MARY'S MONTH OF OCTOBER
CREATED, LOVED, REDEEMED BY GOD – An Invitation to Respect ALL Human Life

Most of us may take for granted, at least some of the time, that we are *created, loved and redeemed by God*. Distracted as we are by the noise and activity of daily life, we need to take time to reflect on the universal human question: Who am I, and what am I doing here?

When our ancestors lost their spiritual and moral bearings, Jesus took on our humanity to show us the radical nature of God's love. His spiritual love was personal, passionate and self-giving. He showed us what God expects of us. "This is my commandment: Love one another as I love you" (John 15:12). The model of love by which we will be judged, according to the parable of the Last Judgment (Matthew 25: 31-46) is that of people who feed, clothe, welcome and care for the needy and strangers.

Even when we slip up on this, we understand the importance of treating everyone with kindness. We understand how important it is to work with our Catholic Charities serving people in need, by donating our time and financial support. Our Bishop's Annual Appeal gift does this.

But our U.S. Catholic bishops explain that we must do more: "The common outcry, which is justly made on behalf of human rights – for example, the right to health, to home, to work, to family, to culture – is false and illusory if *the right to life*, the most basic and fundamental right and the condition of all other human rights, is not defended with maximum determination." Talk about the value of human life and the sacredness of human dignity can become empty platitudes unless we *act* on our convictions. No good social policy, like programs to feed the hungry and shelter the homeless – as important as they are – can make up for bad policies about the protection of life itself. Without the fundamental right to live, the right not to be killed, no other rights are meaningful. Without life no other rights can safely exist.

So it is up to all of us to defend the right to life by participating directly in public life, helping to enact laws and policies that respect the lives of all, especially those who have no voice – unborn children, human embryos targeted for destructive research, and people who are cognitively impaired, disabled, or dying.

REPAIR PROJECT REPORT

ALL YOUR GENEROSITY MAKES THIS HAPPEN

THANK YOU SO MUCH

Our Narthex tile project is complete. The porcelain tile is a new slip resistant product for our greater safety. We acknowledge very generous donations contributed specifically for this Narthex floor replacement. We hope you are pleased with the results.

We have completely resealed and re-grouted our beautiful decorative stone front church entrance. This work is necessary to keep all the stones securely in place and to stop any damaging water seepage behind the stones. We must do this work every 3 or 4 years.

We are very glad to report that we have finally repaired and resurface the oldest and most damaged parts of our main parking lot in front of the church. We hope you notice this when you come into and leave the parking lot. This was our largest remaining project that we had to accomplish from our original 2013 list of 5 parish “Partners In Faith” Projects.

About our other 4 “Partners in Faith” projects: (1) The entire outside church walls replacement (complete); (2) Replacing the church lighting with brighter LED, money saving light fixtures (complete); (3) Replacing the 20 year old parish truck (complete); (4) Rectory Repairs (staff front office area has been upgraded – nothing else is done yet). Thanks for making this all happen.

Many of us, including me, are still working on our pledge payments for the 5 year pledges we made in 2013. Many families have already completed your campaign pledges. The Diocese has been sending us our 25% campaign rebates each year (\$42,484.83 this year) to help us accomplish our 5 parish projects. We will get another rebate in 2018. We thank everyone who have completed your pledges, and everyone still making payments on our 2013 pledges.

Thankfully, many “Partners in Faith” contributors, and so many other parishioners are now generously responding every week to our own Moving Forward – Growing Stronger Together parish appeal from this spring. Your blessed generosity in “Partners in Faith” and your increased weekly collection contributions in Moving Forward – Growing Stronger Together are providing us with the financial resources to confidently make the important repairs and improvements we have made this summer for everyone’s safety and greater convenience.

We ask God to continue blessing your outstanding generosity to our parish and our diocese. Please, everyone in our parish, keep praying for our parish and our diocese every day.

CREADO, AMADO, REDIMIDO POR DIOS

Una invitación a respetar TODA vida humana

Muchos de nosotros pasamos por alto, al menos algunas veces, que somos *creados, amados y redimidos por Dios*. Distráidos como estamos con el ruido y la actividad de la vida cotidiana, tenemos que sacar tiempo para reflexionar en la pregunta universal humana: ¿Quién soy y qué estoy haciendo aquí?

Cuando nuestros antepasados perdieron su compostura espiritual y moral, Jesús tomó nuestra humanidad para demostrarnos la naturaleza radical del amor de Dios. Su amor espiritual era personal, apasionado y abnegado. El nos demostró qué Dios espera de nosotros. “Este es mi mandamiento: Ámense los unos a los otros, como yo los he amado.” (Juan 15, 12) El modelo de amor por el que seremos juzgados, de acuerdo a la parábola del Juicio Final (Mateo 25, 31-46) por cuán bien alimentamos, vestimos, acogemos y cuidamos al necesitado y a los extraños.

Aún cuando fallemos en ésto, entendemos la importancia de tratar a todos con amabilidad. Entendemos cuan importante es trabajar con las Caridades Católicas sirviendo a los necesitados, donando nuestro tiempo o

apoyo económico. Nuestro regalo a la Campaña Anual de Nuestro Obispo es un ejemplo de hacer ésto.

