of parishes the faculty to confirm the young people who missed their scheduled celebration because of the pandemic. But I would prefer our young people to be confirmed by a bishop whose presence reminds us that we are united to our apostolic faith and complete our initiation into the Catholic faith through their successors. I will try to make that happen with the gracious willingness of Bishop Serratelli to be present. Likely, First Eucharist will be scheduled in the fall as well.

Surely there will be other changes as well in the faith formation program and in other areas of parish life. We trust in the Lord to guide us through these days and to guide us to make best use of our gifts and resources in order to continue celebrating our living faith. Thank you for your continued support of our parish. While so many are suffering the loss of jobs and are stressed in providing for their own needs, we are also striving to meet all of our obligations as well. As we reassess the best ways possible to provide for our parish, I ask for your continued prayers. I don't have to tell you that more than two months, at least, of attendance and the loss of all fundraisers will require us to determine what is essential for our life of faith together. The celebration of Mass and our bonds of a family of faith led by the Good Shepherd in communion with the Church throughout the world are the indispensable marks of our faith.

Our readings from the scriptures for this Sunday's liturgy tell us that we are deeply united with the Lord and with one another. In our second reading from the first letter of Saint Peter we hear that we are "a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people of his own, so that you may announce the praises of him who called you out of darkness into his wonderful life" (1 Peter 2:9). The Lord calls us to live out our faith in him, the community that is the Church. Part of our mission as members of the royal priesthood that we all share by virtue of our baptism is to help one another grow in holiness. To be good disciples of the Lord we must be aware of the importance of respecting the presence of the Holy Spirit that dwells in our own hearts and whom we also find in one another.

HAPPY MOTHER'S DAY!

While this Mother's Day, like other celebrations, has been curtailed to some degree, we are never at a loss nor do we ever lack the means to show our mothers our gratitude and our love. Today we honor our mothers and we ask God to bless them for the gift of life that they share with us and for the countless sacrifices that they make on our behalf. We should honor and be grateful to our mothers every day but it is

important that we take this special day to let them know how deeply we care for them and value not only what they have done for us but our love for them for who they are: the ones who make us who we are.

I pray that this time of constant apprehension and confusion will soon pass. In the meantime, we rely upon the protection of the angels, and I commend to the care of the Blessed Virgin Mary as I ask God's blessing upon you and your families.


