TWENTY-EIGHTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

“WHERE ARE THE OTHER NINE?”

Gratitude is a gift that we all appreciate. The gospel reading for this Twenty-Eighth Sunday in Ordinary time tells us that the Lord Jesus wants gratitude to be a hallmark of those who follow him. Following upon our reading from Luke’s gospel last week that focused on the importance of faith and the gift that it is for our lives we now see that gratitude is closely aligned with the virtue of faith.

Jesus reaches out to those who are vulnerable and marginalized, time and time again – including lepers. This week we find Jesus healing ten lepers whom he meets on his way to Jerusalem. The lepers are outcasts, because of their illness and the contagion associated with it; they know what it means to be alone and to rely on the scraps of kindness that others might throw their way in order to survive. Standing at a distance from Jesus the ten lepers cry out: “Jesus, Master! Have pity on us!” (Luke 11:14).

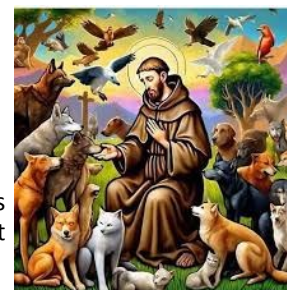
Jesus does have mercy on the lepers. The Lord sends the ten lepers to the priests who would be able to certify that they had been cleansed of their disease and thus grant them readmission to society. As they are on their way to the priests, they discover that they had been cleansed. Only one realizes that he had received more than a physical cleansing; his encounter with Jesus was an encounter with the Son of God. Realizing the gift that he had received he returned to Jesus, “glorifying God in a loud voice; and he fell at the feet of Jesus and thanked him” (11:15-16). Luke adds another detail to this meeting of Jesus with the grateful leper: “He was a Samaritan” (11:16-17). Samaritans and the people of Israel despised one another.

In our first reading, we meet Naaman the Syrian who is sent by Elisha the prophet who urged him to wash in the waters of the Jordan. According to the Second Book of Kings, “Naaman returned with his whole retinue to the man of God. On his arrival he stood before Elisha and said, ‘Now I know that there is no God in all the earth, except in Israel. Please accept a gift from your servant’” (2 Kings 5:15-16). When we are open to the power of God, we are given hearts that receive the power of God’s grace. Our openness leads us to make of our lives a gift of praise to Almighty God.

That this Samaritan – not only a Samaritan but a Samaritan leper – should have returned with the proper attitude of gratitude would have been the source of chagrin to Luke’s first readers. And yet gratitude is found in this most unlikely of persons. Jesus asks, almost as if he is speaking to no one in particular, just making an observation out loud: “Ten were cleansed were they not? Where are the other nine? Has none but this foreigner returned to give thanks to God?” Jesus does not need the expression of gratitude. We can identify with the Lord’s feeling in this situation. When we give of ourselves to another person and that gift is received without gratitude, we miss it. But when someone tells us, “thank you”, we are ourselves humbled by the gratitude of another person. As we seek to serve the Lord with joy we find that we are more fully alive and that our burdens and cares become lighter.

As we begin the Diocesan Ministries Appeal we are not merely charged with a goal to achieve but with a mission to carry out what makes the love and message of Christ known to others. That is a humbling and noble task. It is about us and the mission of Christ that we carry out under the guidance of his shepherd. This is a task that helps us to share in the mission of Christ.

The Appeal helps the local Church of Paterson to fund so many ministries that are vital to so many, particularly the poor, and the marginalized that are cared for by the outstanding work of Catholic Charities agencies on many levels. The Appeal also helps to fund the education of seminarians who will be our future priests. The Appeal helps to care for our retired priests, some of whom who have serious illnesses.

Additionally, the parish receives a rebate from the Appeal which helps to attend to our needs in our own local community. Each year the parishes of the diocese are given a goal to reach so that the diocese is able to serve those who need the assistance and support of the local church. Our goal this year is the same as it has been for many years, \$30,262.

You are always generous in supporting so many vital ministries of our parish and diocese; when called upon for sacrificial giving, you never fail to respond. The needs of funding the works of the local church do not pause. The Diocesan Ministries Appeal helps to support vital ministries that so many rely upon for assistance and compassion.

The largest percentage of Appeal funds support our diocesan Catholic Charities with donations to these programs and services:

- After-school and summer programs
- Furniture for low-income families
- Clothing pantries
- Substance abuse counseling
- Home repairs for seniors
- Chore services for low income seniors and the disabled
- Legal services for low income immigrants
- Meals on Wheels for seniors and the disabled
- Case management, job training and support services for returning men and women veterans and older veterans
- Preventive loss of housing and finding new housing for low income individuals and families
- English as a Second Language classes
- Inner-city Community Gardens to grow fresh produce for food pantries
- Food Back Pack Programs for low income children on weekends
- Programs for Youth at Risk

• SCHOOL SUPPORT

With the help of the Diocesan Ministries Appeal last year, much was done to support Catholic schools in the inner-city area, including capital improvements such as roof replacement, HVAC upgrades, interior lighting and exterior doors. The Appeal also helped fund financial aid to assist families to afford Catholic school education, technology upgrades to enhance the academic programs offered in the schools and support of school activities such as music, art and sports that give a well-rounded educational experience.

• SEMINARIAN EDUCATION AND OUR DIOCESAN PRIESTS' RETIREMENT RESIDENCE

The Diocesan Ministries Appeal helps fund the education of our seminarians and Nazareth Village, our diocesan priests' retirement residence in Chester. This is especially important since the number of seminarians has increased dramatically in recent years, along with the cost of their formation. The Appeal helps both of these groups of men: those who are preparing for a lifetime of service to the Church and those who have faithfully served for decades. Preparing students for the priesthood is an important responsibility of the whole Church and our generous support goes a long way in providing a quality education to candidates for the priesthood.

• PARISH REBATES

Half of the amount received over our parish goal will be returned to our parish for our own needs. Not only does the Appeal support many worthwhile ministries throughout the diocese, it will also help our own parish if we reach and exceed our goal. Last year we received \$26,798.

96 cents of every dollar raised is applied to the Appeal needs as outlined above. The 4 cent balance for fundraising expenses is far below the guidelines recommended by the Better Business Bureau Wise Giving Alliance.

We are responsible to meet our goal and I know that you will do what you can to help us do so. No one can do everything but everyone can do something. I ask you to please prayerfully consider a gift or a pledge to the Diocesan Ministries Appeal so that so much good work done in the name of the Lord may continue and grow. I also ask for your prayers for the success of the Appeal. God bless you for your goodness.

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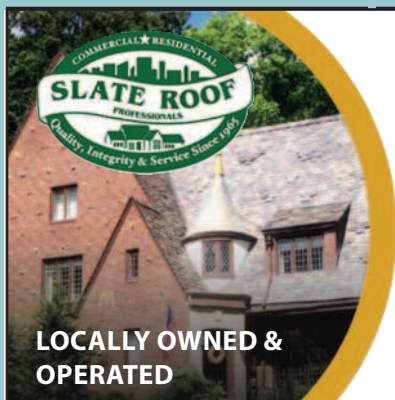
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
