Memorial Day Weekend! How much do I love it? Let me count the ways, as they say. First, of course, it's the beginning of summer, my favorite time of year. Even though this winter was relatively mild, the cold went through these bones of mine. Yes, summer is my favorite season of the year!

On a deeper level, I love what Memorial Day stands for. It calls on us to remember those who made the ultimate sacrifice in the defense of our freedoms. We also remember those serving around the world today, including those in our local area who are our first responders.

Remembrance is a common aspiration. Everyone shares a desire to be remembered. I recall when my mother was well on in years, she had managed to simplify her request that I pray for her to just two words. She would say them whenever we said goodbye: "Remember me." Even Jesus wanted to be remembered. He told us to perform the Eucharist, the Breaking of the Bread, "in memory of me." He gave us the Eucharist, His own Body and Blood, as an "everlasting remembrance."

Remembering people and the things associated with them is a special way to love them. For the living, we remember birthdays, the names of children, anniversaries, special needs and much more. Everyone in your life is unique and truly special. Forget no one.

For the deceased, some hold to the custom of visiting cemeteries and decorating grave sites. Thus you have the original name for Memorial Day, viz. Decoration Day, when people decorated the graves of fallen veterans.

I hope you and your family have a wonderful weekend. I know you will remember the deeper meaning of the holiday.



Food Collection


Food is collected for the Community Center of Northern Westchester on the first Sunday of each month. On June 5th, please bring non-perishable food items to the rear of the Church.






