

"Helloooo..., NEWMAN."- Jerry Seinfeld "Breathe In, Breathe Out, Move On..."- Jimmy Buffett

One of the greatest adversarial TV sitcom relationships in the past 30 years has been Jerry Seinfeld and Newman, friend to Jerry's eccentric neighbor, Cosmo Kramer. No first name given, no first name needed. Just Newman. Newman is Jerry's archnemesis. What is a nemesis? "A righteous infliction of retribution manifested by an appropriate agent." Or the inescapable agent of someone's or something's downfall. Or simplest put, one's enemy, someone with whom I am in conflict.

Ahh, Conflict. No one likes it. It's a part of life that we all must deal with to some extent. With family members, co-workers, neighbors, teammates, friends, you name it, conflict of some sort is pretty much inevitable. In the workplace, we seek out HR, or the Human Resources department, to help us find solutions to conflicts between co-workers, among other things. And there is always a process involved, steps to take. Where do these steps come from? Not surprisingly, they find their genesis in the Gospel this weekend, as Jesus walks us through the steps to conflict resolution. Go back and check them out.

At about the same time as *Seinfeld*, the phrase "What Would Jesus Do?" "Or WWJD?" was popular, or actually re-popularized, as it first started in the late 1800's. Yep, you read that right, the late 1800's! Back in the time of *Seinfeld*, "WWJD?" could be found on bracelets, on shirts, everywhere, as a reminder to Christians of the moral imperative to act as Jesus would. It's not as popular anymore, but it is still a question we should always ask ourselves when making a big decision. What would Jesus do in this situation? That's what disciples of Jesus should do. That's what WE should do.

On another note, "WWJD?" prompted other acronyms during the time as well, including "WWJBD?" or "What Would Jimmy Buffett Do?" As a Parrothead, or fan of Jimmy Buffett since I was 14, so for almost 40 years, I loved this merging of two worlds together. I loved Jimmy before PHISH, the DEAD, before anyone, really. I saw him 29 times in concert over the years; the only band I've seen more is PHISH, at 30 times. We lost Jimmy Buffett last week at the age of 76. Born on Christmas Day, 1946 and a former Catholic, Jimmy brought love and light to the world through his island-tinged music, which helped us to "forget about life for awhile." So, what *would* Jimmy Buffett do? Have fun, laugh a little more, love those around you, and enjoy life. Good advice. If that included a margarita and/or a cheeseburger, if that's your thing, so much the better. Rest in Peace, Jimmy.

The children return to their families during the Offertory collection. We encourage you to allow your child to attend Children's Liturgy of the Word every Sunday.
