

PASTOR'S COLUMN

This time of year is a time of family gatherings and can also be a time of loneliness. We can experience the intensity of close relationships, both joyful and difficult ones. We can also experience the intensity of not having loved ones around. In both cases, we are to turn to Jesus Christ, our Lord and Redeemer, and give our hearts to Him. He is the One who can help us navigate that challenging family relationships, which requires that we practice virtues of patience, magnanimity (being "wide-hearted") and forgiveness. Difficult family members know how to "push our buttons" that set us off in anger, anxiety or sadness. In prayer, Jesus invites us to put our small hearts within His Sacred Heart, which protects us and nourishes us with love so that no matter how challenging the relationship, we can respond with patient love.

Some may also be encountering a lack of family relationships. Perhaps spouses and family members have died or are estranged, leaving a great emptiness in our hearts. The remedy is the same: put our small hearts into the Sacred Heart of Jesus and intensify our relationship with Him, pouring out our sorrow and longing. He responds with His Presence. He is with us in all our loneliness. One glance at the manger teaches that He has come to dwell with us, and one glance at the crucifix reminds us that He went through the worst loneliness possible on the Cross for us – the Godforsakenness of human sin.

As followers of Jesus and members of His parish, let us be mindful of those who may be experiencing difficult family relationships or the lack of relationships, and reach out to them with a word of encouragement, the promise of prayer and perhaps extend to them an invitation to one of your Christmas events. We are in this together.

Sacred Music

Third Sunday of Advent Introit antiphon: Rejoice in the Lord always. Again, I say, rejoice. Let your forbearance be known to all men. The Lord is at hand. Do not be anxious over anything. But in all manner of prayer, let your requests be made known unto God. Verse: O Lord you have favored your land, and brought back the captives of Jacob. You forgave the guilt of your people, and covered all their sins. You averted all your rage. You turned back the heat of your anger.

This Introit combines scripture from Philipians and Psalm 85. It mirrors what we hear in the Old Testemant today ("Those whom the LORD has ransomed will return and enter Zion singing, crowned with everlasting joy; they will meet with joy and gladness, sorrow and mourning will flee."), as the Psalm reminds us exactly why we rejoice always ("The LORD God keeps faith forever, secures justice for the oppressed"), and the Gospel tells us what happens when we make our requests known unto God ("the blind regain their sight, the lame walk, lepers are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, and the poor have the good news proclaimed to them.")

Lessons & Carols

This Advent, the Christ the King students will offer a Lesson & Carols Service. Lessons & Carols is a beautiful service of scripture and song offered across the denominations, originating in England in 1880. In 1918, at the end of World War I, the service exploded in popularity and is now offered worldwide across denomination. In nine brief scripture lessons from Genesis to the Gospels, the service tells the story of the fall of humanity, the promise of the Messiah, and the birth of Jesus. Lessons are interspersed with the singing of favorite Christmas carols and choir anthems, led by the Christ the King students.


NCC Marriage Preparation Workshop


The Northwest Catholic Counseling Center invites engaged couples to attend this important step in marriage preparation. This January class is the first of 5 workshops offered in 2020.




Sharing the Gospel






Prayer
