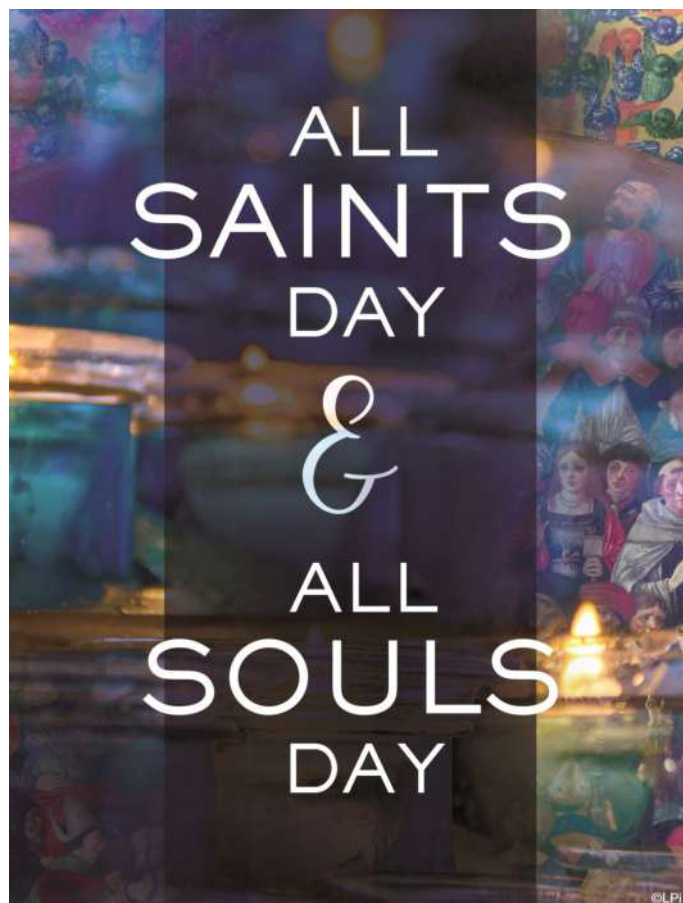

THE SOLEMNITY OF ALL SAINTS AND THE COMMEMORATION OF THE FAITHFUL DEPARTED



This year we celebrate the Solemnity of All Saints on a Saturday and therefore it is not observed as a holy day of obligation. But November 1st remains an important day on our liturgical calendar nonetheless. We lift our hearts to heaven and praise God for all of those who have lived in a manner worthy of our imitation. The Saints are our friends in heaven who guard and guide our steps through the power of their prayers.

We thank God for the example of holiness of countless generations of Christians who have come before us. On All Saints Day we remember those who have been canonized and raised to the honors of the altar by the Church but more importantly we pause to remember those many saints who have never been canonized: our family members, friends, and so many Christians whose names are known only to God. All of us have the call to become saints. Our mission in life is to grow in holiness by opening ourselves to the never failing power of God's grace.

We usually bristle at the notion that we could be called a "saint" ourselves but that is our mission. In doing our best to follow the Lord Jesus and to do the will of God our Father with the grace of the Holy Spirit makes it possible for us to actually become saints. Our reading from the First Letter of John for this feast reminds us: "See what love the Father has bestowed on us in letting us be called children of God" (1:3:1). Children are often surprised that as they grow and mature they become more and more like their parents.

Children are given security and a sense of wellbeing through the goodness of their parents who give them the gift of life and an understanding of life's lasting values. As children of our Heavenly Father, we praise him for the many gifts that he has given us. Most especially we rejoice in the gift of our Savior, Jesus Christ. Jesus Christ is our Lord and Savior but he also is our brother. By God's grace, we are all members of the family of God.

Our family on earth and our friends in heaven help us to grow in holiness and show us the way to heaven. The family is the place where we learn holiness by following the gospel that the Lord has given us. Our parents teach us the faith, they show us how to be loving people, and inspire us to have hope in God's plan for our lives. As we emulate our parents given to us by God, so too, do we grow in the image of the God who calls us into existence. Parents love unconditionally. Mothers and Fathers teach us how to navigate this world and how to pay attention to the things that are really of lasting value. As we look to our earthly parents for direction and guidance, we also look to our Heavenly Father to open our hearts to that which is most loving and other centered. Each of us has the gift to recognize the power of God at work in our lives and in our world. We pray for the grace to grow in holiness just as all of the saints in heaven have done.

In listening to the gospel, in receiving the Sacraments, and by living within the communion of the Church much the same process is happening in our lives of faith. The more that we strive to live in communion with the Lord Jesus the more we become like him. When we are open to the power of the Holy Spirit, who already dwells in our hearts, then we are on our way to becoming saints.

