<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Pastor's Column</u></p> <p>Brothers and Sisters,</p> <p>You have heard me speak more than once about the importance of being a Eucharistic parish. As you know the Eucharist is the Real Presence of Jesus Christ – His Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity. So being a Eucharistic parish means placing the Lord Jesus at the very center of who we are and what we do. The Second Vatican Council taught that the celebration Eucharist is the “source and summit of the Christian life” (Lumen gentium). A few years later, an instruction issued under Pope Blessed Paul VI phrased it this way: “The celebration of the Eucharist in the sacrifice of the Mass is the origin and consummation of the worship shown to the Eucharist outside Mass” (Eucharisticum mysterium) . The words “source” and “summit”, “origin” and “consummation” show the deep, intrinsic link between the celebration of the Eucharist and the Real Presence of Jesus in the tabernacle, as well as the adoration of the Eucharist outside of Mass. They are also apt descriptors of what the Lord Jesus should be in our lives.</p> <p>Because the Eucharist is Jesus’ substantial presence, the Eucharist is the source and origin of who we are as members of the Church, the Mystical Body of Christ. We do not create ourselves and we do not convoke ourselves as a community. Jesus Christ, the Incarnate Son, does both. He brings us into being as Christians through His passion, death and resurrection, and He calls us together to join His Mystical Body, the Church. He is the source and origin of our unity. The more we are united to Him, the more united we are with each other and to those in spiritual or material need. He is the summit and consummation of our lives, the fulfillment of the deepest desires of our hearts. The questions He is asking us: Am I the center of your life? Am I the source and summit of all that you are? What in our priorities, habits and lifestyle prevents Him from being the origin, center and consummation of our lives?</p> <p>Source and summit, origin and consummation point to the fact that Jesus, truly present in the Blessed Sacrament, is our center as a parish. His divine life radiates from the altar in the sacrifice of the Mass and from the tabernacle at all times seeking to penetrate our lives with His Divine Love. All of our attention as a parish should be focused on Him: where He is, what He is saying and doing, what are the desires of His Heart, what would He want us to do here and now. In this way we won't get hung up on the personality of a pastor, parishioner or group of parishioners. Instead, we will have Jesus' personality, His Body, His Blood, His desires, His action. If we make Jesus the center of our lives and our parish, then He will accomplish marvelous and even miraculous things in us and through us.</p> <p>In Christ the King, Msgr. John Cihak</p>
