THIRTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME
“O LORD, BE MERCIFUL TO ME A SINNER”

On this Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time, we are commended to pay special attention to our need for the gift of God’s mercy. God’s mercy is always available to us. God shows his almighty power through mercy and he asks us to share his gift of mercy with others. The readings from the Book of Sirach and from the gospel give us some of the principles of spiritual physics; the readings speak about those spiritual principles that relate to riches and our use of them. Sirach reminds us of the importance of living according to God’s wisdom – the clarity of mind and heart that comes from a friendship with God. If we are attentive to the voice of our Heavenly Father, we are attentive to the needs of those who look to us for love and compassion. According to Sirach, “The LORD is a God of justice, who knows no favorites. Though not unduly partial toward the weak, yet he hears the cry of the oppressed” (Sirach 35:12). We are impelled toward friendship with God and that makes us aware of the needs of others who require the love and the compassion that only you or I can give. The wisdom of God makes us optimistic and other centered.

In the gospel, Jesus points to the sincere humility of a tax collector. The tax collector would have been thought to be a sinner, a collaborator with the Roman authorities. But the tax collector is not filled with self-righteousness. The tax collector understands that he is dependent upon God for everything. Unlike the Pharisee, who stands at the front of the crowd to listen to his self-proclaimed righteousness, the tax collector seeks a place that is almost hidden to make his gift to God. The tax collector prays, “O God, be merciful to me a sinner.’ I tell you, the latter went home justified, not the former; for whoever exalts himself will be humbled, and the one who humbles himself will be exalted” (Luke 18:14). The tax collector understands that everything that we have is a gift from God. Having received God’s mercy, the tax collector is most interested in offering praise to God for the gift of his mercy. When we turn to God with gratitude for his mercy, he will always return that to us as a gift beyond measure.

God challenges us all to be instruments of his mercy and compassion for others. Each day we have the gift of sharing in God’s life and sharing that life with others. As members of the Body of Christ we all have the gift of sharing God’s life with others. On this weekend we are participating in the Diocesan Ministries Appeal. As we heard concretely last week, the Diocesan Ministries Appeal gives us very concrete opportunities to help serve those who are in need. Our generosity supports the irreplaceable work of Catholic Charities and makes us co-workers with the Lord in caring for the forgotten and the lost.

This Appeal gives all of us the grace of participating in God’s work and in caring – directly – for the poor and the marginalized. Additionally, the Diocesan Ministries Appeal very directly assists our parish, the Catholic Church in miniature, and a living reality for all of us, through a rebate that is a great help to our work and ministry here.

God’s love makes us free to love others with generosity – and leaves us open to taking the risk of offering our compassion and love to others even when we are not certain that there will be a return. That is the real beauty of love – taking the chance that your love, your investment of your heart, can help someone else appreciate the beauty and the security of God’s love.

Amid turbulence and uncertainty in our world, we are given the precious gift of being a sign of hope to those facing the temptation to despair. Persevere in faith, hope and love requires the support and encouragement of one another. Bringing God’s mercy to the suffering, perplexed, those in difficulty and in all sorts of troubles can be a heavy responsibility but cares are made lighter when many seek to carry them at once.

To thank God for his never failing love we are invited to treat others as He treats us: with compassion, mercy, and love. That is what it means to be an active and wise member of the household of faith. In his Second Letter to Timothy, Saint Paul notes the cost of his discipleship and recognizes that he is drawing closer to the end of his own life’s work. According to Saint Paul, “I am already being poured out like a libation, and the time of my departure is at hand. I have competed well; I have finished the race; I have kept the faith” (2 Timothy 4:6). The more that we give ourselves away, the more that we contribute to helping to build up God’s Kingdom on earth.

Today we are conducting the In-Pew portion of the Diocesan Ministries Appeal that asks parishioners to make a financial commitment to support the pastoral work of our local Church of Paterson. There is an audio message from Bishop Sweeney this week in which the Bishop speaks of the great hope that the Appeal gives to so many and which invites your continued generous support of the Appeal.

I thank all of you who have given to the Appeal in past years or who have responded to a recent mailing from Bishop Sweeney. Your support of the Appeal helps the lives of so many who depend upon our generosity. Already, our parish is doing very well in meeting our goal because of your great and selfless generosity.

One of the main works that the Diocesan Ministries Appeal contributes to is Catholic Charities which operates worthy and vital programs in the city of Paterson like the Father English Center that is so well known to our parish. But Catholic Charities of the Diocese of Paterson does a lot of other good work as well: Day care and extended day care, transportation services for the disabled, family counseling, and emergency food bank, Adult day care, AIDS ministry, Group homes for adults with disabilities, After school and summer programs, Runaway shelter, Clothing pantries, Substance abuse counseling, and Home repairs for seniors. Our contributions to the Diocesan Ministries Appeal go directly to these important works of Christian Charity.

