

The Sacrament of Holy Baptism

We require that you contact the Church Parish Office before the child is born or shortly after birth and pick up a Holy Baptismal Packet. Once the packet is completed both parents must attend a Baptism Class. At least one sponsor must be a practicing Confirmed Roman Catholic in good standing who regularly attend Sunday Holy Mass.

The Sacrament of Holy Matrimony

Arrangements must be made with the Pastor at least six months in advance. To avoid schedule conflicts, all wedding dates held at Our Lady of the Most Holy Rosary and St. Frances Cabrini Church must be confirmed with the Pastor, who should be the first contact of the couple. Please pick up a wedding guidelines booklet at the Church Parish Office or online for details of paper work and preparation requirements.

The Rite of Holy Christian Burial

Our Roman Catholic Faith teaches the infinite value of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass for the repose of the soul of a departed one. Roman Catholic Church law states that the Mass of Christian burial is properly celebrated in the Church.
(Code of Canon Law: 1177 § 1)





Saint of the Week

St. Francis of Assisi (1181 – 1226) left a life of luxury for a life devoted to Christianity after reportedly hearing the voice of God, who commanded him to rebuild the Christian church and live in poverty. He founded the men's Order of Friars Minor, the women's Order of St. Clare, the Third Order of St. Francis and the Custody of the Holy Land.

Born in 1181 in Italy, St. Francis of Assisi was renowned for drinking and partying as a youth. During a military expedition/battle between Assisi and Perugia, he was captured and imprisoned for ransom. He spent nearly a year in prison and began receiving visions from God. After his release from prison, St. Francis of Assisi claimed to have heard the voice of Christ, who told him to restore the Christian Church and live a life of poverty. As a result, St. Francis of Assisi abandoned his life of luxury and became a devotee of the Catholic faith.

Today, St. Francis of Assisi, known for his deep love of nature and animals, is the patron saint of the environment and animals. Each October, many animals are blessed on his feast day.



Our Lady's 15 Promises to Those Who Pray Her Rosary

The Holy Rosary is an enormous source of grace and spiritual protection, one of the most powerful sacramentals of the Catholic Church. Sister Lucia dos Santos, one of the children to whom Our Lady appeared at Fatima, once said, "There is no problem, no matter how difficult it is, whether temporal or above all spiritual, in the personal life of each one of us, of our families ... that cannot be solved by the Rosary. There is no problem, I tell you, no matter how difficult it is, that we cannot resolve by the prayer of the Holy Rosary." Our Lady revealed the following promises to St. Dominic and later to Blessed Alan de la Roche.

1. Whosoever shall faithfully serve me by the recitation of the Rosary shall receive signal graces.
2. I promise my special protection and the greatest graces to all those who shall recite the Rosary.
3. The Rosary shall be a powerful armor against hell, it will destroy vice, decrease sin and defeat heresies.
4. It will cause good works to flourish; it will obtain for souls the abundant mercy of God; it will withdraw the hearts of men from the love of the world and its vanities, and will lift them to the desire for Eternal things. Oh, that souls would sanctify themselves by this means!
5. The soul which recommends itself to me by the recitation of the Rosary shall not perish.
6. Whosoever shall recite the Rosary devoutly, applying himself to the consideration of its Sacred Mysteries, shall never be conquered by misfortune. God will not chastise him in His justice, he shall not perish by an unprovided death; if he be just he shall remain in the grace of God, and become worthy of Eternal Life.
7. Whoever shall have a true devotion for the Rosary shall not die without the Sacraments of the Church.
8. Those who are faithful to recite the Rosary shall have during their life and at their death the Light of God and the plenitude of His Graces; at the moment of death they shall participate in the Merits of the Saints in Paradise.
9. I shall deliver from purgatory those who have been devoted to the Rosary.
10. The faithful children of the Rosary shall merit a high degree of Glory in Heaven.
11. You shall obtain all you ask of me by recitation of the Rosary.
12. All those who propagate the Holy Rosary shall be aided by me in their necessities.
13. I have obtained from my Divine Son that all the advocates of the Rosary shall have for intercessors the entire Celestial Court during their life and at the hour of death.
14. All who recite the Rosary are my Sons, and brothers of my Only Son Jesus Christ.
15. Devotion to my Rosary is a great sign of predestination.

It is amazing to realize how much grace and heavenly help we can receive by an act as [praying the Rosary](#). It only takes 15 minutes! Set aside time alone, with your family, or with some friends to start the habit of reciting a daily Rosary in person or online. Try praying on the way to work or running errands. You will surely notice the grace it brings to your life, as promised by Our Lady! October 7 - Feast of the Most Holy Rosary.
