
**Partner-in-Faith Prayer**

# *From the Pastor's Desk*

## Just What Are Indulgences, Anyway?

In the Bulletin of January 10<sup>th</sup>, mention was made of the Plenary Indulgences associated with the Jubilee Year of Mercy. Holy Doors have been established in Cathedral churches around the world and in other designated churches. People passing through those doors with the proper intentions and dispositions and who fulfill the usual conditions can obtain the Jubilee plenary indulgence.

According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church,

“An indulgence is a remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven, which the faithful Christian who is duly disposed gains under certain prescribed conditions through the action of the Church which, as the minister of redemption, dispenses and applies with authority the treasury of the satisfactions of Christ and the saints.

An indulgence is partial or plenary according as it removes either part or all of the temporal punishment due to sin. Indulgences may be applied to the living or the dead.”

Some further explanation might be helpful. First, an indulgence does not forgive sins. That is done by the merciful grace of God and a person's sincere contrition responding to God's grace. The indulgence deals with the “temporal punishment due to sins.” This refers to the process of purification which readies a person to love God above all things and to abandon all selfish traits. This can be done on earth while the person is alive or in Purgatory while a person prepares for the perfect love of God that we call heaven.

It is the doctrine of the Church that we can help each other with the process of purification. We are all members of the Body of Christ and His grace flows back and forth among us. So we can pray for each other and for the souls in Purgatory and they can pray for us. As well, the entire Communion of Saints, the Church, can pray for individual members of the Body of Christ, individual souls. In other words, our prayers and good works for each other can help prepare us for heaven.

As the Catechism continues:

“An indulgence is obtained through the Church who, by virtue of the power of binding and loosing granted her by Christ Jesus, intervenes in favor of individual Christians and opens for them the treasury of the merits of Christ and the saints to obtain from the Father of mercies the remission of the temporal punishments due for their sins. Thus the Church does not want simply to come to the aid of these Christians, but also to spur them to works of devotion, penance, and charity.

Since the faithful departed now being purified are also members of the same communion of saints, one way we can help them is to obtain indulgences for them, so that the temporal punishments due for their sins may be remitted.”

In creating the Jubilee Year of Mercy, Pope Francis is inviting all of us to share and experience the mercy of God with each other. Surely gaining plenary indulgences for each other and for souls in Purgatory is a splendid way to experience the Holy Year.
