From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Friends in Christ,

Last weekend we celebrated the solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi). As a parish, we celebrated this solemnity by having a Eucharistic procession immediately after the 1pm Mass. Summarizing the Vatican's teaching on processions, Pawel Szylak O.P writes, "In the Catholic Church processions are part of the liturgy and they have a religious character. They are public acts of homage to God, to give honor to Him, or to the Mother of God or to the saints. The word 'procession' comes from the Latin word '*procedere*' which means to go forth or to proceed. In this case it emphasizes the dynamic character of the liturgy which in turn reflects the dynamic nature of our faith. Processions express the physical and spiritual condition of human beings who are pilgrims on this earth and who are always on the way."

The Solemnity of Corpus Christi also began the National Eucharistic Revival, which was approved by the US bishops in order to nourish and enkindle our love and reverence for the Eucharist. In line with the Eucharistic Revival, we will be offering some more Eucharistic centered practices these upcoming years. Below are some basic questions and answers provided by Catholic News Agency:

What is the Eucharistic Revival? The Eucharistic Revival is a three-year initiative that aims to inspire, educate, and unite. In a world where not many people know Jesus intimately, the revival is meant to show everyone what wonders the True Presence of Jesus can do to heal the soul. Through a carefully planned timeline of events, after three years, the U.S. bishops hope to change the lives of many Catholics and non-Catholics alike. As the campaign organizers say on the revival's website, those who have been "healed, converted, formed, and unified" by the Eucharist have a mission to teach others "for the life of the world." This is what the National Eucharistic Revival envisions for the future of this movement.

Why are the U.S. bishops doing this? Great question. The current world is hurting and straying far from God. According to Pew Research Center, only 31% of Catholics even believe in the True Presence of Christ in the Eucharist. It is up to that 31% to spread the truth to all. As the revival website says, "We all need healing, yet many of us are separated from the very source of our strength. Jesus Christ invites us to return to the source and summit of our faith — his Real Presence in the Holy Eucharist." It is a time to confront the hardships that face people in everyday life. The National Eucharistic Revival is a powerful, uplifting way to rise to this challenge.

What's planned for the kickoff? This coming year is the Year of Diocesan Renewal. From now through June of 2023, each diocese will offer events to promote and inspire understanding of the Eucharist. The training of "eucharistic missionaries" will come through online and in-person resources that teach about Christ and the Real Presence. Everything will start with widespread eucharistic adoration and procession on the Solemnity of Corpus Christi.

What happens next? Spanning until July 2024 and beyond, the movement will also include a Year of Parish Revival, a National Eucharistic Congress in 2024, and the National Year of Mission. Each year will be dedicated to serving a specific purpose in the National Eucharistic Revival's mission.

When is the National Eucharistic Congress? This major national event will be held in Indianapolis, Indiana, from July 17-21, 2024. Over 100,000 Catholics are expected to "worship our Risen Lord in his humble disguise" and allow the Holy Spirit to "enkindle a missionary fire in the heart of our nation," according to the revival website. This "National Pilgrimage" will have both in-person and remote options, so everyone can take part in this solemn celebration.

EUCCHARISTIC MIRACLE OF BOLSENA

Father Peter of Prague, on pilgrimage to Rome, stopped in Bolsena to celebrate Mass at the church of St Christina. The German priest was experiencing doubts about the Real Presence and was praying fervently for his faith to be revived. During Mass, as he spoke the words of consecration, the Host turned to flesh and blood started to trickle from the Host, over his hands, and onto the altar. The confused priest stopped the Mass, folded up the Host in the blood-stained corporal, and left the altar with blood dripping onto the marble floor. Inspired by the miracle, Pope Urban decided to institute the Feast of Corpus Christi for the universal Church. He commissioned St. Thomas Aquinas to compose hymns for the Mass and Divine Office, for which St. Thomas wrote Panis Angelicus, O Salutaris, Tantum Ergo, Adore Te Devote and Pange Lingua. The blood-stained corporal remains enshrined in the Cathedral of Orvieto and you can still see the blood-stained marble floor in the church of St. Christina in Bolsena.

