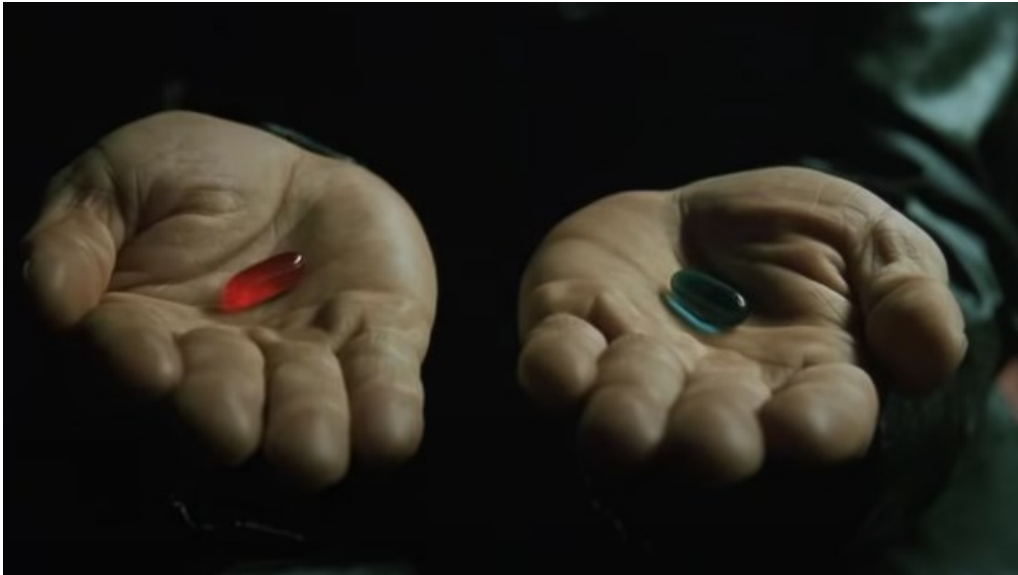

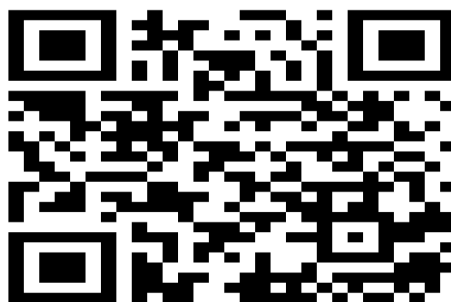

ALL THINGS NEW UPDATE

The new draft models are out for the All Things New Strategic Planning Process.

I'll get right to it - the 2nd draft model for our Planning Area 8 shows us *combining* with St. Joseph parish. Now, what this means is that the Archdiocese is *combining us together* as one **pastorate** - meaning there will be one pastor (but multiple priests) ministering to **both** parishes. The intention is that both parishes will remain as single entities, but combining ministries, etc. This is GOOD NEWS, maybe even GREAT NEWS for CPOP! There are plans for our PARISH and SCHOOL to be around for a LONG TIME!

The redefined models are available beginning Friday, February 10 at allthingsnew.archstl.org. Once you review the models, the Archdiocese is asking for your feedback. Simply go to the Google form found here or use the QR code: <https://forms.gle/acmLXY3F2qR5zrBo6>



This is a very quick turnaround, and your feedback needs to be submitted by this **Wednesday, February 15.**

This will be the last set of draft models to be distributed and the final portion of feedback gathered before being presented to the Archbishop, so that he can make a well-informed, discerned decision for the spiritual well-being of the Archdiocese, looking at the feedback of the people and the needs of the Archdiocese.

Our prayers continue for God's will to be done and His blessings to be poured out on our family of Christ, Prince of Peace as well as St. Joseph and the parishes throughout our area and the Archdiocese. May God guide the Archbishop in his decision-making.

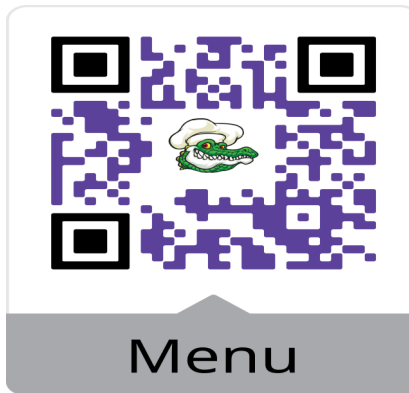

Social Justice Ministry

During the month of February, Black History Month, we will share the stories of six Black Catholics on the road to sainthood.

Venerable Pierre Toussaint (1776-1853)

Venerable Pierre Toussaint, a philanthropist and founder of many Catholic charitable works, was born a slave in Haiti and brought from Haiti to New York as an apprentice under a popular hairstylist in the city. He eventually became the most sought-after hairdresser of high society women. Upon the death of his master, he gained his freedom and quickly succeeded as one of the country's first black entrepreneurs. He became quite wealthy, but instead of spending lavishly on himself, he supported the Church and the poor. He and his wife sheltered orphans, refugees, and others out on the streets in their home. He founded one of New York's first orphanages and raised money for the city's first cathedral. During yellow fever epidemics, Toussaint would risk his life to help others by nursing the sick and praying with the dying. *"I have never felt I am a slave to any man or woman but I am a servant of Almighty God who made us all. When one of his children is in need, I am glad to be His slave."*

Servant of God, Mother Mary Lange (1784-1882)

Servant of God Mother Mary Lange was born Elizabeth Lange, a native of the Caribbean, and believed to be Cuban born of Haitian descent. She was the foundress and first Superior General of the Oblate Sisters of Providence (1829-1832), the first religious congregation of African American women in the history of the Catholic Church. On July 2, 1829, Elizabeth and three other women professed their vows and became the Oblate Sisters of Providence with the goal of educating and evangelizing African Americans. They educated youth and provided a home for orphans. Freed slaves were educated and at times admitted into the congregation. They nursed the terminally ill during the cholera epidemic of 1832, sheltered the elderly, and served as domestics at St. Mary's Seminary. Mother Mary Lange practiced faith to an extraordinary degree. It was her deep faith in close union with Jesus, which enabled her to persevere against all odds. She lived through disappointment and opposition until God called her home in 1882 at the St. Frances Convent in Baltimore, Maryland. *Taken from "On the Road to Sainthood: Leaders of African Descent" on the website for the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops.*
