KEEP HOLY THE LORD'S DAY – GOD'S THIRD COMMANDMENT

As I have done before early in the year, I write today about the best way to keep close to Our Lord Jesus all year long. Before so many other things which we can recommend – our daily morning and evening prayers, grace before meals, reading the Bible frequently, examining our consciences, getting to Confession several times a year, visits to our Adoration Chapel, reading Catholic newspapers and magazines, praying the Rosary, instructing your children in our Catholic faith, attending a prayer group, a Bible study group – before any and all of these wonderful and helpful spiritual practices – there is one which God Himself commands from all of us. God, in Jesus Christ our Lord and Savior, calls upon all of us to attend Mass each and every weekend. “Keep Holy the Lord’s Day” the Third of God’s 10 commandments makes it clear for us. The Lord’s Day for the disciples of Jesus is Sunday, the first day of the week, because this is the day when Jesus rose from the dead – Easter Sunday. This is the day of Jesus’ triumph over sin and suffering and death. Easter and every Sunday is the day of our salvation. Every Sunday of the year, even in the penitential Lenten Season, is a day of great rejoicing because we always remember and celebrate our salvation on this first day of the week, when Jesus triumphed over death so that we too, might triumph over death and enjoy eternal life.

The Sunday liturgy of Mass is the place and time where we, the disciples of Jesus, come together as a whole community to worship God, to praise and thank Him for His goodness to us, to beg His forgiveness for our sins and to offer Him our prayers of petitions. And the Sunday Mass, before all else, is where Jesus showers His love upon us. He is really present with us as we read and listen to God’s word in the 3 readings from the Holy Bible. He speaks to each of us in the scripture readings of Mass and through the homily of the priest or deacon. Jesus comes among us. He is really present most powerfully and fully when the bread and wine of the Mass are transformed into His Body and Blood for our nourishment, through the Eucharistic prayer spoken by the priest’s words, in the power of the Holy Spirit. What was only simple bread and wine now has become Jesus Christ fully present for us, for our benefit.

Pope Benedict told us: *“If the Church tells us that the Eucharist is an essential part of Sunday, this is no mere positivism or thirst for power. On Easter morning, first the women and then the disciples had the grace of seeing the Lord. From that moment on, they knew that the first day of the week, Sunday, would be His day: the day of Christ the Lord. The day when creation began, became the day when creation was renewed. Creation and redemption belong together. That is why Sunday is so important.*

It is good that today, in many cultures, Sunday is a free day and is often combined with Saturday so as to constitute a “week-end” of free time. Yet this free time is empty if God is not present.

Dear friends! Sometimes, our initial impression is that having to include time for Mass on a Sunday is rather inconvenient. But if you make the effort, you will realize that this is what gives a proper focus to your free time. Do not be deterred from taking part in Sunday Mass, and help others to discover it, too. This is because the Eucharist releases the joy that we need so much, and we must learn to grasp it ever more deeply, we must learn to love it.

Let us pledge ourselves to do this – it is worth the effort! Let us discover the intimate riches of the Church’s liturgy and its true greatness: It is not we who are celebrating for ourselves, but it is the living God Himself who is preparing a banquet for us.”

I join Pope Benedict in asking us to pledge to God that we will be faithful to Holy Mass each weekend of the year.

Mensaje del párroco:

Mantenga santo el Día del Señor – Tercer Mandamiento de Dios

Como he hecho antes a principios de año, escribo hoy sobre la mejor manera de mantenerse cerca de Nuestro Señor Jesús durante todo el año. Antes de tantas otras cosas que podemos recomendar - nuestras oraciones diarias por la mañana y por la tarde, dar gracias antes de las comidas, leyendo la Biblia con frecuencia, examinando nuestras conciencias, llegando a la Confesión varias veces al año, las visitas a nuestra capilla de Adoración, leyendo periódicos y revistas católicas, rezando el Rosario, instruyendo a sus hijos en la fe católica, asistir a un grupo de oración, un grupo de estudio de la Biblia - antes de todas y cada una de estas maravillosas y útiles prácticas espirituales - hay una que Dios mismo nos manda a todos nosotros. Dios, en Jesucristo, Nuestro Señor y Salvador, hace un llamamiento a todos a asistir a Misa cada fin de semana. "Mantener Santo el día del Señor" el tercero de los 10 mandamientos de Dios lo deja en claro para nosotros. El Día del Señor para los discípulos de Jesús es el domingo, el primer día de la semana, porque este es el día en que Jesús resucitó de entre los muertos - Domingo de Pascua. Este es el día del triunfo de Jesús sobre el pecado y el sufrimiento y la muerte. Pascua y todos los domingos es el día de nuestra salvación. Todos los domingos del año, incluso en el tiempo de Cuaresma de penitencia, es un día de gran regocijo porque siempre recordamos y celebramos nuestra salvación en este primer día de la semana, cuando Jesús triunfó sobre la muerte para que nosotros también, podamos triunfar sobre la muerte y disfrutar de la vida eterna.

La liturgia dominical de la Misa es el lugar y el tiempo en el que, los discípulos de Jesús, se reúnen como una comunidad entera para adorar a Dios, para alabarlo y agradecerle por su bondad para con nosotros, a pedirle su perdón por nuestros pecados, y para ofrecerle nuestras oraciones de peticiones. Y la Misa del domingo, ante todo, es donde Jesús derrama Su amor sobre nosotros. Él está realmente presente con nosotros cuando leemos y escuchamos la palabra de Dios en las 3 lecturas de la Santa Biblia. Él nos habla a cada uno de nosotros en las lecturas bíblicas de la Misa y por medio de la homilía del sacerdote o diácono. Jesús viene entre nosotros. Él está realmente presente con más fuerza y completamente en la Misa, cuando el pan y el vino se transforman en su Cuerpo y Sangre para nuestra alimentación, a través de la Oración Eucarística dichas por las palabras del sacerdote, en el poder del Espíritu Santo. Lo que era simplemente pan y vino se han convertido en Jesucristo completamente presente para nosotros, para nuestro beneficio.

El Papa Benedicto nos dijo: "Si la Iglesia nos dice que la Eucaristía es una parte esencial del domingo, esto no es un mero positivismo o ansia de poder. En la mañana de la Pascua, primero las mujeres y luego los discípulos tuvieron la gracia de ver al Señor. A

partir de ese momento, ellos sabían que el primer día de la semana, el domingo sería su día: el día de Cristo el Señor. El día en que comenzó la creación, se convirtió en el día en que se renovó la creación. Creación y redención van de la mano. Es por eso que el domingo es tan importante.

Es bueno que hoy en día, en muchas culturas, el domingo es un día libre y, a menudo se combina con el sábado a fin de constituir un "fin de semana" de tiempo libre. Sin embargo, este tiempo libre permanece vacío si Dios no está presente.

¡Queridos amigos! A veces, nuestra impresión inicial es que tener que incluir el tiempo para la Misa en domingo es bastante incómodo.
