

From the Principal

Last week we welcomed students back to campus for the first time utilizing Limited In-Person Instruction (LII). LII is a way to bring students in small stable cohorts for up to two hours in order to receive in-person instruction from their teachers. Comprehensive Catholic Distance Learning continues at full capacity, LII is in addition to the full online program. LII is a great opportunity for personal interaction, socialization and having questions answered. Plus, we love seeing students back on campus!! Last week, we also began our process of STAR testing. The data from the Renaissance STAR standardized tests is vital for teachers, as it is used to drive instruction and pinpoint exactly where students are in their learning. We STAR test four times per year and examine the data for student growth and performance. This data will also be critical for our Accreditation process, which begins this October with shareholder surveys. CTK Parishioners will be asked to participate in the surveys. 




