**THIS WEEKEND WORLD MISSION SUNDAY – PRAY AND GIVE GENEROUSLY**

This weekend, we celebrate World Mission Sunday. Throughout the world, the Church calls us to special prayer and financial sacrifice for the Missions of the world. Two thirds of the world's people still do not know Jesus Christ. But how can they if no one speaks to them about Jesus...if someone hasn't been sent to serve them in His name...if no one invites them to live in Him, as we live in Him? We believe in Jesus Christ. Therefore, we are the ones to speak up with His Good News.

Our late Holy Father, Blessed John Paul II wrote: "Mission must therefore be the passion of every Christian: a passion for the salvation of the world and ardent commitment to work for the coming of the Father's Kingdom". The celebration of World Mission Sunday is integrally connected to our identity as a missionary church. The supreme act of missionary cooperation for any Christian – priest or lay person – is the celebration of the Eucharist, offering ourselves in Christ for the salvation of the world, continuing the sacrifice of Calvary for the redemption of the world. On this special weekend, our whole Catholic Family is called to pray at the Eucharist for the missionary work of the Church among the people of the world who have not heard the "Good News" of Christ their Savior.

On World Mission Sunday, together with Catholics all over the world, we are also called upon to offer our generous financial help through the Propagation of the Faith office as a personal gift and sacrifice for the worldwide mission of Jesus. 
**ALTERNATE OPPORTUNITIES**

### AN INSIGHT TO THE SCRIPTURE READINGS: 30<sup>TH</sup> SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

“Pharisee and Sadducee” – In Jesus' day, the word “Pharisee” was sometimes synonymous with hypocrisy – as in today's Gospel story. But there were also good and holy Pharisees – Nicodemus was one of them (a friend of Jesus).

The Pharisees were laymen and in charge of the local synagogue. The “Sadducees” (priests) were in charge of the Temple in Jerusalem. The people of Israel could not travel to the Temple every Sabbath, so they had the local synagogue where they would gather for prayer.

The Pharisees were devoted to the *Law of Moses* and to making it workable in the everyday lives of the Jewish people. They were interpreters of the *Law*. For example, the *Law of Moses* said no work on the Sabbath – the Pharisees defined what is/is not work or how far one could travel without breaking the Sabbath rest. These interpretations of the *Law of Moses* are known as *The Talmud*.