Pero nuestros obispos católicos de E.U. explican que debemos hacer más: “La lamentación común, que justamente se hace por parte de los derechos humanos – por ejemplo, el derecho a la salud, al hogar, al trabajo, a la familia, a la cultura – es falso e ilusorio si el *derecho a la vida*, el derecho más básico y la condición de todos los otros derechos humanos, no se defiende con máxima determinación”. Hablar sobre el valor a la vida humana y la santidad de la dignidad humana pueden ser dichos triviales a menos que *actuemos* en nuestras convicciones. Ninguna buena política social, le gusta los programas de alimentar al hambriento y albergar al desamparado – así como son de importante – pueden compensar por las malas políticas sobre la protección de la vida misma. Sin vida, ningún otro derecho puede existir sin peligro.

Así que está en todos nosotros defender el derecho a la vida, participando directamente en la vida pública, ayudando a establecer leyes y políticas que respeten la vida de todos, especialmente la de aquellos que no tienen voz – niños no nacidos, embriones humanos destinados para investigaciones destructivas y personas cognitivamente deteriorados, incapacitados o muriendo.

FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS FOR THE FISCAL YEAR, JULY 1, 2016-JUNE 30, 2017

In the 2016-2017 year:

- Our total collections (Weekends, Christmas, Easter) decreased by \$6,485 for the year.
- Our parish spent **\$125,233 just for electricity, heating, water, sewer, property and liability insurance and snow removal.**
- Our parish **invested \$204,101 in Religious Education (CCD) and Youth Ministry for our children and teens.**
- Our **parish invested \$107,000 for our school children at All Saints Academy. It was \$107,000 in 2016. (It is \$107,000 again for this present school year.) This is down considerably from \$200,000 eight years ago.**
- Our Annual Diocesan Assessment was **\$75,714**, a decrease of \$2438 from the previous year.
- Our three **major fund raising activities are Bingo, the Car Raffle and the Jumbo Jackpot Raffle. Fundraising netted \$94,031** and is a tremendous help to our financial requirements. Our total fundraising decreased by \$14201. Thank you so much for supporting these special fundraisers.
- With a budget of \$1,505,063 our fiscal result was a deficit of \$35,740. Please check the list of major improvements, costing \$82,557, that helped to result in this deficit.



SAINT JOHN CAPISTRANO – MONDAY, OCTOBER 23RD

In 1976, October 23 was assigned by Pope Paul VI as the date the Church would remember the life and witness of Saint John Capistrano.

Saint John Capistrano died on this day in the year 1456.

John was a Franciscan friar and priest, but not of the good-natured variety of Franciscans that holds the popular imagination. To describe John as zealous would be an understatement. He walked the fine line between zeal and fanaticism, allowing God to write straight with the crooked lines he drew throughout his life.

His chosen profession was a lawyer. He was a married man. He set aside his profession and left his wife, actions that were the result of an intense experience of conversion. He entered the Franciscan Order and became well known for his preaching and teaching. He led a reform of the Franciscan Order that insisted on radical asceticism and obedience. He brooked no compromise and had no patience for opposition. Appointed as an inquisitor, his prosecution of heresy was ferocious.

Ironically, this hunter of heretics found himself accused of heresy, but he successfully defended himself against these accusations and was acquitted of the charges.

He died during the siege of the city of Belgrade in the year on October 23, 1456. He is known as a “soldier saint” because he personally led troops into this battle.

Saint John of Capistrano was a heroic figure and his life well represents the age in which he lived. Those warlike days seem over for us, and it is likely some might say that his life has little, if any resonance or relevance, to our own concerns. Most nowadays recoil in horror at a Church that would insist that heresy be prosecuted in civil courts and priests take up arms in battle. This sense of revulsion has not always been the prevailing norm.

We share the same Faith as Saint John Capistrano, but our vision of what the Faith should be and do differs in some, if not many, respects.

Some might wonder why such a man is even a saint, but he is, and the lesson in that might be that being a saint is about more than just being nice and friendly. Sanctity is an uncanny quality that can be as off-putting as it is attractive. We might be “put off” by a saint like John Capistrano. Perhaps the lesson there is that if he made it, there is hope for us all.

Saint John Capistrano is known less for his mighty deeds than for the migratory habits of the American cliff swallow that for centuries returned to nest at the California mission church named in his honor.

The swallows returned to the ruins of the San Juan Capistrano mission church on March 19th every year, and their fidelity was recalled in story and song. We might see in the swallows of Capistrano an image of the Church, whose institutions endure over time and serve the purpose of drawing us again and again into the life of Christ’s sacramental grace. The number of swallows returning has lessened over the years as development in the area surrounding the mission has given the birds alternative sites to nest. The birds have found other homes.

There might be a lesson, a kind of parable for us in this. The Church’s institutions are necessary and good, but they cannot, in themselves sustain the mission Christ has given us over time. Being a Christian demands much more than just maintaining or matriculating through institutions. A pristine building that is themed Catholic in its décor and supported by endowments, but does little or nothing to bring people to Christ, teach the Faith, or inspire works of mercy might attract some interest for a time, but people will inevitably look elsewhere for Christ if they do not seem to find him under our roofs.

Christ is not, after all, a monument, but a living, divine person and the Church is not an institution but the extension of his divine life and presence in the world.

We are not Christians because we build and maintain institutions. We are Christians because people experience in us an invitation to know Jesus Christ and find in his Church the reality of his divine life and presence.

If this is not the case, our institutions will find themselves as bereft of the faithful as the old mission church of Capistrano is empty of the swallows that used to flock there and make it their home.
