Daylight savings time ends next weekend. The afternoons grow dark much earlier. November arrives on Tuesday, and it is the last month of the Church's Liturgical year.

November begins with two important feast days that set the mood for the entire month. Tuesday, November 1, All Saints Day, is a Holy Day of Obligation. We pray that day especially to all the uncanonized Saints living in heaven and on earth.

Wednesday, November 2, is All Souls Day when we especially remember and honor all of our deceased loved ones, praying that we will join them one day with all the other Saints in heaven.

Here at church every day in November, we will pray at every Mass for all of your deceased whose names you have asked us to pray for on your All Souls Day envelopes.

In a very special way, on this Wednesday evening, All Souls Day, at 7:00 PM at our annual Memorial Mass, we will honor and pray for everyone who has died in our parish during this last year.

We also continue praying for all who have lost their lives because of the September 11, 2001 tragedy as well as those who have been killed in the Iraq and Afghanistan wars. On Friday, November 11, Veterans Day, we will pray for all our soldiers who are bravely serving today in these war-torn countries and for all of our service Veterans.

November is the month where the Church reminds us that our lives here on earth always end with death, and that every one of us should always be preparing ourselves spiritually to meet Jesus at the defining moment of our own death. We have an understandable natural fear of death because, more often than not, it involves physical pain and suffering beforehand. None of us want to feel our bodies and minds going downhill. But again, more often than not, this happen to us before we die. But even while we may experience this happening in our bodies, we can and should be growing closer to Our Lord all the time. Our longer experience of this life should hopefully give us the grace of more wisdom as we come closer and closer on our lifelong journey towards meeting Jesus face to face. In a more profound sense, beyond our natural fear of pain and death, we ask God to help us realize in faith that as long as we are trying our best to love Him and to love our neighbor as ourselves that ultimately we need not be afraid of death at all. Death becomes for us the moment when we meet Jesus Christ and when He brings us to the fullness of our salvation in the Kindgom. We know that Our Lord has blessings beyond our imagination in store for those who love Him, and who love and serve Him when we serve the least of His brothers and sisters, the people who are in need (Matthew 25: 40).

Please join us on Wednesday evening at 7:00 PM, if you can, for our annual Memorial All Souls Day Mass for everyone who died in our parish this past year. Come and pray together with our families who have lost loved ones this year.

Please observe November with your family and fellow parishioners as the Church's special season to pray for all of our dead, to prepare ourselves spiritually to accept our own death in God's good time, and to accept the Church's teaching on respect for the life of every human being from conception until natural death. May all of our deceased family members, friends and parishioners be with Our Lord in glory forever one day, in His Kingdom

AN INSIGHT TO THE SCRIPTURE READINGS: 31ST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

The first reading: "The Book of Wisdom" – written about 100 years before the birth of Jesus, its author is unknown and the entire book is a spiritual reflection on humanity's relationship with God and one

another.

Jericho – a prosperous trade and agriculture village near Jerusalem and a popular place for tax collecting. Zacchaeus – the name means "clean".

"chief tax collector" – not only was Zacchaeus a simple tax collector, but Saint Luke tells us he was the "chief" tax collector of his time! This meant that Zacchaeus was an extremely wealthy due to his position collecting taxes from his fellow Jews for the Roman authorities and the local Jewish rulers. As with all tax collectors of the time – there was always an extra "administrative charge" they included for themselves!!

Sycamore tree – why would Saint Luke tell us that Zacchaeus specifically climbed not any tree by a "sycamore tree"!! It's only a guess, but for the Evangelist Luke – every work/image has a spiritual/faith meaning to it! A Sycamore tree may be compared to a fig/maple tree – large leaves, branches easy to climb and hide in for no one to see. Perhaps, Zacchaeus thought he could see Jesus and hide from Him at the same time. But no one can hide from the Lord!

FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS FOR THE FISCAL YEAR, JULY 1, 2015-JUNE 30, 2016

The charts on the facing page gives us a summary of our parish income and expenses by major category for the fiscal year 2015-2016 that ended June 30, 2016.

Please notice that in the 2015-2016 year:

- 1. Our total collections (Weekends, Christmas, Easter) decreased by \$24,857 for the year.
- 2. Our parish spent \$145,066 just for electricity, heating, water, sewer, property and liability insurance and snow removal expenses.
- 3. Our parish invested \$206,076 in Religious Education (CCD) and Youth Ministry for our children and teens.
- 4. Our parish invested \$107,000 for our children at All Saints Academy. It was \$111,000 in 2014. (It is \$107,000 again for this school year.)
- 5. Our Annual Diocesan Assessment was \$78,152. It was \$75,275 in 2014/2015.
- 6. Our three major fund raising activities are Bingo, the Car Raffle and the Jumbo Jackpot Raffle. Fundraising netted \$107,371 and is a tremendous help to our financial requirements. Thank you so much for supporting these special fundraisers.
- 7. With a budget of \$1,461,873, our overall result was a small surplus of \$10,177.




