Student: "Oh right, the book. The Holy Trinity is, was, and always will be a total mystery, that can't, never could, and never will be understood."

And that's the Most Holy Trinity as well as Trinity Sunday in a nutshell, am I right, people? It's such a mystery that we can't understand it? Well, while we can't understand the Most Holy Trinity in its fullness, of course, we CAN understand something about the Most Holy Trinity, whom we celebrate this weekend. And we look to one of my favorite saints, St. Patrick, Apostle of Ireland, who famously used the Shamrock, the three-leaf clover, to teach the pagans about the Most Holy Trinity. Illustrating three persons in one God with the three leaves of the shamrock, St. Patrick shows us all that it's all about relationship. Each leaf is

important; without one or two, the clover loses its identity. That's putting it in the simplest terms possible. Each person of the Trinity is important: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, or Creator, Redeemer, and Sanctifier. You can't have one without the other. We need all three in our lives, showing us perfect love, perfect relationship. The band RUSH, pictured here, is arguably the greatest rock trio of all time. Three persons in one band, in symbiotic relationship with one another, each with a different role. If you have no idea who they are, check them out.

Think about the Sign of the Cross, the sign of our faith, where we invoke the Most Holy Trinity. We can't have the sign of the cross without all three. For many of us, we make this gesture so often, without thinking about it; it's an unconscious muscle memory. And sometimes, some of us, just go through the motions, with a "holy swipe". Know what I mean? This week, let's be DELIBERATE about making the sign of the cross. Really think about what we are doing as we do it, seeing it as a prayer to the Trinity. We can do it. If we do, it will really mean more for us. Try it.

More great news- we have surpassed our Annual Catholic Appeal goal! Our ACA challenge goal lies just ahead. If you have already given this year, thank you so very much. Solemnity of Pentecost 2023

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

This weekend the Church throughout the world celebrates the Solemnity of Pentecost, and so commemorates the outpouring of the Holy Spirit on the Apostles, the foundation of the Church, and the beginning of her mission to all nations and peoples.

The mystery of Pentecost exhorts us to prayer and commitment to mission. The Holy Spirit inspires faith, hope, and charity in the hearts of the faithful, and ennobles the numerous and varied ways of transmitting the Christian message according to the culture and customs of all times and places. While giving us access to communion with God in prayer, the Holy Spirit also prompts us towards service of our neighbor by encountering him, by reconciliation, by witness, by a desire for justice and peace, by renewal of outlook, by social progress, and missionary commitment.

Almost two years ago, we as an Archdiocese embarked upon a strategic pastoral planning process, *All Things New*. We prayed to the Holy Spirit for guidance, and we committed ourselves to you the faithful of this Archdiocese. An extensive process of listening was undertaken in all the parishes. Thereafter, I consulted the Archdiocesan Presbyteral Council regarding every parish under consideration. I then spent time in further prayer, study, and discernment, after which I reached the following decision regarding Christ, Prince of Peace parish.

Your parish will remain unchanged regarding its present structure and your pastor, Reverend Christopher Dunlap who is presently assigned to provide pastoral care for your parish, will continue to do so, as well as Reverend Dennis Doyle in his retirement. I invite you to express your gratitude to your them for their dedicated service in your parish.

While there is no change to the structure of your parish, we are all called to rededicate ourselves to new modes of evangelization and social outreach. I ask that you join me in praying for those among the faithful of the Archdiocese who will be hearing other challenging news this weekend regarding their parish.

Please join me in praying that the Holy Spirit will draw us all closer together as we commit ourselves to following the Lord Jesus and spreading His message by the witness of our lives.

The Universal Church dedicates the month of June to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. This tradition grew from the beautiful visitations that St. Margaret Mary Alacoque received over a span of 18 months. Jesus appeared to St. Margaret Mary and impressed upon her the great love he has for all of us. Dedication to the Sacred Heart began almost immediately in France. One of the requests that Jesus made of St. Margaret Mary was to establish a solemn feast dedicated to His Sacred Heart. The Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus was established in France in 1675. Pope Pius IX added the solemnity to the universal church calendar in 1856. This year we will celebrate this beautiful solemnity on Friday, June 16th.

Jesus made 12 promises to St. Margaret Mary during the visitations, and they are beautiful. The promises given are that we will receive the grace necessary for our life; peace in our families; consolation; refuge in life and death; blessings on all our undertakings; access to the Infinite Mercy of Jesus. Tepid souls will become fervent. Fervent souls will rise to great perfection. All places that expose and venerate the Sacred Heart will be blessed. Priests will be given the power to touch the most hardened hearts. The names of those who propagate devotion to the Sacred Heart will be written in the Sacred Heart; and the grace of final repentance – which means we will achieve our life's goal – being a member of the heavenly host!

If we care about our eternal souls, we need to take advantage of these promises Jesus extends to us. How can we ignore the gifts that flow from Jesus' Sacred Heart? Jesus asks us to attend mass and to receive the Holy Eucharist on 9 consecutive first Fridays. Please consider participating in this great gift.

In the month of June, let us pay special attention to the infinite love and mercy Jesus gives to us through His Sacred Heart. Hopefully we can attend mass on the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart on Friday, June 16th. Perhaps we can pray a simple prayer to Jesus every day. The cost is \$5 per child/day. Payment can be made when you attend.

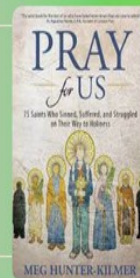

- White attire is preferred for attendees.

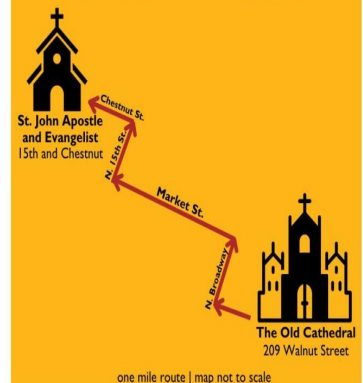
