

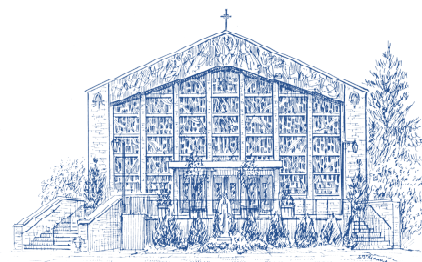

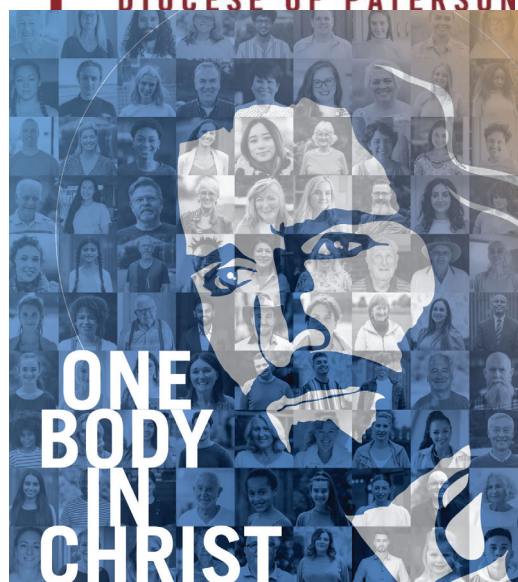

THE SOLEMNITY OF OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST THE KING

“JESUS, REMEMBER ME WHEN YOU COME INTO YOUR KINGDOM”

We have arrived at the final Sunday of this liturgical year of grace as we celebrate the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ the King. Next week the Church's liturgical year begins anew with the opening of the Advent Season. The final reflection of the liturgy this year is on the sovereignty of Christ over all things in our lives. Jesus gives us an example of what it means to be a person who exercises real power. It is not power in the worldly sense, it does not involve force or any kind of coercion, nor does it include having one's own way. If we follow the example of Jesus then we are contributing to the establishment of his kingdom of justice, love, and peace in the here and now. The message of Jesus Christ the King is that one is truly powerful when one puts their life at the disposal of God's will and in service to others.

The Responsorial Psalm encourages us: “Let us go rejoicing to the house of the Lord” (Psalm 122:1); this psalm is a song of ascent to Jerusalem as God's people go up the holy city of Jerusalem. As God's people we are led to the holy city by Christ the King who promises us a kingdom of justice love and peace. This is a celebration of joy when we acclaim Christ as our King and Lord of all time and history. The words of the psalm give us great encouragement and hope: “I rejoiced because they said to me, ‘We will go up to the house of the LORD.’ And now we have set foot within your gates, O Jerusalem” (Psalm 122:1-2). We come into God's presence with full confidence that his will prevails and that he will lead us toward the peace that lasts forever.

The gospel for the liturgy of Christ the King is not chosen from among those which proclaim the triumphant Jesus who conquered sin and death through the resurrection. Today we hear a gospel proclaimed of a King who gives himself totally to the care of those entrusted to his care – even to the point of death. The glory of Jesus Christ the King that we are called to imitate, is found in a total self-giving, an outpouring of the self that extinguishes selfishness and egotism and leads to fidelity to the will of God. Saint Paul's Letter to the Colossians, our second reading, sets forth the far reaching consequences for the Lordship of Christ the King over all of us as his people: “He delivered us from the power of darkness and transferred us to the kingdom of his beloved Son, in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins” (Colossians 1:13-14). Christ the King has given us the light of hope, the forgiveness of our sins, and the promise of everlasting life.

As Jesus was in agony on the cross he was taunted by those he came to save: “The rulers sneered at Jesus and said, ‘He saved others, let him save himself if he is the chosen one, the Christ of God.’ Even the soldiers jeered at him. As they approached to offer him wine they called out, ‘If you are the King of the Jews, save yourself.’ Above him there was an inscription that read, ‘This is the King of the Jews’” (Luke 23:35-38) Those looking on the crucifixion scene thought that Jesus was a pitiable figure, a man humiliated and left in utter desolation. But they were wrong. Jesus on the cross revealed the true majesty of his person and his mission. He was so filled with the power and glory of God that he was able to set everything aside, even his own safety, to show others what it means to be a King.

As we celebrate this Solemnity of Christ the King, we pray for the grace to be imitators of the Lord who is the servant of all. In that way we will be worthy followers of the Lord who gave us the gift of salvation through the shedding of his blood on the cross. If we are faithful to the Lord Jesus we can be assured, even in the midst of the trials and travails of this life, that we, like the good thief who asks for God's mercy and says, “Jesus remember me when you come into your kingdom” (23:42) will also hear the words “Amen, I say to you, today you will be with me in Paradise” (23:43).

The Eucharist is the supreme act of thanksgiving to God for the gift of the Paschal Mystery. Please join us for Mass on Thanksgiving Day.

At our Thanksgiving Day Mass we remember all of the families of our parish and ask God to bless them with everything that is good. We also take time to remember all those who are in need or alone so that they will be strengthened by the love of God. On the day following Thanksgiving, one Mass will be celebrated at 9:00 AM in the chapel.

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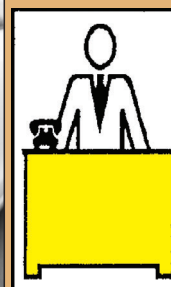
