

PASTOR'S COLUMN



SACRED MUSIC

"Sacred music" is a term that's strange to many of us. The word "sacred" in Hebrew (qodesh) and Greek (hagios) means "purified" or "different, set apart." One of the qualities of sacred music is that it is set apart for God. It is aurally distinct from secular music. It is created explicitly for the purpose of worship.

Workout music gets my blood pumping and helps me get excited to lift weights (like rock or pop). Music I play while chopping veggies helps me get in the cooking groove, and relax as I prepare a meal (like jazz). Sacred music helps quiet my mind, make room for God, and focus on Jesus (like hymns, polyphony, or Gregorian chant).

"Pray with your children, not at them, not in front of them."

Children learn very quickly the prayers they hear repeatedly and are encouraged to learn and pray with the family. The Rosary contains three of the most common prayers of our faith. Try praying a decade at mealtime, bedtime, or in the car. Make praying spontaneously with your children a natural response to hearing a siren, seeing a homeless person, when they are sad, when they are happy, when they are scared, when they are worried about a friend or a situation and even when they are joyful and thankful. TEAMS OF OUR LADY (TOOL)

Think there isn't anyone pulling for your marriage? Think again!

Marriage is a challenge. Whether a couple is newlywed, raising a family, or 'empty nesting' the call to grow together in love is ever present. Often couples find they are living in social climate where forces and stress are at work that can undermine both their marriage and their faith . All over the world, couples have found a way to meet their desire for growth in love and faith through the Teams of Our Lady (Teams) movement. A team is a group of four to seven couples who have freely decided to join together to find support in their efforts to lead Gospel lives.

The Team meets once a month in each other's homes for a simple meal and in the spirit of friendship to share their experiences of the previous month. After dinner, the mood shifts to the more obviously spiritual as the Team reflects on scripture and prays. Finally, they discuss study material on married life and faith. The Team meeting is truly a unique gathering—lively and enjoyable yet structured and meaningful.

How does a team get started? Local Teams couples conduct information meetings to provide information, answer questions, and place couples on teams.
