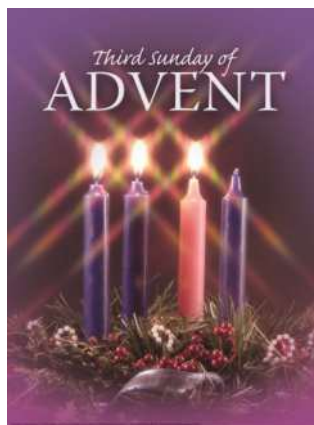

THE THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT

GAUDETE IN DOMINO SEMPER

The Third Sunday of Advent already; these days of Advent cascade by with increasing rapidity. We shouldn't miss the opportunity in this season to immerse ourselves in the beautiful mysteries of our faith. The Third Sunday of Advent is usually everyone's favorite – there is something about it that speaks to us deeply as it takes its name from the Latin entrance antiphon to Mass for this Sunday: "Gaudete Sunday." I can still remember singing in Latin in the seminary: *Gaudete in Domino semper: iterum dico, gaudete: modestia vestra nota sit omnibus hominibus: Dominus prope est* – to paraphrase this quote from Saint Paul's Letter to the Philippians (4:4-5): "Rejoice in the Lord always: again I say rejoice. Let your good sense be obvious to all. The Lord is nigh." As we now more directly prepare ourselves for the Solemnity of the Nativity of the Lord, Christmas, Saint Paul gives us good and encouraging advice.

Christmas is a celebration of God's nearness to us in the person of his Son, Jesus Christ. Our first reading for this liturgy from the Prophet Isaiah also takes up our cause for rejoicing in the Incarnation, the Son of God taking on our humanity in flesh and blood: "Those whom the Lord has ransomed will return and enter Zion singing, crowned with everlasting joy; they will meet with joy and gladness, sorrow and mourning will flee" (35:10). In a 2007 homily on *Gaudete* Sunday Pope Benedict XVI noted that: "the whole of Advent is an invitation to rejoice because 'the Lord comes,' because he comes to save us." That is the central truth of Advent, God comes to save us. That is why we can rejoice no matter how we feel about life, the future, or the past.

Almighty God is always active in the present calling us to deeper life in Jesus Christ, His Son, through the power of the Holy Spirit. The joyous call of the season can actually be a painful reminder to many rather than a cause for celebration. Those who have lost a loved one, or suffer from poor health, a broken relationship, or a lost job can almost feel like the Advent and Christmas season taunts them when they are at their lowest. That is understandable.

In the midst of our own preparations for Christmas we are called to take up the task of John the Baptist ourselves so that it may be said of us as the Lord Jesus said of the Baptist: "Behold, I am sending my messenger ahead of you; he will prepare your way before you" (Matthew 11:10). Our task is to make a pathway open for the Lord to travel thus giving others something to rejoice about by encountering his presence in us, faithful disciples sustained by his word and strengthened by his sacraments, particularly the Eucharist. We too are messengers of the Lord, bringing his announcement of hope to others through our actions, attitudes, and words. When we are joyful in the Lord, we are able to deal with the many challenges that come our way – often without asking permission – with a sense of optimism.

No one can solve all problems, either for individuals or for society generally, but there are opportunities that we have every day to put our faith into action by lightening the burdens of others and showing them that even in difficulty or anxiety we can rejoice because of the nearness of God and the strength that he gives us. But it takes patience and perseverance. The encouraging words of the Prophet Isaiah help us to look toward the birth of our Savior, Jesus Christ, with the joyful hope that embraces the truth that he alone can change our lives and lighten our burdens. Isaiah provides a call for us to have courage in the midst of adversity. Isaiah announces a message to the people of Israel that commends them to have courage, "Strengthen the hands that are feeble, make firm the knees that are weak, say to those whose hearts are frightened: Be strong, fear not! Here is your God, he comes with vindication; with divine recompense he comes to save you" (Isaiah 35:3-5). Isaiah sings of the initial joy that the people of Israel felt in their restoration following exile. In the coming of the Messiah, they can be absolutely certain that God will deliver them from all that can harm them.

That is why the words of Saint James' Letter are so appropriate for Advent and the whole year: "Be patient brothers and sisters, until the coming of the Lord. See how the farmer waits for the precious fruit of the earth, being patient with it until it receives the early and the late rains. You too must be patient. Make your hearts firm because the coming of the Lord is at hand" (5:7-8). As we move closer to Christmas we pray for the grace to always patiently rejoice in the presence of God in our lives and that we respond to his call with the gift of our lives to do his will for us. The more that we live in the joyful light of our faith, the more that we serve as ambassadors for Christ, able to announce his unfaltering will to save us and to give us the gift of redemption; Lord Jesus is born in a stable in Bethlehem. The Son of God becomes

vulnerable out of love for sinful humanity. Because of the gift of his saving love that never fails us, we are able to rejoice always.

ANNUAL COLLECTION FOR RETIRED RELIGIOUS

This weekend, we have a significant second collection for the Retired Religious of our country. The annual collection for Retired Religious is among the collections to which the members of our parish are most generous. That is as it should be. Women and men who have committed themselves to consecrated life through profession of the evangelical counsels are a blessing for the Church. They are a living sign for all of us in what it means to live our baptismal vocation to be the presence of Christ for others. For many, many years the religious of the United States, particularly religious women, built the Catholic School system, built Catholic hospitals, served orphans, the sick, and the destitute. They did all of this out of love for the Lord and his Church. A decrease in their numbers has, in part, led to radical changes in the way that the Church approaches those ministries where religious played so vibrant a role.

Those who entered religious life as very young women and men never could have imagined that they themselves would need to ask for help just to survive. They always lived very modestly, asking little of the institutions where they served, and in many cases they were given virtually no monetary stipend. But with convents, monasteries, and motherhouses bursting at the seams with vocations in the 1930's, 40's, 50's, and even into the early 60's, the sheer number of members of their communities actively serving various apostolates made care for the ill and infirm of their communities certain. Those days are over. Today, the many religious communities of our country are caring for an aging population and with severely diminished vocations. First of all, we all need to pray for an increase of vocations to religious life. Religious life is a difficult life but it is a beautiful life and I know that religious now serving would tell you of the deep joy found in serving the Lord in religious communities dedicated totally to the care of others. Second, we need to care for these religious who have cared for us, teaching us, attending to us in illness, and being an example of what it means to be a disciple of the Lord Jesus.

This weekend, I invite you to be as generous as you are able in supporting our retired religious who look to us for the sustenance that they need to lead lives of dignity, prayer, and peace in their senior years.

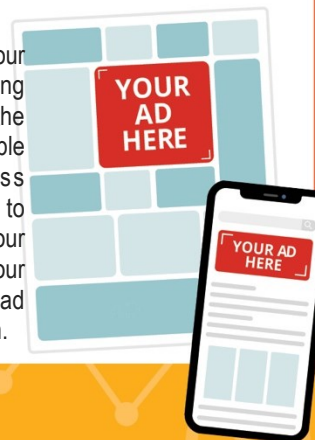
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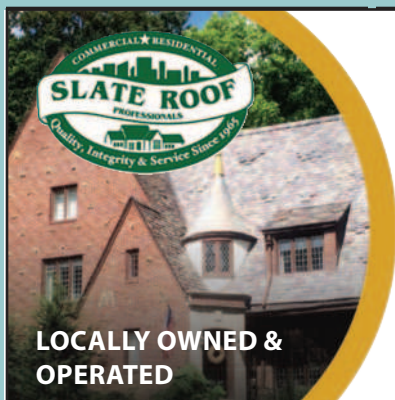
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
