# PASTOR'S COLUMN

Brothers and Sisters,

It is a joy to welcome **Fr. Theodore Lange** to the parish for our **Lenten Mission**. He is no stranger to Christ the King as he did his pastoral internship here years ago. I have known him when he was first discerning a vocation to the priesthood and had the joy of preaching his first Mass as a priest back in 2009. He holds a Licentiate in Sacred Theology from the Pontifical Gregorian University in Rome, specializing in the Fathers of the Church. He is also a gifted preacher, spiritual director and confessor. He is one of the few Missionaries of Mercy for Pope Francis and so has been given some of the Holy Father's powers to lift certain excommunications and censures. I'm delighted he was willing to come and preach our mission. I encourage everyone to participate whether in the morning or the evening. This is a great opportunity to deepen our conversion, make a good confession and pursue holiness.

I also have been asked by parishioners about our communal fasting and abstinence for Lent. Our communal fasting and abstinence are a powerful way we come together to the Lord as one body and give witness to Him in the world. "Fasting" means limiting the amount of food we take and "abstinence" here means not eating meat. The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops states: *"Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence. For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards."* So that is the minimum. Of course someone younger than 18/14 or older than 59 can certainly fast and abstain. I would certainly encourage that if one is in good health, always keeping in mind that the purpose of fasting or abstaining from meat is to accomplish a spiritual result: increase our love for God and the desire for Heaven, detachment from the things of this world, adding power to our prayers, increasing our dependence on God, asserting the primacy of the spiritual over the material, etc.

Thus, the love in the fasting and abstaining is more important than the amount of fasting. I find it encouraging that the medical field has discovered the physical benefits of fasting, especially intermittent fasting, which makes sense. The Lord created the soul and the body to be a harmonious whole.

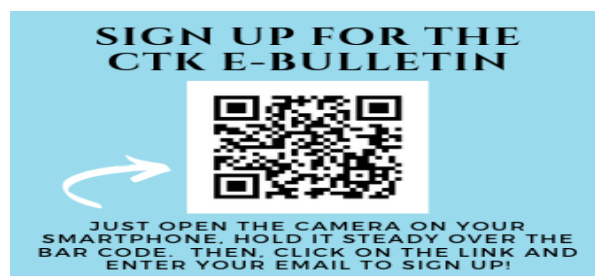

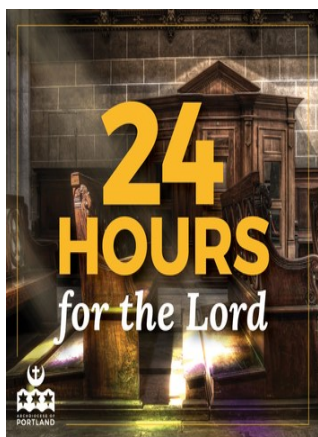

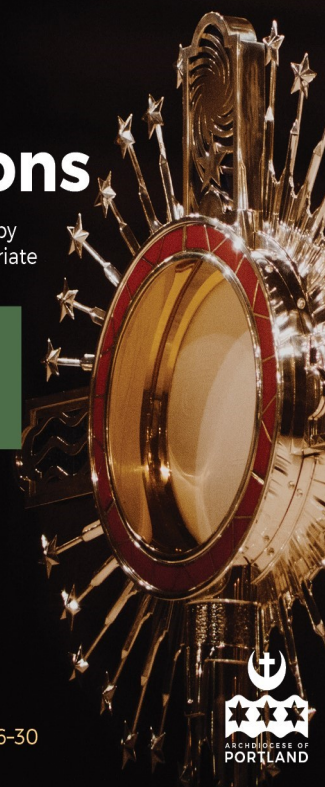