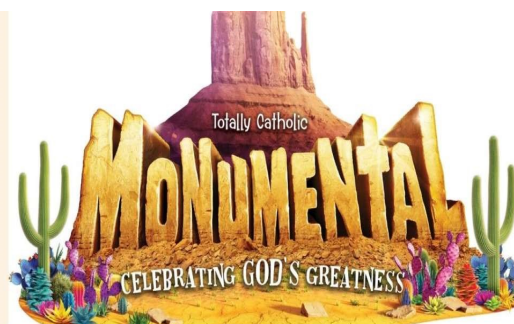

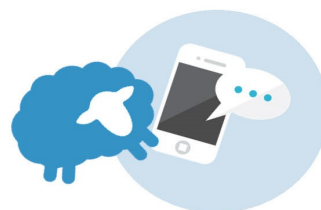

Queridos amigos en Cristo,

El fin de semana pasado celebramos la solemnidad del Santísimo Cuerpo y Sangre de Cristo (Corpus Christi). Como parroquia, celebramos esta solemnidad con una procesión eucarística inmediatamente después de la Misa de la 1 p. m. Resumiendo la enseñanza del Vaticano sobre las procesiones, Pawel Szylak O.P escribe: “En la Iglesia Católica, las procesiones son parte de la liturgia y tienen un carácter religioso. Son actos públicos de homenaje a Dios, para darle honor a Él, o a la Madre de Dios o a los santos. La palabra “procesión” proviene de la palabra latina “procedere” que significa salir o avanzar. En este caso enfatiza el carácter dinámico de la liturgia que a su vez refleja la naturaleza dinámica de nuestra fe. Las procesiones expresan la condición física y espiritual de los seres humanos que son peregrinos en esta tierra y que están siempre en camino”.

Oh Dios, que por la gracia de la adopción nos eligió para ser hijos de la luz, concede, te rogamos, para que no seamos envueltos en las tinieblas del error pero siempre ser visto para estar en la luz brillante de la verdad. Por nuestro Señor Jesucristo, tu Hijo, que vive y reina contigo en la unidad del Espíritu Santo, un solo Dios, por los siglos de los siglos.

La Solemnidad de Corpus Christi también dio inicio al Avivamiento Eucarístico Nacional, que fue aprobado por los obispos de los Estados Unidos para nutrir y encender nuestro amor y reverencia por la Eucaristía. En línea con el Avivamiento Eucarístico, estaremos ofreciendo más prácticas centradas en la Eucaristía en los próximos años. A continuación, se presentan algunas preguntas y respuestas básicas proporcionadas por la Agencia Católica de Noticias:

¿Qué es el Avivamiento Eucarístico? El Avivamiento Eucarístico es una iniciativa de tres años que tiene como objetivo inspirar, educar y unir. En un mundo donde no mucha gente conoce a Jesús íntimamente, el avivamiento está destinado a mostrarles a todos las maravillas que la Verdadera Presencia de Jesús puede hacer para sanar el alma. A través de una cronología de eventos cuidadosamente planificada, después de tres años, los obispos de EE. UU. esperan cambiar la vida de muchos católicos y no católicos por igual. Como dicen los organizadores de la campaña en el sitio web del avivamiento, aquellos que han sido “curados, convertidos, formados y unificados” por la Eucaristía tienen la misión de enseñar a otros “para la vida del mundo”. Esto es lo que prevé el Avivamiento Eucarístico Nacional para el futuro de este movimiento.

¿Por qué los obispos de los Estados Unidos están haciendo esto? Gran pregunta. El mundo actual está sufriendo y alejándose de Dios. Según el Pew Research Center, solo el 31% de los católicos creen en la Verdadera Presencia de Cristo en la Eucaristía. Corresponde a ese 31% difundir la verdad a todos. Como dice el sitio web de avivamiento, “Todos necesitamos sanación, pero muchos de nosotros estamos separados de la fuente misma de nuestra fuerza. Jesucristo nos invita a volver a la fuente y cumbre de nuestra fe: su Presencia Real en la Sagrada Eucaristía”. Es un momento para enfrentar las dificultades que enfrentan las personas en la vida cotidiana. El Avivamiento Eucarístico Nacional es una forma poderosa y edificante de enfrentar este desafío.

¿Qué está planeado para el inicio? Este próximo año es el Año de la Renovación Diocesana. Desde ahora hasta junio de 2023, cada diócesis ofrecerá eventos para promover e inspirar la comprensión de la Eucaristía. La capacitación de los “misioneros eucarísticos” vendrá a través de recursos en línea y en persona que enseñan acerca de Cristo y la Presencia Real. Todo comenzará con la adoración y procesión eucarística generalizada en la Solemnidad del Corpus Christi.

¿Qué pasa después? Con una duración hasta julio de 2024 y más allá, el movimiento también incluirá un Año de Renacimiento Parroquial, un Congreso Eucarístico Nacional en 2024 y el Año Nacional de la Misión. Cada año se dedicará a cumplir un propósito específico en la misión del Avivamiento Eucarístico Nacional.

¿Cuándo es el Congreso Eucarístico Nacional? Este importante evento nacional se llevará a cabo en Indianápolis, Indiana, del 17 al 21 de julio de 2024. Se espera que más de 100,000 católicos “adoren a nuestro Señor Resucitado en su humilde disfraz” y permitan que el Espíritu Santo “encienda un fuego misionero en el corazón” de nuestra nación”, según el sitio web del avivamiento. Esta “Peregrinación Nacional” tendrá opciones tanto presenciales como a distancia, para que todos puedan participar de esta solemne celebración.
