PARISH NEWS

From the Principal

Another school year is right around the corner. Because Clackamas County does not (yet) meet the Governor's Metrics for reopening in person, we are moving forward with Comprehensive Catholic Distance Learning (CCDL) for all grades, K-8, this Fall. We will also be utilizing the option of Limited In-Person Instruction (LII), which enables us to bring cohorts of 10 students to campus for up to 2 hours per day. This means each one of our students will have the opportunity to come to campus once a week for in person class with his or her teacher. Clackamas County's numbers improved dramatically the week of August 16 (29/100,000 case rate and 4.6% test positivity), and we are praying this trend continues. We have to be at 30/100,000 and 5% for three weeks in a row to reopen for in person learning for Grades K-3. Please pray for our school, students and families as we prepare for this upcoming school year

What is consecration?

Consecration is a response to God's call. Baptism is our first consecration. Through baptism we no longer belong to ourselves, but to Christ who imparts His life to us. Marian consecration is the act of entrusting one's body, soul, possessions, works and entire life to the protection, guidance, and intercession of Our Lady.

Why a consecration to Mary?

Through collective devotion and handing over to Mary, an act of consecration is meant to be a reminder to the faithful of the Blessed Mother's witness to the Gospel and to ask for her effective intercession before her son on behalf of those in need.

When you renew your Marian Consecration, you pray for Our Lady's continued protection and entrustments. This year, we seek the assistance of Our Lady even more earnestly as we face together the effects of the global pandemic.

Bishops of the United States have entrusted our nation to the care of the Blessed Mother on multiple occasions beginning in 1792. Several popes have consecrated the world to Mary on various occasions.



If we really love God, if we truly long to work for His kingdom, then we should find the quickest and easiest way to become saints, and thereby return to Him. Now, the quickest and easiest way to do this according to St. Louis de Montfort is through Marian consecration.

The Church has celebrated Mary's birth since at least the sixth century. A September birth was chosen because the Eastern Church begins its Church year with September. The September 8 date helped determine the date for the feast of the Immaculate Conception on December 8.

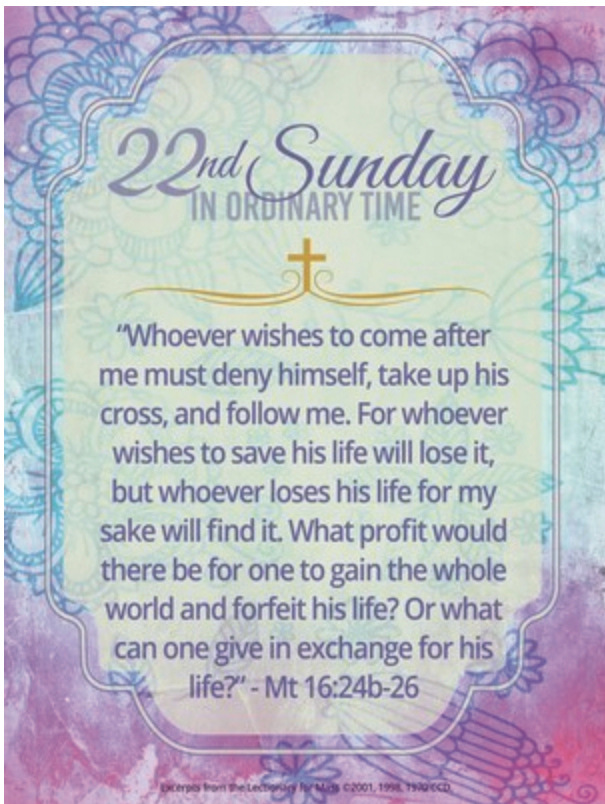
