

# MY PERSONAL REACTION TO THE RECENT ELECTION

This past week, many people have texted me, Facebooked me and called me, asking about what I thought about the recent and ongoing Presidential election. Let me first begin by saying the following remarks are my personal remarks and my personal reaction as a Catholic priest and as the pastor of this local church in Newton.

Firstly, I have to say that I am hardly ever left for words, but it seems that I have been beside myself these past few days, as if I had encountered the death of a loved one. Thus, I have been pretty quiet on my public response to the election. In my own personal life, I have experienced an overwhelming sense of grief, disbelief, sadness, anger and even incredulousness as a result of the election voting tallies.

The closest thing that I can liken this to, is back in 2012 when Presidential hopeful Mitt Romney dropped the ball during the Presidential debate with former President Obama by failing to press him on serious and essential topics. After the election, I stopped watching all news, reading newspapers and became silent on all internet platforms for years. I was disgusted, disenfranchised and again, I honestly felt that the American people had been cheated.

It took a very long time for me to once again find my voice and engage in any political discussions at all. It was not until the Presidential election of 2016, that I actually found my voice again. I remember each and every evening I posted a "rant" on my Facebook page. When I first began, several people actually thought my account had been hacked because I was silent for so long.

Secondly, I must be honest and admit that I now know how those who were rooting for Hillary Clinton to win in 2016 felt after their defeat. Although I never gave into hysteria, bouts of screaming, looting, rioting or marching on the White House.
