# DO YOU HAVE INTEGRITY?

One of the greatest gifts that we can give to someone, besides loving them, is being a person of our word. We mean what we say and do what we mean. In other words, we are people with integrity.

Giving our word to someone is actually **easy** because it costs us **nothing**. The real cost comes when we do not honor our word. This is the litmus test for our integrity. **Do our actions match our words? Do we practice what we preach?**

Certainly, everyone has been disappointed in our lives by being let down, betrayed and deceived by people that we respect, look up to, or worse, people that we love:

A parent, a husband/wife, a bishop, a priest/deacon, a Religious Sister/Brother, a politician, a police officer, a doctor, a lawyer or a judge or a friend

Our parents are supposed to always have our physical, mental and spiritual well-being at the forefront of their minds.

A husband and wife promise to love and honor each other until death do they part.

A Bishop promises to be: "*A lover of goodness, prudent, upright, devout and self-controlled*" (Titus 1:8). He promises to be a good shepherd for all of his flock.

A priest and deacon promise to live humbly, love unselfishly and pray unceasingly.

A Religious Sister/Brother promises to own nothing, to love no one exclusively and to obey faithfully.

A politician promises a lot of things.

A police officer promises to uphold the law and to "protect and serve" the community.

A doctor promises, by taking the Hippocratic Oath, to always protect and heal life and do harm to no one.

A judge or lawyer promises to conduct themselves according to the best of their knowledge and discretion with all fidelity to the courts and their clients.

Finally, a friend; they promise to be honest with us, to be just, faithful and unconditionally loving, no matter what we do or how we do it.

As I go down the list, we all know that in each of these categories or vocations, I realize that people have failed us and some have failed us miserably. If we are honest, we might have to admit that even we have failed ourselves at some of them as well. That is why Saint Mother Teresa said: "We are called to be faithful and not successful." That is why Father ST often says: "It is not about being easy, but about being better."

In the First Reading from the Book of Ezekiel, we are told that we are responsible for our own actions and conduct and we will be judged accordingly.

Saint Paul tells the early Church living in Philippi that self-seeking and rivalry have no place in the Christian Community. That we must imitate the humility of Christ in our dealings with each other and with God.

Finally, in today's Gospel, Jesus teaches us that **actions speak louder than words** and change and repentance are the necessary elements for entering the Kingdom of God.

I think one of the worst things that someone can call us, besides being a liar, is being a **hypocrite**. By this word, we are labeled as someone who has no integrity. We are colored with the paint of not having reliability in our words and actions. We are reduced to being phonies!

This is what Jesus is trying to get at in Saint Matthew's Gospel as He relates today's Parable. Jesus puts forth two examples of sons; neither of which are ideal nor perfect, but we can still learn from both of them. The first son is obstinate by saying he just

won't go to work in the vineyard, while the second son is just a liar. He promises that he will go, but as we hear, he just never goes. No honesty. Just hypocrisy, duplicity and betrayal.

The religious leaders of Jesus' time were outraged at this story because Jesus likens them to the second son. Whereas the first son represents sinners, like us. What distinguishes the two siblings is the ability to change. That is why Jesus says that "*Prostitutes and tax collectors*" are getting into heaven before the priests and the elders. So the first question that we are posed with is: **Which son are you?**

For you who are parents, at the Baptism of your children, you promised to "Raise them in a Catholic home and according to the Catholic faith."

For you who are married, on your wedding day, you promised to love and honor your spouse for the rest of your lives.

For you who are ordained, on your ordination day, you promised to "Believe what you read, teach what you believe and practice what you teach."

For those of you who go to confession, you promised to avoid the near occasion of sin.

For those who receive the Lord in the Holy Eucharist, you acknowledge that: "*I am not worthy that You should enter under my roof.*"

For you who are students, you promised on the first day of school to be attentive, respectful and open-minded, to the truth of the sciences, math and history.

## **How are you doing with the promises that you have made in your life? In your career? In your vocation?**

The greatest sin is not doing something wrong, but not doing something good. This is the sin of omission. You knew it was right and just to do it, but you did nothing.

It takes great humility to admit one's mistakes. It takes even greater courage to make the wrong, right.

Jesus is the ideal Son who immediately and faithfully carried out His Father's wishes. He was not obstinate, nor was He a liar. Rather, "*He emptied Himself... Becoming obedient to the point of death.*"

For performance outweighs promises. Fine deeds outweigh fine words; always remember that Adolf Hitler was an excellent speaker, as was Jim Jones and Ted Bundy.

A person is as good as their word.

## **How good is your word? How good are your promises? How good is your integrity?**

In the wonderful words of Saint Paul: "*Brothers and sisters, complete my joy by being of the same mind, with the same love, united in heart, thinking of one thing.*" Mean what you say and say what you mean, but don't say it meanly.

Being faithful takes integrity. Having integrity takes practice. Being a Christian takes humility and courage to change. But it is only when we change that we have a shot at eternal life.

You can't change the past, but starting right now, this day, this moment, this second, you can change the future. **So, what will it be?**

Will you go work in the vineyard? Will you change your life for the better? Will you be a woman or a man, a boy or a girl who has integrity? Or are you just going to lie and say that you will change, but like the elders and the priests from the Gospel, do nothing?

The questions we are left with this week are: **It is time for you to have integrity? Are you ready to be a woman or man of your word?**

## SISTER SHAILA



Sister Shaila spent most of her childhood in Colorado with her two sisters and various cousins whom her parents helped raise. Both her parents helped instill the Catholic faith in their children by uniting the family together in prayer in the mornings before school and evenings after dinner. She loved going on family road trips over the summer and playing with her siblings. As a child her parents taught her the value of hard work and encouraged her to play outside and use her imagination. As a young girl she saw Mother Teresa on television and this ignited in her, the desire to serve others.

Sensing that she may have a vocation in high school, with her parents by her side, she chose to visit the Missionaries of Charity. At the time, she decided that this was not the path which God was calling her to live. She took the next step and attended college in Florida and graduated from pharmacy school and found a job.

The new career was a learning curve, but so was the struggle of discerning married life. God graced her with a two hour commute every day, during which time she was inspired to pray the Rosary. Our Blessed Mother slowly fostered in her the desire to be in the presence of the Lord in adoration and then led her to daily Mass. The desire to serve others in the Church once again stirred in her mind and heart. She started volunteering with her local church and a few religious congregations. Despite the different ministries, there was still a longing for something more. For years she had been asking God one question: "What do you want me to do?"

After many years, He answered this question and filled her longing. A priest who had been guiding her for many years spoke to her about his experience meeting the Salesian Sisters. Sister Shaila had long decided that she was not called to religious life, but hearing the name Salesian Sisters stirred something within her and she contacted them. After visiting the Salesian convent in Bellflower, California, she knew that God was calling her and that she would regret it if she didn't respond.

As a First Year Novice, she has now been living, learning and growing with the Salesian Sisters for two years. She has become more aware of God's presence in her life and has learned so much from the young people she has been called to serve with the joy of the Salesian spirit and is grateful to Mary, Our Mother and God for bringing her on this amazing journey.