DIOCESAN MINISTRIES APPEAL THREE COUNTIES, ONE FAMILY OF FAITH GUEST SPEAKERS THIS WEEKEND

In the days ahead, we will begin our participation in the Diocesan Ministries Appeal. Along with all of the parishes of the Diocese of Paterson, we are beginning the Diocesan Ministries Appeal (Formerly Called the Bishop's Annual Appeal). The generosity of our parish community in last year's Appeal was a generous expression of your goodness and assisted many in need. Additionally, as a result of your generosity our own parish received a significant rebate from the parish. Thank you, as always, for your generosity.

The name of the Appeal has been changed to better reflect the meaning of the work that the Appeal makes possible. The Appeal serves the vital ministries of the Diocese of Paterson of which we are all a part. The theme of the appeal this year is "Three Counties, One Family of Faith." We are one community of faith which is led by the Good Shepherd, Jesus Christ and strengthened by the Eucharist.

Everything we have is a gift from God. The more that we give of ourselves the more that we are cooperators with God in his work and the more open we are to the power of his grace. Our care for others and our encouragement of those in need is our gift to God who gives us every gift and blessing.

As we begin the Diocesan Ministries Appeal we are not merely charged with a goal to achieve but with a mission to carry out what makes the love and message of Christ known to others. That is a humbling and noble task. It is about us and the mission of Christ that we carry out under the guidance of his shepherd. This is a task that helps us to share in the mission of Christ.

The Appeal helps the local Church of Paterson to fund so many ministries that are vital to so many, particularly the poor, and the marginalized that are cared for by the outstanding work of Catholic Charities agencies on many levels. The Appeal also helps to fund the education of seminarians who will be our future priests. The Appeal helps to care for our retired priests, some of whom who have serious illnesses.

Additionally, the parish receives a rebate from the Appeal which helps to attend to our needs in our own local community. Each year the parishes of the diocese are given a goal to reach so that the diocese is able to serve those who need the assistance and support of the local church. Our goal this year is the same as it has been for many years, \$30,262.

You are always generous in supporting so many vital ministries of our parish and diocese; when called upon for sacrificial giving, you never fail to respond. The needs of funding the works of the local church do not pause. The Diocesan Ministries Appeal helps to support vital ministries that so many rely upon for assistance and compassion.

• SCHOOL SUPPORT

With the help of the Diocesan Ministries Appeal last year, much was done to support Catholic schools in the inner-city area, including capital improvements such as roof replacement, HVAC upgrades, interior lighting and exterior doors. The Appeal also helped fund financial aid to assist families to afford Catholic school education, technology upgrades to enhance the academic programs offered in the schools and support of school activities such as music, art and sports that give a well-rounded educational experience.

• SEMINARIAN EDUCATION AND OUR DIOCESAN PRIESTS' RETIREMENT RESIDENCE

The Diocesan Ministries Appeal helps fund the education of our seminarians and Nazareth Village, our diocesan priests' retirement residence in Chester. This is especially important since the number of seminarians has increased dramatically in recent years, along with the cost of their formation. The Appeal helps both of these groups of men: those who are preparing for a lifetime of service to the

Church and those who have faithfully served for decades. Preparing students for the priesthood is an important responsibility of the whole Church and our generous support goes a long way in providing a quality education to candidates for the priesthood.

• PARISH REBATES

Half of the amount received over our parish goal will be returned to our parish for our own needs. Not only does the Appeal support many worthwhile ministries throughout the diocese, it will also help our own parish if we reach and exceed our goal. Last year we received \$26,798.

96 cents of every dollar raised is applied to the Appeal needs as outlined above. The 4 cent balance for fundraising expenses is far below the guidelines recommended by the Better Business Bureau Wise Giving Alliance.

We are responsible to meet our goal and I know that you will do what you can to help us do so. No one can do everything but everyone can do something. I ask you to please prayerfully consider a gift or a pledge to the Diocesan Ministries Appeal so that so much good work done in the name of the Lord may continue and grow. I also ask for your prayers for the success of the Appeal. God bless you for your goodness.

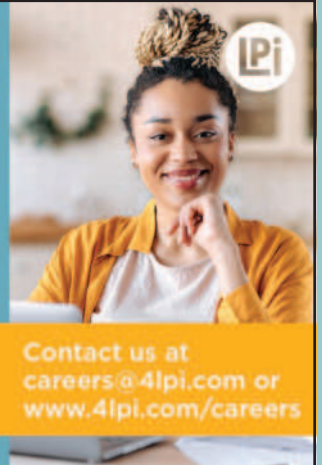
