

April 29, 2023. What a special day for our beloved second graders as they received our Lord in Holy Communion for the first time this weekend! We congratulate and share in their extraordinary JOY as a parish family. Thank you to our teachers, catechists, administrators, and parents. We will celebrate with them and their families this Sunday at 9:45 a.m. Mass, as they will receive their Second Holy Communion. Congratulations to our Second Graders! We love you and are so proud of you!

I look back to my own first communion day all those years ago, on May 5, 1979, and my journey to priesthood, in part, is definitely a result of that day. One of my friends' children kept count of how many times he had received communion. When he finally stopped counting, I believe he was over 100, and then he lost interest. But those 100 or so were memorable and momentous to him. I wonder how many times I have received Jesus in the Eucharist over the years. Hmm... 44 years since First Communion, a priest for almost 17 years... well, I am probably getting close to 10,000 times. That is a lot. How about you?

Receiving Jesus in Holy Communion has definitely nourished and sustained my response to God's Call to the priesthood, as it does for all our vocations. Fittingly, it is Good Shepherd Sunday this weekend. "I am the gate for the sheep," Jesus says. He is the Good Shepherd. We are his sheep, entering the fullness of abundant life through him, the gate. He sees us, he knows us. He knows our name, our backgrounds, our desires, and our insecurities. He leads us where we need to be. He loves us and he cares **for** us. He cares **about** us. Do we hear his voice calling out to us? The World Day of Prayer for Vocations is observed this Sunday. The purpose of this day is to publicly fulfill the Lord's instruction to, "Pray the Lord of the harvest to send laborers into his harvest" (Mt 9:38; Lk 10:2). Please pray that young men and women hear and respond generously to the Lord's call to the priesthood, diaconate, religious life, societies of apostolic life or secular institutes. You can find many resources to promote a culture of vocations on the <u>USCCB Vocations webpage</u> (www.usccb.org/vocations). And where does this vocational call start? It starts at home. I know without my parents' example, I would not be your pastor today. It is important that parents, grandparents, and our parish as a whole support and encourage our young people in prayer during their vocational journey, wherever God may lead them. Pray this short prayer for them daily: **God, help them to be what you want them to be. Amen.**

The Annual Catholic Appeal continues this weekend, as we welcome Dr. Ed Hogan from Kenrick Glennon Seminary and the Archdiocese to speak about the ACA. The theme this year is **Reach Out in Love**. Pledge cards are available in the vestibule/gathering space of the church as in the past. You can also pledge online. Point your camera at the QR code found in the bulletin. There you can watch the ACA video (shown at Masses last weekend), find more information, and even make your pledge. Once you enter your name and address, your pledge will be directed to Christ, Prince of Peace.

Once again, this year I am encouraging each parishioner to follow my lead and make a pledge to the ACA. NO pledge is too small. We can ALL give <u>something</u>. Please give to the ACA. If you have never given before, please give this year, no matter the amount. If you have given in the past, thank you so very much, and I ask that you please give again to the ACA this year. Please stop in the vestibule to make your pledge and sign your card. Have you signed your pledge card yet?

Please pray for our parish 8th graders, who will be receiving the sacrament of Confirmation with Archbishop Mitchell T. Rozanski this Thursday, May 4, which coincidentally, is also Star Wars Day. May the Force (of the Holy Spirit) be with them!


CPOP Fine Arts Nights 2023

FUND THE NEED

I have received comments from several people commenting that they were unable to donate to the parish at the recent CPOP auction. Either they were outbid, or missed the opportunity, or whatever. Some wondered where the Fund the Need was at the auction. Could they still donate to CPOP? Of course!

A little background is in order. During most of the planning, up until a few days before the event, the future of CPOP School was unknown. So, it was decided we would forgo the Fund the Need at the auction. When the diocese decided to defer the decision on schools until next January, it became clearer that our school would be around for the foreseeable future.

Given our known future, now is the right time to roll out the CPOP Fund the Need for Teacher Salary Assistance. The Archdiocese mandated a significant, well-deserved increase in teacher salaries. The increase added an additional \$100,000 to the school budget. In early budget discussions, before the increase in salaries and benefits were known, it was decided by the Finance Committee and School Board to hold the tuition increase at a minimum to be comparable to surrounding schools. The amount charged for tuition and amount budgeted for the parish subsidy is a delicate balance. We want our tuition to be affordable and we want the parish subsidy to be within the ideal percentage range recommended by the Archdiocese.

Your help with this increase will make sure we maintain this balance. If you went to the Auction with a specific donation dollar amount and was outbid, please consider still donating to the Teacher Salary Assistance Fund. If you were unable to attend and would like to help towards the much-deserved increase in pay for our teachers we would appreciate your contribution.
