

Remember these ads from the 80's? Peter Billingsley stars as Messy Marvin, before he became the iconic Ralphie Parker in A Christmas Story. NEXT WEEKEND!!! THE OFFERTORY PROCESSION RETURNS!!

What? Bringing the gifts of bread and wine forward at Sunday Masses at the beginning of the Liturgy of the Eucharist.

Why? By virtue of our Baptism, we share in the baptismal or kingdom priesthood of the Church and as such are called to be active participants in the liturgy at Mass. In other words, we all have work to do, not just the priest, deacon, or liturgical ministers. Along with singing, responding, active listening, etc., bringing the gifts of bread and wine forward is particularly important, as it is symbolic of our offering of our whole selves in union with Christ's sacrifice on the Cross, which is re-presented at every Mass by the ordained or ministerial priest at the consecration.

The Church teaches us that presenting the offertory "...enables us to appreciate how God invites man to participate in bringing to fulfilment his handiwork, and in so doing, gives human labor its authentic meaning, since through the celebration of the Eucharist, it is united to the redemptive sacrifice of Christ" (Sacramentum Caritatis, §47). Therefore, consider taking part in this important liturgical action to deepen you and your family's engagement in the Mass.

Who? YOU! This is something families of all shapes and sizes can do. When asked, please be generous with your YES!"

Liturgy of the Word for Children is a program that seeks to reach the hearts and minds of our littlest parishioners by offering an opportunity for children to learn the Gospel on their own level. We welcome children from grade K-2 at the 9:45 a.m. Mass from September through May. Any child in this age group may participate. No registration is necessary.

What exactly do they do?

The children gather with their leader in the front of the altar after the Opening Prayer and are sent forth by the presider. In each session, an ageappropriate reflection on the Word is shared by the leader through stories, discussions, or pictures - whatever the leader finds most appropriate to convey the meaning of the scriptures. The children return to their families during the Offertory collection. We encourage you to allow your child to attend Children's Liturgy of the Word every Sunday.
