Sister Michaela is a graduate of Trinity Christian High School and the University of Notre Dame, where she earned a Bachelor's Degree in English and Theology. She earned her teaching certificate in education from Aquinas College in Nashville, Tennessee and teaches at Saint Cecilia Academy in Nashville.

The Mass for the Rite of Perpetual Religious Profession was celebrated at the Cathedral of the Incarnation in Nashville. The Most Reverend David R. Choby, Bishop of Nashville served as the principal celebrant. Dr. Waldo Martinez, Jr. assisted as deacon for the Mass.

In addition to the sisters making final profession of vows, twelve young women professed their first vows in the Congregation of St. Cecilia on July 25, 2013.

The Congregation of Dominican Sisters of St. Cecilia was established in Nashville in 1860. The sisters are dedicated to the apostolate of Catholic education. The community of 280 sisters serves in 33 schools throughout the United States, with mission houses also in Sydney, Australia; Vancouver, British Columbia; and Aberdeen, Scotland. The community has recently opened a house of studies in Washington, DC, for its members who serve or study in the capital city. St. Cecilia motherhouse is located in Nashville.
