Keep Making Things New

My wife once wondered aloud whether Lent has more longevity than Easter. Dear Parishioners,

The Gospel for the Fifth Sunday of Easter contains the commandment of Jesus to love one another as He has loved us. We know how difficult those words are to truly live out.
