STEWARDSHIP IN THE GOSPEL

The sin of the rich man in today's parable was not that he was rich, but that he failed to share his wealth with the beggar at his gate. He knew Lazarus, perhaps walked by him every time he came in or out, but did nothing to relieve his suffering. Is there a Lazarus in my life? What am I doing to help?

From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Friends in Christ,

Last Sunday at Mass, we heard Jesus say, "No servant can serve two masters. He will either hate one and love the other, or be devoted to one and despise the other. You cannot serve both God and mammon." This Sunday at Mass, Jesus gives us an example of what this axiom looks like in real life with the story of the rich man and Lazarus. The rich man has the wrong attitude: He serves mammon rather than God, and he pays the eternal consequence for it. Commenting on this Gospel, Pope Benedict XVI said, "Our eternal destiny is conditioned by our attitude, it is up to us to follow the path that God has laid out for us in order to attain life and this path is love, not intended as a feeling but as service to others in the charity of Christ" (Angelus on 9/26/2010).

Last Sunday at Mass, the Communion antiphon echoed the proper attitude we are to adopt, "You have laid down your precepts to be carefully kept; may my ways be firm in keeping your statutes" (Psalm 119). The Church has precepts that help keep us on the right path, and we are supposed to keep them carefully. The Catechism teaches, "The precepts of the Church are set in the context of a moral life bound to and nourished by liturgical life. The obligatory character of these positive laws decreed by the pastoral authorities is meant to guarantee to the faithful the very necessary minimum in the spirit of prayer and moral effort, in the growth in love of God and neighbor" (CCC 2041). These precepts are listed below:

1. You shall attend Mass on Sundays and holy days of obligation and rest from servile labor. Sunday is the Day we celebrate the Lord's Resurrection. We come together as a community, and together, we keep this living memory alive. Whether you realize it or not, you need Mass... and the community needs you! We should also refrain from any unnecessary work or activity. Sadly, our culture and society have hijacked this day of rest.

2. You shall confess your sins at least once a year. Reconciliation helps prepare our souls for receiving the Eucharist. If we are in the state of mortal sin, we are supposed to refrain from receiving the Eucharist until we go to confession and confess our sins.

3. You shall receive the sacrament of the Eucharist at least during the Easter season. Receiving the Eucharist during the Easter Season "guarantees as a minimum the reception of the Lord's Body and Blood in connection with the Paschal feasts, the origin and center of the Christian liturgy" (CCC 2042).

4. You shall observe the days of fasting and abstinence established by the Church. Days of fasting include Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. We abstain from meat on these days as well. We also abstain from meat on the other Fridays of Lent. Fasting and abstinence help prepare us for liturgical feasts and help us acquire mastery over our passions. (Did you know that we are supposed to do a penance every Friday throughout the year? The bishops encourage us to refrain from eating meat every Friday, though they have given us the option of selecting our own penances.)

5. You shall help to provide for the needs of the Church. We are supposed to help provide for the material needs of the Church, and the primary way we do this is by donating our money. For some reason, Catholics are some of the lowest givers compared to other denominations. Most Catholics spend more money on their cell phone bills than they give to their own parish. I ask you to please consider helping the material needs of St. Thomas More. The more we have, the more we can do.

**Make Reparation -
 Third Apparition of the Angel of Peace**

Before the Blessed Mother appeared to Lucia, Jacinta, and Francisco in Fatima, Portugal in 1917, the children reported that the Angel of Peace appeared to them three times in 1916. The third apparition took place on September 29th. The children were praying with their foreheads touching the ground as the Angel had previously instructed them when they were interrupted by an extraordinary light shining over their heads. They rose to see the angel holding a chalice in his left hand; drops of Blood fell into the chalice from a Host suspended above it. The angel prostrated himself before the chalice and the Host suspended in the air, and said the following prayer three times:


"Most Holy Trinity, Father, Son, and Holy Ghost, I adore Thee profoundly and offer Thee the most Precious Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Jesus Christ, present in all the tabernacles of the earth, in reparation for the insults, sacrileges, and indifference with which He is offended. And through the infinite merits of His Most Sacred Heart and of the Immaculate Heart of Mary, I beg Thee for the conversion of poor sinners."



