

# THE IMPORTANCE OF SUPPORTING YOUR PARISH

So many times in my life, I have heard people say "All that the Catholic Church ever talks about is money." That is why ever since I have been a priest I have **NEVER** preached about money from the pulpit. I have written about prayerful giving, I have written about the notion of tithing, but have never taken any precious Sunday homily time (which should be reserved for the Sacred Scriptures) and asked for money. Even when our summer missionary preacher comes to ask for our prayers and financial support, I always ask them to include the Gospel of the day in their "spiel."

That is why when we have fundraisers such as the Faith Formation Super 50/50, the Saint Mother Teresa Food Pantry Soiree (the **only two** major fundraisers in our parish); it is important to support these endeavors, because they impact two major ministries in our local church; the education of our youth in the ways of faith and the outreach to the local community in need (regardless of race, creed, color or way of life).

Many other churches have endless fundraisers such as flea markets, tricky trays, candy sales, car raffles, carnivals and (the worst for me personally) Bingo. But it has been my personal and pastoral philosophy that "nickle and diming" people every time they come to church is what leads many to think "that is all they talk about." I believe that the upkeep of the parish and the support of the parish ministries should all come from the weekly collection. Of course, there is always a need for "special collections" for major renovations or remodeling, but for the most part, people come to church to pray and not be "hawked" for money. Again, this is why I did away with the majority of all second collections. This is why I do not allow any outside organizations, no matter how worthy their cause, to come and use our pulpit to solicit for money. Again, this is not what the pulpit is intended for.

Because we have very few major fundraisers here at Saint Joseph Church, I humbly ask that you prayerfully consider participating in one or both of them to the best of your ability. This is why I keep posting each week our budget requirements and we have been so very close each week, but

still not quite there. I am not sure if we think that someone else will take up the slack or we give enough, or we are on a fixed income or whatever excuse we come up with. For the record, I want you to know that I have a weekly budget envelope which I use regularly. And after my article last year about asking everyone to give a "little more" from their substance and not excess, I increased my weekly donation 25%. For I believe that I would not ask you to do something I myself am not willing to do.

Because I know the exceptional generosity of so many people in the parish, last year I instituted our "Parish Appreciation Night" where great food, great people and entertainment were offered FREE of charge as a concrete sign and symbol of my appreciation for all that you do and also a time and place when you can come to a church function without need for any money. There are no 50-50's that evening, there is no silent auction, just lots of great food and an opportunity for our parish to have a chance to just be with each other. I am hopeful that this year will be even greater than last (we served over 225 people last year) and you will make every effort to be with us for this wonderful event in the life of our parish. The **ONLY** requirement is to fill out the form in the bulletin and either drop it in the collection basket, drop it off at the Parish Center or call with the number of people attending so we can have an accurate count of people when preparing the food.

Again, I am so truly grateful to the many people who give to your parish, your food pantry, your thrift shop and your special projects, especially those who do so graciously, anonymously and generously. When parishes around the diocese are hurting financially, I am glad to say that this is not the case here in Newton and that is because of you!


