THE SOLEMNITY OF THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD
“RISE UP IN SPLENDOR, JERUSALEM!”



The Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord is a beautiful feast. Arriving one week after Christmas Day and the Feast of the Holy Family, the Epiphany is an integral part of the liturgical season of Christmas. On Christmas Day, the infant Jesus is revealed first to the poorest of the poor, shepherds. God brings his good news of salvation first to the poor, to those who need his word of grace to raise them up. This week the great Magi, or Three Kings, Wise Men, or Astrologers as they are also sometimes called, come to Bethlehem with their gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh to offer in homage to the newborn King of Israel, Jesus Christ. God’s promise of salvation is become more and more expansive by welcoming all people to his embrace.

The Magi were people of learning in the ancient times, they looked toward the heavens to find order in the universe and to ascertain how the world that they knew was tending – what was going to happen next and why? Those were the pressing questions of the Magi. The Magi were interested in the wisdom that came from knowledge, they were concerned with acquiring more of what was good and beautiful – and they were seeking after truth. Another figure who is central in the account of the Epiphany is King Herod. When Herod heard of the rising star that brought the Magi to Jerusalem he was disquieted, jealous, and fearful: “When King Herod heard this, he was greatly troubled, and all Jerusalem with him” (Matthew 2:3). Jealous of his power and anxious to hold on to it at any cost, Herod plots to destroy this newborn King of the Jews.

The Magi, however, set forth without knowledge of Herod’s plot and they are led by God’s own light through a star: “And behold, the star that they had seen at its rising preceded them, until it came and stopped over the place where the child was” (2:9). These Magi show the universal nature of God’s plan of salvation; his plan for drawing all people to himself does not just include the people of Israel but all humanity. “Epiphany” is the Greek word for manifestation. In this epiphany, God’s plan to save his people from their sins through his own Son, the Eternal Word, Jesus Christ, is made known – this plan foreshadowed through long centuries by the prophets is now brought out of hiding and into the light.

As always, God’s loving plan of salvation is not accepted by all. It is not just great and powerful rulers who try to thwart God’s plans, we do the same thing, sometimes knowingly and sometimes through our own carelessness. Herod is the representation of those great obstacles that we try to place in God’s path so that we end-up making our own salvation more difficult. The journey of the Magi represents all those who seek after the truth and the love that God shares with us through his Son, Jesus Christ.

No matter what route we choose to travel by we are asked to give the newborn Prince of Peace the only gift that he really seeks and that is the gift of our hearts. The Magi diligently searched for the newborn king because they wanted to

see what truth this miraculous star was leading them toward. Herod was also diligent in his search, and one might say that he was even more clever than the Magi, he used them to be part of what he hoped would be a successful plan of destruction. In the end, however, the goodness of the Magi wins out over the ill intentions of King Herod. God once again intervenes: "And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they departed for their country by another way" (2:12). It is easy to let that last line of the Gospel that we hear this week just slip away amidst the spectacular images of the Magi, and the Star, and the ruthless King Herod.

The Gospel concludes by saying that the Magi "departed for their country by another way." So too, once we meet the newborn King, the Prince of Peace, each year as we celebrate his birth, we are challenged to go back, examine our old life and seek "another way." This is the time to let go of past grudges and hurts, and to be as generous with our forgiveness and love as God is. Jealously holding on to the past and what can never be changed obscures the light of that star that leads us to the beaming face of the Infant Jesus who can change everything in our life if we will just let him.

The Prophet Isaiah expresses the hope that the Magi carry in their hearts: "Rise up in splendor, Jerusalem! Your light has come, and the glory of the Lord shines upon you" (60:1). The glory that is revealed to the Magi shows us that the salvation that Jesus Christ, the Son of God, brings into the world is meant for all people.

God is not distant from us. Jesus Christ is in our midst in the power of the Holy Spirit and strengthens us with his presence so that we can know communion with God and have the gift of eternal life. It is God's desire that no one should be lost and thus the light of Christ shines on everyone.

As we hear Saint Paul's Letter to the Ephesians proclaimed we are reminded of the universality of salvation: "It was not made known to people in other generations as it has now been revealed to his holy apostles and prophets by the Spirit: that the Gentiles are coheirs, members of the same body, and copartners in the promise in Christ Jesus through the gospel" (3:4-6). Our challenge is to let all know of God's love for them which is made known through Jesus Christ and the power of the Holy Spirit.

Through the grace of the Holy Spirit we have the ability to bring the glory of the Lord out of hiding and we let it be revealed through our own faithfulness to the Gospel of Jesus Christ. While the Solemnity of the Epiphany certainly feels like the end of the Christmas Season, in fact there is one more Sunday of the Christmas Season left which we will celebrate next week with the Solemnity of the Baptism of the Lord, it is really only the beginning of the real meaning of Christmas. The Son of God, the Eternal Word, came into the world to be our salvation, to free us from fear, and to give us the Gospel as our rule of life that leads us to life eternal.

Our vocation is to make others know our faithfulness to the Lord who is our light and guide in the darkness of winter and in every season of our lives.

JPIC Committee Father English Pans

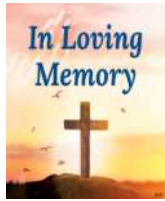

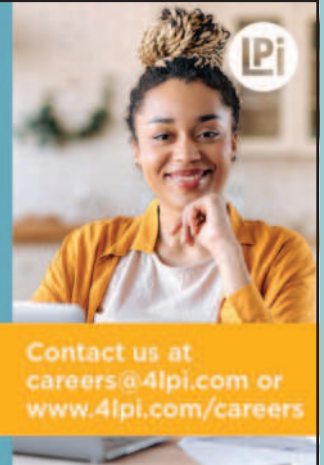