The angel arose, placed the Host on Lucia's tongue, and gave the chalice to Jacinta and Francisco to drink, saying: "Take and drink the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ, who is horribly insulted by ungrateful men. Make reparation for their crimes and console your God." He prostrated himself again on the ground, repeated the Most Holy Trinity prayer three times and then he disappeared. In this third apparition, the Angel of Peace confirmed the doctrine of the Real Presence of Jesus and the need for reparation for the sins committed against Jesus

Queridos amigos en Cristo,

El domingo pasado en la Misa, escuchamos a Jesús decir: “Ningún siervo puede servir a dos señores. O aborrecerá a uno y amará al otro, o se apegará a uno y despreciará al otro. No podéis servir a Dios y a las riquezas”. Este domingo en la Misa, Jesús nos da un ejemplo de cómo se ve este axioma en la vida real con la historia del hombre rico y Lázaro. El rico tiene la actitud equivocada: Él sirve a las riquezas en lugar que Dios, y él paga la consecuencia eterna por ello. Comentando este Evangelio, el Papa Benedicto XVI dijo: “Nuestro destino eterno está condicionado por nuestra actitud, depende de nosotros seguir el camino que Dios nos ha trazado para llegar a la vida y este camino es el amor, no entendido como sentimiento sino como servicio a los demás en la caridad de Cristo” (Ángelus del 26/9/2010).

El domingo pasado en la Misa, la antífona de la Comunión se hizo eco de la actitud adecuada que debemos adoptar: “Has puesto tus preceptos para que los guardes cuidadosamente; sean mis caminos firmes en guardar tus estatutos” (Salmo 119). La Iglesia tiene preceptos que nos ayudan a mantenernos en el camino correcto, y se supone que debemos guardarlos cuidadosamente. El Catecismo enseña: “Los preceptos de la Iglesia se sitúan en el contexto de una vida moral ligada y alimentada por la vida litúrgica. El carácter obligatorio de estas leyes positivas decretadas por las autoridades pastorales está destinado a garantizar a los fieles el mínimo indispensable en el espíritu de oración y de esfuerzo moral, en el crecimiento del amor a Dios y al prójimo” (CIC 2041). Estos preceptos se enumeran a continuación:

1. Los domingos y fiestas de precepto asistiréis a Misa y descansaréis del trabajo servil. El domingo es el Día en que celebramos la Resurrección del Señor. Nos reunimos como comunidad y juntos mantenemos viva esta memoria viva. Ya sea que te des cuenta o no, necesitas Misa... ¡y la comunidad te necesita a ti! También debemos abstenernos de cualquier trabajo o actividad innecesaria. Tristemente, nuestra cultura y sociedad han secuestrado este día de descanso.

2. Confesarás tus pecados por lo menos una vez al año. La reconciliación ayuda a preparar nuestras almas para recibir la Eucaristía. Si estamos en estado de pecado mortal, se supone que debemos abstenernos de recibir la Eucaristía hasta que vayamos a confesarnos y confesar nuestros pecados.

3. Recibiréis el sacramento de la Eucaristía al menos durante el tiempo pascual. Recibir la Eucaristía durante el Tiempo Pascual “garantiza como mínimo la recepción del Cuerpo y la Sangre del Señor en relación con las fiestas pascales, origen y centro de la liturgia cristiana” (CCC 2042).

4. Observarás los días de ayuno y abstinencia establecidos por la Iglesia. Los días de ayuno incluyen el Miércoles de Ceniza y el Viernes Santo. Nos abstenemos de carne en estos días también. También nos abstenemos de comer carne los demás viernes de Cuaresma. El ayuno y la abstinencia nos ayudan a prepararnos para las fiestas litúrgicas y nos ayudan a adquirir dominio sobre nuestras pasiones. (¿Sabías que se supone que debemos hacer una penitencia todos los viernes durante todo el año? Los obispos nos alientan a abstenernos de comer carne todos los viernes, aunque nos han dado la opción de seleccionar nuestras propias penitencias).

5. Ayudarás a proveer para las necesidades de la Iglesia. Se supone que debemos ayudar a satisfacer las necesidades materiales de la Iglesia, y la forma principal en que lo hacemos es donando nuestro dinero. Por alguna razón, los católicos son algunos de los donantes más bajos en comparación con otras denominaciones. La mayoría de los católicos gastan más dinero en sus facturas de teléfonos celulares que lo que dan a su propia parroquia. Les pido que por favor consideren ayudar a las necesidades materiales de St. Thomas More. Cuanto más tenemos, más podemos hacer.
