

The Art of Welcoming

In a world with so much mobility, sooner or later we find ourselves moving, as I presently am doing at the end of this month. Far more often though, we find ourselves welcoming those who move into our lives.

Last evening, June 4th, Claudia and Mark Atkinson opened their home to greet new parishioners to St. Patrick's. Along with these new arrivals who could make it, there were also a number of established parishioners who joined in the welcome. St. Patrick's new pastor, Fr. Joe Bisignano, was also scheduled to attend.

Welcoming is part of the virtue of hospitality. When thinking of the virtues, hospitality does not spring immediately to mind, like faith, hope or charity. Words of Pope Francis


TRANSFORMED BY LOVE




