



ACCEPTABLE OR ARROGANT?



On May 21st, Archbishop Wilton D. Gregory, 71 (the former bishop of Atlanta, Georgia) was installed as the seventh Archbishop of Washington, D.C. and is the first African American to hold this post.

Archbishop Gregory replaced the former embroiled Archbishop Donald Wuerl who was the Archbishop of Washington from 2006-2018. If elevated to the rank of Cardinal, Archbishop Gregory would be the first African American cardinal in United States history.



His predecessor Cardinal Wuerl, on the other hand, was the former bishop of Pittsburgh and was taken to task after his horrendous handling of priest abuse cases as a result of the Pennsylvania's Grand Jury's Report which identified over three hundred (300) "Predator priests" who allegedly molested more than one thousand (1,000) children in six (6) dioceses in Pennsylvania.

To make matters more convoluted, Cardinal Wuerl's predecessor, was none other than the (former) Cardinal Theodore McCarrick who was the highest ranking Catholic official to not only resign from the College of Cardinals, but also to be expelled from the priesthood earlier this year as a result of allegations, confirmed by a Church tribunal, that he had abused minors as well as young seminarians while he served as the Archbishop of Newark.



During his installation as the new Archbishop of Washington, not only present was the former Archbishop Cardinal Wuerl, but also the former Archbishop of Los Angeles, Cardinal Roger Mahoney, who was barred from public ministry by his successor Archbishop Jose Gomez because of his alleged failures to protect young people from sexually abusive priests (documented in court filings in recent years). To date the present Archbishop of Los Angeles as well as the Vatican have been painfully silent on the disposition of Mahoney's life as a retired Cardinal. Today, he lives in a parish in North Hollywood and for all practical intents and purposes, his life has not changed with the exception that he does not celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation in the Archdiocese but does continue to celebrate Mass in a local parish.

Back on July 15, 2013, Pope John Paul II appointed Archbishop Justin Rigali the twelfth bishop and

eighth Archbishop of Philadelphia. I remember this date very well as I went "in the place" of my former bishop and attended not only the installation "in his place" (which literally means to sit in his seat next to the other bishops, Archbishops and Cardinals) but also had the privilege of joining them for lunch prior to the installation ceremony. At this time in church history, the Archbishop of Boston, Massachusetts, Cardinal Bernard Law was in the midst of his scandal of the priestly cover-up in Boston and rumors had circulated that he would be uninvited to the installation of Archbishop Rigali since he would be the senior Cardinal in the United States and would be last (one of the most important positions) in the procession. Not giving in to public outcries or having his name plastered on every newspaper, Cardinal Law came to the installation anyway. The reason why I share with you this history is that in the past Cardinal Law (who was known as the "king maker" of the United States) would ordinarily be the center of attention, have the most prestigious seat at the banquet and everyone would laugh at his jokes and hang on to his every word. This was not the case however this time. He seems to be almost ostracized by his brother bishops, having a less than prominent seat at the reception and (get this) the only person that was found conversing with him was no other than your pastor. He hid behind plants, room dividers and crowds as the procession began down the streets of Philadelphia and I remember telling (everyone) how sad it was for the life of Cardinal Law that the only person who had the courage to stand next to him and speak with him was I.



I digressed. The presence of Cardinal Mahoney and Cardinal Wuerl (who are currently under investigation for their handling of sexual abuse cases) at the recent installation of Archbishop Gregory is quite honestly a slap in the face to the American Church and in particular those victims and their families who have suffered beyond belief, not only the sexual predation of Catholic clergy, but as bad, if not worse, the cover up and silence by their superiors (bishops, Archbishops and Cardinals). Evidently and most particularly the presence of Cardinal Mahoney is at best arrogant and at worse egotistical to think his presence was a good idea. His presence only focused the attention of the faithful on the failures of the Church in the past and in particular his own Archdiocese of Los Angeles and the Church in the United States.


