### **Reconciliation Monday**

As we reach the two-thirds mark in Lent, we focus more and more on the Passion and Death of the Lord, to be followed by His Resurrection. Perhaps you made Lenten resolutions back on Ash Wednesday. If so, this is a good time to check how faithful you have been to them. If you've fallen a bit short (probably most of us), you have the opportunity to rededicate yourself to the fasting, prayer and almsgiving you chose to offer to God.

In this refocusing, please consider using the Sacrament of Reconciliation. What a wonderful way to experience the Mercy of God! You may receive this sacrament quite regularly, or, as is frequently the case, you may not have gone to Confession in a while. Either way, the Lord Jesus awaits you with His forgiveness and His ongoing grace to help you in your pilgrimage through life. There is not a priest alive who does not yearn for the opportunity to welcome back someone who has not used the sacrament for years.

Reconciliation Monday is coming. It is on March 30<sup>th</sup>, a week from tomorrow, the Monday in Holy Week. On that day, in all the churches in the Archdiocese of New York, the Diocese of Brooklyn and the Diocese of Rockville Centre, confessions will be heard from 3pm to 9pm. Come any time to any church during those six hours. Please don't miss this great opportunity.

### **Words of Pope Francis**

"The Church is apostolic because she is *founded on the preaching and prayer of the apostles*, on the authority that was entrusted to them by Christ himself. St Paul writes to the Christians of Ephesus: 'You are no longer strangers and sojourners, but you are fellow citizens with the saints and members of the household of God, built upon the foundation of the apostles and prophets. Christ Jesus himself being a cornerstone'. (Eph. 2:19-20); that is, he compares Christians to living stones that form an edifice that is the Church, and this edifice is founded on the apostles, who are like columns, and the cornerstone that carries it all is Jesus himself. Without Jesus the Church cannot exist! Jesus is the foundation of the Church—the foundation! The apostles lived with Jesus, they listened to his word, they shared his life; above all they were witnesses of his death and resurrection. Our faith, the Church that Christ willed, is not based on an idea; it is not based on a philosophy. It is based on Christ himself. And the Church is like a plant that over the long centuries has grown, has developed, has borne fruit, yet her roots are planted firmly in Christ and that fundamental experience of Christ which the apostles had, chosen and sent out by Jesus, reaching all the way to us. From this little plant to our day, this is how the Church has spread everywhere in the world."

**Fasting:** Only one full meal should be taken. Two other small meals may be taken to maintain strength. Those in good health between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged.

**Abstinence** from meat obliges those over the age of 13.
