MARY'S MONTH OF OCTOBER

Mary, Queen of the Rosary, pray for us! We celebrate Mary's special month during this autumn season in the beautiful, colorful month of October. For me, Mary's October is a time to renew my commitment to her major place in my life. I know that for very many of us in our parish, our devotion to Mary is important. This month is a special time to thank Mary for the love she has for all of us. We are her children. It's a time to ask ourselves how well do we respond to her love. Are we strongly conscious that she really loves each one of us as her own child?

Many of us are very devoted to the Rosary, but also praying the Rosary is difficult for some people. If 5 decades of the Rosary seems too much for you, I suggest that you just pray the Hail Mary or try one decade of the Rosary. What matters most is that through our prayers – both formal and informal prayers – we become more conscious that Mary loves us and is actively present in each person's life. I hope that this October is a good time for us to focus on Mary for ourselves and for our families.

We are blessed that every year tens of thousands of people drive by our church and our beautiful Our Lady of Lourdes Shrine. They have the chance to think about Jesus and Mary when they pass Saint Peter the Apostle on the highway. Many passersby stops at our church, our Adoration Chapel, and our Lourdes Shrine every day. Most are our own parishioners, but others are people who work in Parsippany, and some are people just driving through. Many stop, even briefly, at Mary's Shrine to pray there. I feel so good when I see them. Micki Walsh makes special efforts to keep our Shrine area clean and beautiful. And Stefan Jachna has been caring for plants and trees for us at the Shrine and all around our property.

People are responding to Mary's love for us in so many ways: Our Lourdes shrine, through Mary's Daily Mass Chapel, in our Saturday morning Novena, in the daily morning Rosary, in our Chapel's Marian walls, in our Rosary Society, in our people praying to and just talking with our blessed Mother, we express our love and joy that God has given us the gift of this good woman, Mary, the Mother of God and our Mother.

Two statues of Mary will be traveling from house to house every day in October for the Rosary in the home. Most people doing this are inviting family and friends to join them for the Rosary. On Friday, October 28, we will come together in church as a parish to honor Mary. There will be more on this in the October parish bulletins.

This weekend, we look forward to begin celebrating October on Saturday as a Marian month in our parish, in our families, and in each of our own lives. Mary, Queen of Peace, Pray for us!

PARTNERS IN FAITH PARISH PROJECTS #4 - NEW INTERIOR CHURCH LIGHTING

In the Diocese's 2013 *Partners In Faith* capital fundraising campaign, we committed our parish's 25% share of the money being contributed to 5 specific parish projects. This past week, we have taken care of our parish's 4th *Partners In Faith* project: New Interior Church Lighting.

Fortunately, we are able to keep the present lighting fixtures and just replace the light bulbs inside the fixtures with modern LED lighting technology that will achieve several good results: 1. More light will be shining from each fixture. 2. LED light bulbs use less electricity. (e.g. 160 watt bulbs are replacing 400 watt bulbs.) 3. LED lights should last much longer than the light bulbs we have now. That means we won't have to rent nearly as often an expensive heavy duty lift that we need now to change light bulbs because the light fixtures are so high up in the church. We have been renting the lift at least twice a year. 4. Since the LED bulbs use much less electricity, we will save some money every month on our electric bill. That's always a good idea!

This is an opportunity to again thank every family in the parish who have made a multiyear pledge or a one-time donation to *Partners In Faith*.

If you are continuing to pay your pledge, we are very grateful. Please recall that 25% of your ongoing pledge payments are returned to our parish once a year by the Diocese. Your pledge gifts are still helping our own parish projects. Thank you!

As a *Partners In Faith* update report, our parish has completed 3 of our 5 parish projects.

1. Most important of all, we have completely refinished and re-beautified the outside church walls to stop leaks and mold growth
2. The old parish truck has been replaced with a new truck.
3. New interior church lighting.

We have done some work on the rectory renovations project by improving the parish office rooms and redoing the small first floor rest room.

We have not worked yet on our very necessary church parking lot repaving project. With our Finance Committee and our Building and Grounds Committee leading us, our parish will continue working to complete our remaining projects in a financially sound way.

Your generosity makes such a big difference for us.

On Thursday morning March 3rd, what started as a normal school day for 13 year old Noah suddenly turned tragic. During gym class, Noah excused himself to the locker room. While in there, his heart went into an arrhythmia which ultimately led to cardiac arrest. A friend found him unresponsive and contacted his teacher who immediately began CPR. The school nurse and EMTs were summoned to help and administer an AED to get his heart started again. He was rushed to nearby Morristown Medical Center. That night he was transferred to Morgan Stanley Children's Hospital at Columbia Presbyterian in NYC and was in the cardiac intensive care (ICU) for almost three weeks. The doctors conducted a successful ablation procedure on Noah and shortly thereafter he left the ICU. However his fight is not over. Even after 5 months in the hospital, Noah is expected to have a long road of rehabilitation ahead. We are hopeful that Noah will recover from the trauma so we can hear his voice and see that infectious smile!

All proceeds will go to help the Lorencovitz family as they continue to tackle this difficult situation. They are part of our community and members of Saint Peter the Apostle Church. Noah and his father Tim have been part of the CYO basketball program since Noah was in the 5th grade. 


