

TOWN HALL MEETING

Saint Joseph Parish first ever Town Hall Meeting was held on Friday, September 25, 2015. About 125 people attended including parishioners and staff. Several parishioners had questions for Father ST:

Q: Can we change the Saturday evening Mass from 5:00pm to 4:00pm for the winter since it gets dark so early.

A: Father explained that the vigil Mass cannot be held until after Vespers and 5:00 is the earliest time possible.

Q: Can we say the Prayer to Saint Michael at the end of each Mass and enroll the children in the Scapular.

A. Father explained that he did not want to impose individual spirituality on others, but will talk with faith formation about introducing children to the scapular. (Please see the Prayer to Saint Michael in this week's bulletin)

Q: What about the changes in the sacristy and the process for cleaning sacred vessels after Mass.

A: The work in the altar server's side sacristy is a little behind schedule, buy progress has been made and it will be useable very soon.

Q: Can we park on Jefferson Street?

A: There has never been parking permitted on Jefferson Street and the police are planning to be more vigilant about that. We need to park on Halsted Street, Elm Street or in the school lot.

Q: Can we have a Parish Council?

A: Yes. The members will be elected by the parishioners for a 3 year term renewable once.

Q: How do we keep our wonderful school open?

A: The school currently has 112 children. The parish has increased our support of the school by \$10,000 this year to a total of \$50,000. We are also looking at ways to save money for the school and the parish. In addition, Father ST challenged all the parents of the children in the school to also "step up to the plate" and support the parish and all school fundraising events.to be continued