We know how to emulate our Heavenly Father by following in the way of Jesus Christ, His Son, through the power of the Holy Spirit. In the Gospel reading for this liturgy, Jesus tells us how to best order our lives by giving us the Beatitudes. In Saint Matthew's Gospel we read: "How blest are the poor in spirit: the reign of God is theirs" (5:3). This is not poverty of material things that the Lord Jesus speaks of; it is that humility that recognizes our dependence upon God for everything we are and all that we need. On this Feast of All Saints, we thank God for the privilege of being like Him and for the gift of working to establish His kingdom of justice, love, and peace in this world.

The companion feast to the Solemnity of All Saints is the Commemoration of All Souls. As we look to the saints in heaven for the power of their prayers, we pray for the souls striving for heaven through our union with them in prayer. The great Commemoration of All Souls gives us an opportunity to reflect on death, eternal life - immortality, and the soul. This is a time of year that is haunted by death: nature is dying. The cold gray weather can make us feel less than hopeful but this is in fact a feast of hope.

In our culture we are encouraged to deny death, to look away from death, but it is one of the unavoidable facts for all mortals. We don't need to be morbid, and our faith is about life not about death, but the great truth of our faith is that Christ conquers sin and death through his own death and his resurrection so that we don't have anything to fear from death.

"The souls of the just are in the hand of God and no torment shall touch them." Our reading from the Book of Wisdom is one of the most comforting in the scripture – the spiritual stuff that makes us up is breathed into the hand of God. Loved ones are

preserved in the space of God. Why can't souls come back? The dead have transitioned into a higher state of existence – they are meant for much more than we can experience here – we are born from this world to the next – traumatic as ordinary birth into this life is – but even filled with more richness and fullness of life than we know here.

Death is an awful reality because it is a dramatic wrenching of the reality that we know and that we are content to remain with even when it is difficult - but there is the mysterious existence – that miraculous spark that makes us all, contains our character, and remains when our mortal remains are gone. The soul is the energy of God in all of us that never fades away. We are our bodies but we are more than flesh and blood. Senses, memory, experience, - all important but we are ordered toward just our memory and imagination – the spark of the divine in each of us is never extinguished. There is a spiritual capacity that we call the soul.

We are constantly trying to separate in our minds that which should be considered together. Life and death, past, present and future - we seem to think we can only understand these if we think of them individually, but in reality they must be thought of together in order to make sense of them.

Death has such a wrenching effect on us – we absorb so completely the ancient phrase, “Speak no ill of the dead” that we transport the departed to immediate canonization. More times than not, only good things are said of the one who has died. Faults are forgotten because in the face of death we realize how petty so many of our grievances are but an important truth remains and that is that even in death God is not done with us. Even in death we remain united one to the other and our prayers assist the dead, especially holy Mass.

We don't need to confer perfection on the departed – we love them as we did in this life but we hope more for them than the limited confines of the very often unimportant vagaries of this life. Our prayers here and now in this Eucharist assist the departed and the prayers of those with the Lord help us. That is one of the true joys of our faith.

Our departed remain with us and a part of us with them. We have no fear of remembering them as they were in life because they are much more now than we can fully comprehend. We don't simply celebrate a person's life and speak of the past rather than contemplate the reality of the present. It is important to honor the lives of those whom we have loved and still remain part of us – but only to celebrate their lives without also celebrating their intimate connection to God's life is to consign them to the dusty pages of a history book: interesting perhaps, moving, even worthy of emulating but still only ancient history. God's life is always about the future – not the past – and that is the life that we are all part of – there rests our greatest hope.

This is the day to be honest about death and it is a reality to approach with the reverence due any powerful presence but God is more powerful than death. This realization, though, does not lead us to despair. For we believe that at death, life is changed not ended.

These souls share in our longing as we share in theirs. The bonds that united us on earth continue to unite us. And the source of those bonds is the love of God, which is the bond of the Church's unity.

In the thundering silence of prayer and of death we rejoice in the mercy of God as the sin is washed clean in the blood of the Savior. The prayers of the Church on earth, united with the prayers of the saints in heaven, embrace the souls of our brothers and sisters in the love of Christ. Our hope is not deceptive, our prayers are not solitary or unheard – we are joined to all those saints among whose number we too one day hope to be numbered.

Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, And let perpetual light shine upon them. May they rest in peace. Amen.

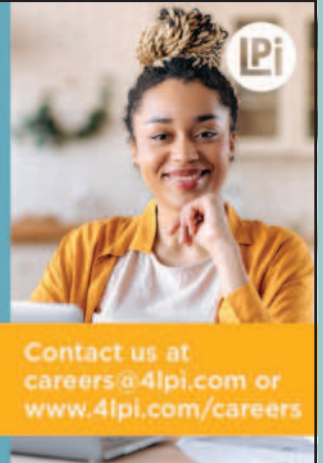
