



"Jesus, I trust in You!"- Divine Mercy prayer, as told to St. Faustina by Jesus

I'm always amazed at the number of people, kids and adults alike, who don't know the game of Mercy. We definitely played this game as kids. You didn't need a gaming system, or even a ball for that matter. According to Wikipedia, it's also called "peaknuckle", not to be confused with the card game pinochle, which I personally have no idea how to play. I think it's an old school game. Maybe not. Well, in the game of Mercy, two players face each other and join hands, interlocking fingers. On the word "go", each player attempts to bend back the opponent's hand and inflict pain by straining their wrist. When a player can no longer stand the pain, they declare defeat by shouting popularly "Mercy", or "Uncle", or something else, and the person lets go, thus dispensing "mercy" to their opponent. Fun stuff. In this day and age, I must say I am not endorsing the playing of this game, but just using it as an example. There.

Today, we are still in the Octave of Easter, 8 BIG days where it's technically still Easter day as we celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday this weekend. Our Lord appeared to St. Faustina Kowalska in 1931 in a convent in Krakow, Poland, leaving her the message of His Divine Mercy and the charge to pass on His image revealed to her, with red and white rays coming from his chest and this simple, 5-word prayer: "Jesus, I trust in You." We all can pray that simple prayer, for sure.

On this Divine Mercy Sunday, we are called to believe in the inestimable, unending, unconditional love and mercy of God for each of us, and how that love is made real in the Paschal mystery. Are we ready to believe that? "Blessed are those who have not seen but believe," Jesus says today in the Gospel, after Thomas's confession. That's us, family. We are blessed indeed.

FUND THE NEED

I have received comments from several people commenting that they were unable to donate to the parish at the recent CPOP auction. Either they were outbid, or missed the opportunity, or whatever. Some wondered where the Fund the Need was at the auction. Could they still donate to CPOP? Of course!

A little background is in order. During most of the planning, up until a few days before the event, the future of CPOP School was unknown. So, it was decided we would forgo the Fund the Need at the auction. When the diocese decided to defer the decision on schools until next January, it became clearer that our school would be around for the foreseeable future.

Given our known future, now is the right time to roll out the CPOP Fund the Need for Teacher Salary Assistance. The Archdiocese mandated a significant, well-deserved increase in teacher salaries. The increase added an additional \$100,000 to the school budget. In early budget discussions, before the increase in salaries and benefits were known, it was decided by the Finance Committee and School Board to hold the tuition increase at a minimum to be comparable to surrounding schools. The amount charged for tuition and amount budgeted for the parish subsidy is a delicate balance. We want our tuition to be affordable and we want the parish subsidy to be within the ideal percentage range recommended by the Archdiocese.

Your help with this increase will make sure we maintain this balance. If you went to the Auction with a specific donation dollar amount and was outbid, please consider still donating to the Teacher Salary Assistance Fund. If you were unable to attend and would like to help towards the much-deserved increase in pay for our teachers we would appreciate your contribution.

In the Jubilee Year 2000, St. Pope John Paul II proclaimed that from that year forward the Second Sunday of Easter would be celebrated as Divine Mercy Sunday. This was proclaimed at the Canonization Mass of St. Faustina Kowalska, who worked throughout her life to make everyone aware of God's merciful love. St. Faustina (1905–1938) was born and raised in Poland. Following a vocation to religious life, she was accepted by the Congregation of the Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy.

In her years in the convent, St. Faustina heard a call from God to make God's mercy known to the world so that the world may more fully receive God's healing grace. In 1931, Jesus appeared to St. Faustina, with his hands raised in blessing and two rays radiating from his heart—a red and a pale blue one. He told her to paint the vision with the words "Jesus I trust in you. St. Faustina promoted the Chaplet of Divine Mercy which consists of the recitation of prayers to the Eternal Father with the use of the rosary for the sake of Christ's sorrowful passion.

The Chaplet is prayed as follows:

- 1. Begin with the Sign of the Cross, one Our Father, one Hail Mary, and the Apostles' Creed.
- 2. On the Our Father beads, recite the following:

Eternal Father, I offer you the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of your dearly beloved Son, our Lord Jesus" Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world."

- 3. On the ten Hail Mary beads, say the following:
- "For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world."
- 4. Repeat step two and three for all five decades.
- 5. Conclude by reciting three times:

"Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world."

This chaplet has given me much comfort in times of joy and sorrow. I hope that if it is not part of your prayer life you can add it beginning this Sunday.
