
EVENTS/HANDOUTS/ FUNDRAISER POLICY

12 Best Catholic Films for the Fourth of July [Sean Salai, S.J.](#) | Jul 3 2014

Some of these historical dramas are well known and others are obscure, but they are all worth checking out. They are films that celebrate American virtues while making us think critically about American vices. They manage to inspire us as patriotic Americans, but without glorifying things which may give us a false sense of moral superiority. So in historical order:

1. [A Time for Miracles \(1980\)](#) – this biopic tells the life story of America's first native-born saint -St. Elizabeth Ann Seton
 2. [One Man's Hero \(1999\)](#) – This film depicts a little-known episode of the Mexican-American War (1846-1848), in which a group of mistreated Irish Catholic immigrants defect to Mexico from the Protestant-dominated U.S. Army.
 3. [The Courage to Love \(2000\)](#) Torn between her romantic love for a Frenchman and her desire to care for Catholic African-American slaves, Delille chooses to become Mother Henriette, founding the Sisters of the Holy Family as the first religious order for blacks.
 4. [The Conspirator \(2010\)](#) – Robert Redford directs this indie film on a little-known episode of the U.S. Civil War, the trial of Abraham Lincoln's co-conspirators in 1865.
 5. [The Molly Maguires \(1970\)](#) –social drama about the downfall of an illegal Irish-American terrorist organization in the coal mines of 1870s Pennsylvania.
 6. [The Staircase \(1998\)](#) – Catholic Western set in 1870s New Mexico. Barbara Hershey plays an ailing mother superior whose dying wish is to see the Sisters of Loretto chapel in Santa Fe completed.
 7. [Boys Town \(1938\)](#) – Spencer Tracy won Best Actor for his portrayal of Father Edward Flanagan, an Irish Catholic priest who in 1917 founded an Omaha home for unwanted boys.
 8. [Entertaining Angels: The Dorothy Day Story \(1996\)](#) a well-intentioned biography of the New York social worker who founded the Catholic Worker Movement in 1920s New York.
 9. [On the Waterfront \(1954\)](#) fictionalized account of Father John "Pete" Corridan, S.J., the real-life labor priest who persuaded the dockworkers to finally stand up to the mob running their union.
 10. [Rudy \(1993\)](#) – the story of a young man's determination to play football for Catholic powerhouse Notre Dame University in the 1970s.
 11. [The Mighty Macs \(2009\)](#) based on the true story of an unlikely basketball championship, this time a 1970s basketball team at a small Catholic women's college.
 12. [Dead Man Walking \(1995\)](#) –based on the memoirs of Sister Helen Prejean, C.S.J., who worked with death row inmates at Louisiana's Angola state prison in the 1980s.

Parish Vision Statement: - 3rd and last sentence: "Through prayer, sacramental celebration, participation in ministries, and prophetic outreach, we develop a deeper relationship with God and our neighbors"

We can say prayers, we can pray, and we can have prayer so central in our lives that it partially defines us. There can be no better prayer in the life of a Catholic Christian than that which is embedded in our sacramental celebration, especially in the Eucharist. This is why, as lovely as praying by the ocean, in the mountains, or in our special place – alone, can be, it can never replace what we do in community celebration of the Eucharist. Through the whole of the Old and the New Testaments, it is manifest that God desires and requires worship as a community, not just in solitude.

Our Parish has many ministries, perhaps some which haven't even surfaced yet. You may be Spirit-inspired to propose and make it happen. Look around you, see what others are doing to serve the parish, see what needs to be done, to keep it more than functioning- to build it and give it vibrancy.

The third call that our Baptismal anointing gives us to act in imitation of Christ is that of prophet: uniting with Christ in his prophetic mission. Think of the prophets of the Old Testament. They roused (or tried to) people to change their ways; they spoke truth to power. Prophecy has to do with the present. Foreseeing the future was for the purpose of getting people to turn away from sinful lives. Every age needs prophets. We may ask ourselves how we are called to be counter-culture. How do I act if I want to live in the world, but of the world? There are plenty of aspects of our culture which go against the teachings of Christ, against God's Commandments - the 10 and the Law of Love. "Pick your poison," that is, a poison penetrating our world, and take a public, prophetic stance against it.

If we gather together all the key elements of this Vision Statement, and stretch ourselves both in and out of our comfort zone, we will surely be in process toward developing a deeper relationship with God and our neighbors.
