SOLEMNITY OF PENTECOST “PEACE BE WITH YOU”

As we celebrate the Solemnity of Pentecost and the conclusion of the Easter season, the message of Jesus in John's Gospel comes to us from his appearance to the disciples following his resurrection from the dead: “Peace be with you” (20:19). The Lord's gift of peace is that which we all long for in our lives. We conclude the Easter season as we began: the Lord Jesus stands among us and offers us the gift that the world cannot give: “Peace be with you.” As we witness so many horrific events in our world and in our country, particularly the savage shooting that led to the death of nineteen children and two teachers in Texas, we are forced to ask: “Where is the peace that the Lord promises?” We pray for all of those who are heartbroken and whose shattered lives will never be the same.

The gift of heavenly peace is only accessible when we tend to things of earth with divine intention by making God's work our own. Humanity cut off from God or closed to God's daily action in our lives will find itself broken in two by hatred, violence, and less than human because it is separated from God's purposes. God wishes to give us life, and fullness of life, but when the darkness deepens because the light of God has been blotted out then only diminishment of life will be found. When we ask: “Where is God?” we are required to ask what we have done to make God present to others and what we have done to foster harmony and love in the human family. As Saint Paul tell us in his First Letter to the Corinthians: “No one can say, ‘Jesus is Lord,’ except by the Holy Spirit. There are different kinds of spiritual gifts but the same Spirit; there are different forms of service but the same Lord; there are different workings but the same God who produces all of them in everyone. To each individual the manifestation of the Spirit is given for some benefit” (1 Corinthians 12:6-7). The best kind of witness we can give to the sacred truth of God's life dwelling in our hearts is to reflect that by the way of life we lead and the attitudes that we express in word and deed.

The gift of the Holy Spirit gave birth to the Church that Jesus Christ himself founded. As members of his Church we are charged to continue the work of Jesus in the world: “As the Father has sent me, so I send you” (20:21). During the Easter season we have been reflecting upon the meaning of the risen life of Jesus in our own lives. There are many voices that compete for our attention and there is a constant struggle at work to divide the human family. Division is the work of the devil. God makes us one through our common humanity. God became one of us, in our nature, and in our flesh and blood, so that our humanity might be raised to the level of the divine. Saint Paul reminds us of the importance of unity in faith and in the human family: “As a body is one though it has many parts, and all the parts of the body, though many, are one body, so also Christ. For in one Spirit we were all baptized into one body, whether Jews or Greeks, slaves or free persons, and we were all given to drink of one Spirit” (1 Corinthians 12:12-13). Unity in the human family is the work of the Holy Spirit and is the will of the Risen Lord who died to break the bonds of sin that break apart the human family.

How sad it is when we choose to settle for less than our God given possibilities by embracing brutality in our words and actions, through our dismissiveness of those we don't agree with or don't like, or are different than we are. When humanity is disconnected from God more than just sadness follows, a soul crushing despair is not far behind. We belong to God, all of us, and so we have the responsibility to reverence the presence of God in one another and to foster the harmony that doesn't look like utopian harmony but more realistically evidenced as simple mutual human respect.

Where there is no willingness to see reality from the vantage point of others then we will continually talk past one another until voices are raised to the level of rage. In the liturgical Sequence of Pentecost we hear comforting and encouraging words: “Come, Holy Spirit, come! And from your celestial home. Shed a ray of light divine! Come, Father of the poor! Come, source of all our store! Come, within our bosoms shine.” We need that light of God to find our way in this world chances are that are way to heaven will be much less than clear.

The central message of Christianity is the resurrection of Jesus from the dead; this is what our faith is all about. As we do the work of Jesus in the world we bring the message of the risen Lord to all whom we meet: “Peace be with you.” The gift of peace is something that we help to take root in the hearts of others through our willingness to forgive, to be healers of broken hearts, and by letting go of anger, jealousy, self-centeredness, and opening our hearts to the gifts of the Holy Spirit so that they may shine forth in our lives.

Pentecost reminds us of the importance of the presence of the Church in the world as she proclaims the gospel of Jesus Christ and celebrates the sacraments of salvation through the power of the Holy Spirit. The Church is imperfect and flawed always in need of renewal but she is still, at core, a body of grace filled believers which makes Christ present through the power of the Holy Spirit.

We, each as individuals, are members of the Body of Christ and have the special call to foster the communion of the Church so that we live in unity and peace with one another. The gifts of the Holy Spirit have been given to us at baptism and

confirmation; it is a responsibility of our faith to put those gifts to work for the good of the human family. Let us pray for peace and healing so that the work of division will be banished through embrace of the gifts of God that lead to life.

The outpouring of the seven-fold gifts of the Holy Spirit, wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety, and fear of the Lord, give us all the strength to help others know the peace that is found in serving the Lord Jesus and of the joy that comes from the hope of the eternal life he has won for us. We pray for the gift of reflecting the work of the Holy Spirit by putting the gifts of the Holy Spirit to work in order to bring healing and peace.



STATEMENT OF BISHOP SWEENEY ON THE TEXAS TRAGEDY

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

On this past Tuesday, once again, we were made painfully aware of another horrific act of violence and the tragic loss of innocent human life that followed. The school shooting in Uvalde, Texas repeated an all too familiar scene that pours salt in a wound that never seems to heal. As we pray for all the victims, especially the 19 children and 2 teachers who were killed, we must constantly pray for their families that will never be the same and for healing in our country that desperately needs the peace that comes from God. We must also ask ourselves the questions, "How can this happen again (and again and again)?" This tragic killing, with the use of a deadly

weapon, comes less than two weeks after another person with a gun targeted an African-American Community in Buffalo and killed 10 innocent people.

As we raise our voices, as we must do, on behalf of the intrinsic dignity and value of all human life, constantly recommitting ourselves to the work of peace by calling all citizens, elected and religious leaders, and all people of good will to look at the root causes of these violent acts. Working together, regardless of political affiliation, to enact laws and provide services that will prevent the repetition of this senseless violence are crucial steps toward unraveling the violence that is being woven into our national life with horrifying frequency.

On this weekend when, as a Church, we celebrate the Ascension of Our Lord into heaven and, as a nation, we pause to remember those who have given their lives in the service of our country, let us pray that all our beloved deceased will know the fullness of life in heaven and let us pray and work, so that God will bring peace and healing to our nation. As we seek the healing of heaven, we pray to do God's work on earth and we take encouragement in the words of our Risen Lord: "I have told you these things, so that in me you may have peace. In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world" (John 16:33).
